Hi Everyone,

In July and August, we would traditionally be off on our holidays! After last year and COVID-19 the prospects for this year seem somewhat limited and the new variants (now renamed after the Greek alphabet rather than the place they were detected) continue to overshadow the hopes of us jetting off to warmer climes.

## Perry Pear Trees Part One

#### Hello All!

My partner Kerry and I are lucky enough to be the new residents of Mival Cottage, Old Farm Treago. After relocating back from Europe in 2019, it has taken a while to find the right place for us but fortunately we have now found it and we are very much enjoying the serenity of Old Farm. Here at the recently and beautifully refurbished Mival Cottage, which emanates a rich local history, held dearly by many people here, we are currently creating an edible ornamental cottage garden. We are using organic and wildlife-friendly methods as well as a couple of other projects including a small makeshift nursery to nurture our collection of young and rare cider apples and perry pear trees.

We took the move back from Europe as an opportunity to move anywhere in the UK we desired and we decided on Herefordshire, initially in the Wye valley, but after exploring the area further, here we are!

In Europe we were living quite differently to most expats. We lived in our little cottage in a forest in a National Park in Italy. Using principles of forest gardening and permaculture we grew over 150 varieties of fruit and vegetable by organic means and incorporated wild food species into our growing systems to ensure there was also plenty to eat for the wildlife. In fact, we managed to significantly increase biodiversity as a result of growing food for ourselves. The general rule of thumb was that if there is plenty of natural food sources for wildlife, they are less likely to become a *pest*, and most birds and mammals actually preferred not to eat human food crops when they had the option of a natural diet.

If something did eat our crops, we would simply try to attract something to predate on, or plant something to distract it, and ultimately we found that the greater the biodiversity, the fewer problems with pests and diseases.

In Italy we grew to understand that true biodiversity includes antique and heritage varieties of fruit, vegetable and cereal, what the Italians call "La Biodiversita Agricola"- agricultural biodiversity. In an area noted for its unique animal and plant life both wild and cultivated- some of the varieties of fruit we grew were as unique as the subspecies of wolf and bear that co-inhabited the forest.

Once back in the UK it did not take long for heritage perry pear trees to grab our attention. We had heard that many old varieties of perry pear originated on and around May Hill in Gloucestershire, but the traditional perry growing areas expanded into Herefordshire, Worcestershire, and Monmouthshire. They say that if you can see May Hill and you have a perry pear tree growing- it could be something very special indeed.

Whilst working on a farm in sight of Mayhill, I stumbled across some very odd-looking pears on a gnarled and half chewed to death tree in a horse paddock. We had heard that the man in the know about perry pears locally was Mike Johnson of Ross -on- Wye Cider & Perry in Peterstow. Mike, who welcomed us with open arms, told us that he believed our pears to be culinary rather than a perry variety, but he could not identify the fruit in any books. He wondered whether we might have a previously undiscovered variety, but the only way to tell would be to have a section of branch from the tree DNA tested. Mike went on to inform us that varieties of perry pear were being discovered and rediscovered quite regularly in the area, and that they were all fascinating and worth protecting. He very kindly gifted us a bottle of his single variety Flakey Bark perry, informing us that there were only three mature Flakey Bark trees in existence. What a wonderful world we had discovered!

We took our bottle of Flakey Bark with us on a picnic by the Wye and had our first taste of craft perry that afternoon and it was love at first sip. It was so subtle and unique; the flavour was certainly pear but with a slight mineral taste not too dissimilar to that of champagne and went very well with mild blue cheese. If I was fascinated by the pear trees, I was doubly fascinated by perry. It seemed to me to be a local, environmentally sound product, with no preservatives or additives- not even yeast as it occurs naturally in the fruit's skin. But perhaps most fascinating of all, anyone who buys perry made from endangered pear trees is helping their preservation by virtue of drinking their juice.

I knew somehow our future would be connected to perry pear trees.

#### **Peter Morris**

It is with deep sadness that I write that our dear Dad (Peter Morris of Belle Vue, Garway Hill) passed away suddenly at QE Hospital on 9<sup>th</sup> April. He was laid to rest on 30<sup>th</sup> April at Orcop Church, reunited with our dear Mum. The following is the eulogy that was read by Reverend Mark Johnson at the service.

I only had a few chances to meet with Peter, but in talking with his daughters, Hayley and Joanne, I have a picture of a man who had farming blood running through his veins, was kind, caring, wise and rooted to the Herefordshire soil. He, as you may well remember, suffered with Jo and Hayley, the loss of Hazel in 1995.

Peter was born in January 1941, he was one of four children, but only three survived to adulthood. He was born at the family farm of Belle Vue, high on Garway Hill, a beautiful but sometimes unforgiving landscape that played a major part in his life. Peter went to the local school at Garway until he was about 15, when he left to work on various farms and eventually also to work for the Forestry Commission.

Peter met Hazel via Young Farmer dances. They were introduced by Hazel's sister Marion and her then boyfriend, Douglas, who was also a cousin to Peter. They started courting in 1962 and were married at Tidenham Church, near Chepstow, as that was where Hazel's family lived, in March 1966.

They lived at Old Hall in Orcop for a while and then moved to Dellburn at St Weonards where Hayley, the first of their two children was born. In 1970 the arrival of Jo completed the family and they moved back to Belle Vue and re-established the connection with Garway Hill.

There is no doubt that farming is hard work, but Peter applied himself with all the energy he could muster, and helped by Hazel, a growing Hayley and Jo, when she was not sitting in the field eating fresh cut swede, they would raise calves from the market, sheep and lambs, a bit of veg and, especially for Christmas, chickens, turkeys and geese.

Hayley and Jo followed in Dad's footsteps going to Garway Primary and then to Kingstone before heading out to work, and eventually finding other halves and having children of their own.

Meanwhile, Peter and Hazel had the chance to manage a farm just by Kington Golf Course, so they let the land, converted Belle Vue into a holiday home and moved out to the farm there. It was a chance for Peter to flex his farming muscles and one he enjoyed. Unfortunately, after only a few years there, Hazel was killed in a car crash. It was something that shook the family to the core, as these things do, but they managed to find the strength to pull through, with the help of family and friends. Peter stayed at Kington until he retired at 65, moving back to Belle Vue in 2006.

While up at Kington, he met Mel a few years after Hazel's tragic death. Mel was from Liverpool and on holiday in a local cottage. They hit it off and started to accompany each other to events and on holidays, though Mel bought her own place in Kington. They enjoyed holidays in the UK, Cornwall, Devon, Wales, and loved going to National Trust places, and had a great fondness for Powys Castle.

Mel was diagnosed with cancer and Peter became her main carer, especially over the last 12 months. Mel died in 2018.

After Mel's death, Peter busied himself around the hill at Garway. He would go out pretty much every day to have a look around the common and meet up with farmers and locals, chat away and find out the latest gossip – or farming information as he would classify it.

He had a fall in March on the hill and had to be helped home. This set off a tragic train of events, with chances missed and the reason for the fall going undiagnosed that led to his sudden death. Although the family did have the chance to be with him in those last hours, it was not the way they wanted to say goodbye.

Peter will be remembered by all of us as a kind and gentle man. He never had a harsh word for anyone. He took the adage that if you have not anything good to say, do not say anything at all. He was a much-loved Grampy to Sophie, Hazel, Paige and Yasmin. He loved to see his girls flourish, enjoying their success and, no doubt, worrying over them as any grandfather would. He had that wonderful ability to turn his hand to anything, from putting up fencing to fixing a plough, to restarting a tractor. Farmers become Jack of all trades and Peter was no exception.

He will be greatly missed for his knowledge and his love, for the care he extended to family and to friends, and our community will remember him for years to come.

Hayley, Jo and families would like to thank all family, friends and neighbours for their support and kind messages of sympathy, condolence cards, and generous donations in memory of Peter.

#### MUSHROOMS IN MAY

After a mere 12mm of rain in April, we had nearly 170mm in May, possibly the wettest May on record. This had some interesting consequences.

Firstly, it produced a splendid start to the asparagus season, with abundant pickings appearing daily by mid-May. Secondly, and perhaps more surprisingly, it brought on an early crop of horse mushrooms (Agaricus arvensis). These are underrated, being regarded by most as inferior to field mushrooms (Agaricus campestris). The latter can be extremely frustrating, appearing each year, if at all, at different times and in different places. Rising early for a breakfast picking can be a dispiriting experience, often resulting in an empty basket and requiring resort to Weetabix or Muesli. On the other hand, horse mushrooms can be relied upon to come up in the same place every year, anytime from Easter "until the first carol singers". Furthermore, a single mushroom can be the size of a dinner plate, so no need for fruitless foraging for another one. They come up every year amongst our pumpkin plants, but not normally until about August. To have them in May is a rare treat, as they are delicious fried in butter with asparagus (the latter poached, not fried).

There is no need to be concerned about their edibility. The horse mushroom has a large and pendulous ring or skirt below the gills and a pleasant aniseed aroma. A further distinctive feature is the "cogwheel" pattern



on the underside of the skirt (see sketch below). Hence it is fairly easy to identify with certainty.

However, it must not be confused with Agaricus xanthodermus, the yellow stainer, which turns bright yellow when bruised, smells of carbolic acid and is poisonous.

I wonder why they are called horse mushrooms? Is it because horses eat them, or because they flourish on horse manure?

We shall see what other surprises this year of rainfall extremes has in store. *Peter Garratt*

## 7.30pm on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> July SUMMER CONCERT AT St Catherine's

Celebrating reopening (or hoping to), our old friends the Musical & Amicable Society are presenting *Fairest Isle*, a selection of songs, concertos and a cantata, with mezzo soprano Nicola Wemyss and their ensemble of period instruments. #### Wildlife in our Garden

The past month has seen the appearance of a variety of young birds on the ground in the vicinity of our feeders. Robins, blackbirds and sparrows have been seen being fed by parents, but some appear to be on their own and feeding themselves, such as a greater spotted woodpecker with rather scruffy, off-white feathers and an untidy, spiky, fluffy top-knot, not the red top which is described in the books; but perhaps



that will develop later with proper feathers. We have also seen juvenile chaffinches, but no juvenile tits, not that we have recognised anyway.

Along with the vegetation, most animals are at last burgeoning as spring has got going, in spite of the April frosts and May rains. There are a good variety of bees and hover-flies, damsel flies, dragon-flies and butterflies around the garden. A jay often puts in an appearance, and also greenfinches. Margaret even spotted a bullfinch on the cherry blossom once, but sight of the

flycatchers have been very sporadic, as has the singing of blackcaps or chiffchaffs. Swallows seem to be a rarity so far this year and, talking to people, I have the impression that numbers of swallows, martins and swifts are down generally round here. I have not yet heard a cuckoo this year and I have not heard a willow warbler for several years. I can't help but worry about the seeming decline in numbers of our summer visitors.

We believe the robin family which nested in our potting shed was predated again. It is hard to be sure as there were no obvious signs of disturbance apart from a rather misshapen, empty nest. We never saw any baby robins near the nest in the day or two after it was emptied, but we did see plenty elsewhere and it is hard to know which nest they came from. Fortunately, the garden as a whole is by no means short of robins. One adult in particular has become very bold and swoops down to within two feet of me as soon as I put out some seeds each morning. I believe it would not be difficult to train him (or her) to eat out of my hand, but I do not have the patience to try.

The almost resident cock pheasant has become very bold too. He visits nearly every day and sometimes brings his mate. They are not much trouble. One warm day they spent a happy hour or two dust bathing in the runner bean patch. They did not sit on or peck at the young bean plants; they only seem interested in seeds. The cock takes less and less notice of us working really close by him, but just goes on feeding. I wondered why he is apparently so fearless, whether he had been hand-reared and got used to humans as a chick. But I am assured on good authority that keepers only provide food and minimal protection for chick pheasants, and avoid as far as possible letting them have any inter-reaction with humans.



The relative "tameness" of the pheasant started me thinking about what we actually mean by the word "wild", and whether pheasants were really "wildlife" that I could legitimately include in these articles? Is a wild animal defined as any species that is not a farm animal or household pet? Or should it be defined as one that is free to roam where and when it wills? If so, that would include most domestic cats. Actually, most "wild" animals in this country are not totally free to roam because sooner or later they come up against a fence or a wall, or just the threatening presence and smell of

humans, so they are made to retreat or keep away. Even where there is so-called "re-wilding", humans define the limits or borders to the animals' habitat and exert their influence in other ways such as the introduction of pigs or ponies to "manage" the environment. The free-est animals seem to be birds, and perhaps other species which have adapted to tolerate a human environment, such as foxes. I concluded that "wildness" is a relative term and there are all degrees of wildness. It can mean just about whatever the user wants it to, so I think it's OK if I carry on writing about pheasants! *John Oubridge.* 6<sup>th</sup> June 2021

#### **Book Review**

#### Unorthodox by Deborah Feldman

Young Devoireh is brought up in the Hungarain-Jewish Satmar community in Williamsburg, New York. Wikipedia tells me that 'Satmar is one of the largest Hasidic dynasties in the world. It is characterised by extremely strict religious adherence, complete rejection of modern culture and fierce anti-Zionism.' The structures encompass every aspect of their lives from clothing to arranged marriages; from books to food. No corner t of their lives is left unregulated, especially the women's who are regarded for half of their lives, with a special ritual involved in the checking of their cleanliness and who are obliged to shave their heads and wear a wig.

Devoireh is something of an outcast: her father, who appears fleetingly in her life, is said to be mad; and her mother escapes the sect, abandoning Devoireh to the care of her grandparents and a distant aunt, who takes pleasure in controlling the child's life. Devoireh is intelligent and inquisitive; she is puzzled by it all: 'Zeidy (grandpa) comes from a legacy of oppression. I can't comprehend how a person who comes from so much pain and loss can perpetuate his own oppression. In small ways Zeidy cages himself depriving himself of harmless joys, and yet it seems the very deprivation fulfils him...I think pain makes Zeidy feel purified.'

But he is also of the opinion that '..a good Rabbi is one who can find the *heter*, the loophole in the law that allows for flexibility.' No wonder she is puzzled.

Feldman's autobiographical book is itself is puzzling. Full of descriptions of oppression, alongside her disastrous arranged marriage, the book tells how she is able to learn to drive, has a car at her disposal, is enabled to enrol on a college course and to find childcare for her small son. And it is through these channels that she eventually makes her escape- these are her loopholes.

The book was made into a highly successful Netflix series, which drew refutations and objections from the Satmar community, who claimed the author misrepresented them. Where the truth lies I do not know; but it is good to know that this independent eventually achieved the freedom she desired, in practical terms, if not emotionally. *Hilary Smallwood* 

#### **Curious Pets?**

Lord Lionel Walter Rothschild (1868 – 1937) loved animals. His father, the first Baron Rothschild and the first Jewish peer in England, was an immensely wealthy banker and politician. Walter first showed an interest in zoology at the age of seven and declared then that he would have a museum dedicated to animals. At his home in Tring Park, he had a number of exotic creatures including birds and kangaroos. It was with reluctance that he went to work in his father's bank at the age of twenty-one, dreaming of his museum. He was shy, and showed no ability in finance, but he persevered. As encouragement and compensation, his forward-thinking father set up the zoological museum he so dearly wanted.

Baron Rothschild sent an expedition across the world to find exhibits. By the time of his death in 1937 he had collected 300,000 bird skins, 200,000 eggs, 2,250,000 butterflies, 30,000 beetles, and thousands of fish, reptiles, and mammals, owning the largest private collection of zoological specimens ever seen. The museum was open to the public. Despite his shyness Rothschild was headstrong. He was intent on dispelling many of the myths about animals commonly held at the time. One of these was the idea that zebras were untameable.

He harnessed a team of zebras to a carriage and drove them to Buckingham Palace to prove this idea wrong, and he was often seen in the streets of London in a cart drawn by a single zebra. In 1932, most of his bird collection was sold to the American Museum of Natural History to satisfy the blackmail demands of a former mistress. He left the rest of the collection to the British Museum in his will. The donation was the largest ever received by the museum. The collection was however kept intact at Tring, and the Walter Rothschild Zoological Museum is officially a division of the Natural History Museum.

## **!!! BEWARE SCAMS !!!**

#### **Census scam**

This is a text message scam that tells you there's a problem with the census details you filled in back in March. It tells you to follow a link to "review" the information, or risk a £1000 fine.

If you tap on the link, it takes you to a very convincing copy of the official census page, and asks you to answer a couple of fairly innocuous-sounding questions. Then right at the end, you need to pay a small administration fee. Of course, if you give them your card details to take the £1.25 (or whatever they tell you it is) they can actually charge you whatever they like!

If you get a text message, email or phone call like this, it's a scam. You can report it, see how later, The only ways the census team might contact you are in writing or with a personal visit – if in doubt, you can <u>check their website here</u>.

## **Royal Mail scams**

There are a quite frightening number of these around, and people have lost a lot of money to them, so it's definitely one to be on your guard with.

Most Royal Mail and other delivery firm scams are either text messages or emails. They tell you that an item is waiting to be delivered or collected, and all you need to do is pay a release charge of some small amount –  $\pm 2.99$  is fairly typical. Again, if you give them your payment details, they can actually take as much as they like from your account.

If you really *do* have excess postage or customs fees to pay, Royal Mail will contact you with a reference code. They'll give you a Royal Mail web address to type into your web browser, then you type in the code they've given you to see how much you owe. *They will never ask you to click on a link.* 

#### **HMRC** scams

There's been a rise lately in scam calls, messages and emails pretending to be from HMRC. They might offer a tax rebate or inform you of a penalty – either way, they'll ask for your payment details and often other details like your National Insurance number.

*Never click or tap any links if you get a message like this.* HMRC have helpfully put together a list of genuine calls, emails and letters that they've sent recently to help you judge whether yours was real or a scam. You can <u>read it here</u>.

#### **Reporting scams**

You can report any fraud attempt to Action Fraud – if you're worried that you might have fallen victim to one of these scams, that's definitely the place to go and report it. You should also contact your bank or credit card company straight away if you think your payment details might have been compromised.

If you've received a scam text message, you can report it to your phone network by forwarding the message to 7726 (it spells "SPAM" on your number keypad). To do that, open the conversation (being careful not to tap on any links) and tap and hold the message to select it. Then tap either the three dots in the top right or the word "More" and choose "Forward". Type in 7726 as the number to forward it to – it doesn't cost you anything.

#### BT scams

These suggest accessing your account by clicking on a link, but check the email address which is always peculiar eg catpadkeeper@live..... Forward these to <a href="mailto:phishing@bt.com">phishing@bt.com</a>.



## The Haven Green sinkhole

While riding around Haven Green on 29 June 2020 we had to swerve on our tandem to avoid a depression in the road.

Peter reported it as a possible sink hole. Within a few hours the road was cordoned off. The hole turned out to be quite large – an estimated 20 metres long, 8 metres wide and 5 metres deep, according to one workman's estimate. He said it extended beneath the bus lane and that Peter "must have been sent by God" for having reported it just in time to prevent a disaster.

The council's contractor filled the hole with several loads of concrete. Much of this entered the main sewer beneath the road and blocked it. The tape or pole used to measure the 20 metres had presumably been pushed along inside the sewer and not the sinkhole.







By 14 August (below) Thames Water had been trying to remove the concrete inside their sewer for several weeks, by jetting. Work continued for another two months and eventually only one lane of traffic remained open. The final picture shows the road on 18 October, just before remedial works were completed after nearly four months of work.



This sink hole was discovered by some Mynors cousins when cycling in their local area of London.
