Vicar's Letter

Dear Readers

On the first day of August is the festival of Lammas. This ancient celebration is to give thanks for the first fruits of the harvest, and the word 'Lammas' is derived from 'loaf-mass', from when a loaf of bread was made from the first newly-gathered grain of the harvest, and offered to God in thanksgiving. In medieval times, there was probably a hungry time when the wheat from the previous year started to run out, and people must have felt a real sense of relief to see the new harvest coming in. It would have been a time of hard work and company in the fields, as the reaping was done by hand by teams of men, with the women and children collecting the corn into stooks.

Lammas also marked the end of the hay harvest which had begun at midsummer, and in some parts of the country, Lammas meadows still exist, such as the one at Upton-on-Severn in Worcestershire. The riverside meadow was marked out with dole stones to show which villager had the right to the hay harvest, but when the hay was in, the whole wide area was opened for common use and grazing of stock.

For many years now, we have marked Lammas with an outdoor service in a woodland setting. Sitting in a circle amongst the tall trees, listening to the wind stirring the leaves, smelling the damp earth and hearing the birds around us gives us a renewed appreciation of this wonderful countryside we live in. Animals are invited to share the service with us—usually a tribe of dogs, but occasionally something more unusual—one year we had a parrot!

This year's service is on Sunday, August 1st at 11am. It will be held in New House Wood on Garway Hill. Access is from the upper road at HR2 8EZ, up the drive marked 'Yew Tree Corner'. There is easy field parking.

If you read this in time, do come and enjoy the service, and bring your animals.

It is time to give thanks.

New Dean For Hereford Cathedral



Bishop Richard is delighted that Her Majesty The Queen has confirmed the appointment of The Revd Canon Sarah Brown as the next Dean of Hereford. This is a significant appointment for the Church of England in Herefordshire and South Shropshire and the first time in the 1,300 year history of the diocese that a woman has been appointed to the role of Dean.

Sarah came to faith in her late twenties and describes how she first encountered God in her village church where she joined the choir. She explains: "It was here that I discovered the power of church music, the care of a Christian community, the teaching of a wonderful rural vicar and finally, in utter astonishment which persists to this day, the disarming love and forgiveness of God. "

Sarah is currently Canon Missioner at Peterborough Cathedral in the diocese of Peterborough where she has spent most of her adult life.

"I will miss everyone at Peterborough but I am excited by the beauty and missional prospects of this good and holy place land. I look forward to getting to know the people and places of Herefordshire and South Shropshire and of course joining in with what God is already doing in this part of the world."

Sarah was ordained in the diocese of Peterborough in 2008 following a career in business. After reading German at Nottingham University she worked in corporate sales and marketing before responding to an unexpected call to lead FCN, a national farming charity, which she did in tandem with studying theology and serving her curacy.

Her church career has at different times engaged with the agricultural community, rural churches, a market town and a cathedral city, all of which now come excitingly together in the role of Dean of Hereford.

Sarah is married to Richard and they have two children; Alice, who is a musician and Edward, who is training to be a vet. Her parents are also moving to Hereford and Richard's family live just over the border in Monmouth and are regular visitors.

Bishop Richard says, "As we plan for the future of the Church of England in Herefordshire and South Shropshire, my hope and prayer is for a healthy, growing and vibrant community of Christians of all ages who can confidently share their love of Christ with others. Sarah is a key part of helping bring that vision to life. She has a heart for pastoral ministry with a vision for mission, a rare combination of gifts and I am excited to see how God uses her in her role as Dean."

Sarah will be installed a Dean of Hereford at a special service which will take place in Hereford Cathedral later this year. Details will be announced nearer the time.

The Dean is the senior priest in the Cathedral and the chair of the Chapter, which is the governing body of the Cathedral. She has overall responsibility for the Cathedral's life, mission and ministry, and represents the Cathedral in the city and county, holding responsibilities in the wider Diocese.

We were delighted that Izzie Partridge chose to come and picnic with her hen party, and they were followed by about 250 people who enjoyed exploring the formal garden, with its many roses, and the wilderness/arboretum and of course eating the delicious tea!

Many thanks to the Herberts for letting us loose in their garden, to all those who made wonderful cakes, to the indefatigable tea team who made hundreds of cups of tea and washed up, and to the generous raffle prize givers and sellers. Perry Pear Trees Part Two

Before moving to St Weonards Kerry and I had a view of a towering Blakeney Red perry tree some 40 feet in height. As keen wildlife observers it was hard not to notice how many mammals, birds and invertebrates frequented the tree and seemed to have an ecological relationship with it. For us it was doubtless that perry pear trees were also invaluable in terms of habitat and biodiversity.

Initially the farmer and grower in me convinced myself that I was only concerned with growing and preserving local perry pear trees, and I saw no reason why the principles of our forest garden in Italy could not be transferred to the orchard. I began designing growing systems to enhance and diversify existing orchards to make them more productive and ecologically sound. Existing orchards can be easily modified into polycultures enabling the cultivation of several crops in one space, which makes a site more adaptable to market trends. In my case, I farm a few acres in Stoke Lacy where I grow apples, pears, vegetables, and herbs all in one space.

This type of farming is now recognised by the UK Government and had been defined as "Agroforestry" which quite literally means agriculture incorporating the cultivation of trees.

Flakey Bark pear trees are originally from Taynton in Gloucestershire, but there are many incredibly special and endangered varieties from here in Herefordshire including Gregg's Pit of Much Markle and Holmer of the variety's namesake. In fact during this perry journey we have discovered some wonderful little orchards all but lost, except by those people who care from them and those dedicated to finding and preserving heritage perry pear trees and well as making real craft perry.

Many perry pears have an astringent taste rendering the fruit unsuitable for the table, but this attribute transfers excellently to the bottle making for some sophisticated flavours. Perry pears prefer to grow in areas that are susceptible to cold air and are at slight altitude, such areas as May Hill, The Markle Ridge, Penallt in Monmouthshire, and I would hazard a guess that they would fare well in Western Garway too. It is the combination of sunshine and the warmth of day and the cool air of night that gives perry pears their intense flavours.

As you may have already guessed, after spending so much time around orchards, pears and producers, I inevitably tried cider and perry making for myself, which quickly became a hobby and is now slowly growing into something else.

Back at Old Farm, we now have 100 young trees in pots which I grafted myself taking scions from rare and desirable trees and grafting them onto quince rootstock. We have had about a 95% success rate, the resulting trees will of course enable me to eventually take further cuttings to graft, resulting in more rare and endangered trees. Ultimately, we would like this very personal project to result in the creation of a heritage orchard-cum-wildlife sanctuary as a legacy and something to leave behind, but we have yet to find and acquire a site. Culturally, economically, and environmentally, it is clear that perry pear trees are worth protecting and it is out mission to help preserve them and spread them far and wide.



In the next twelve months we would like to expand to a second site a bit closer to home to grow vegetables and I am currently deciding which rare Herefordshire perry pears to graft next season.

Thirty people from Garway came to the old school on 17th June to protest against the proposed demolition of the old Victorian school in the centre of the village. The protest was reported in the Hereford Times and the Monmouth Beacon on 30th June 2021. The group would like to see the old school listed, preserved and refurbished as housing. It could become once again a feature in the centre of the village, situated as it is opposite the new school and new community centre.

The protest came together because of a planning application by the owner to the Herefordshire Council to demolish the building. This application is now being reviewed by the Planning Department and their review will take into consideration objections and comments made by residents of Garway and other members of the public, together with members of Herefordshire Council.

ORCOP NEWS: August 2021


Our deepest sympathy and condolences to the family of *Flo Hayward*, who died in hospital on June 28^{th,} aged 89.

Orcop Neighbourhood Development Plan – Update June 2021

The Steering Group met in June with our Planning Consultant to confirm further amendments to the draft Neighbourhood Development Plan, v2. Appendix B 'exception case' had also been written (this explains the approach taken to the delivery of housing). Gordon Downie (recently moved to Orcop Hill) was invited to attend as he had valuable information regarding his investigations with DEFRA into the use of cesspools. Wastewater formed a major part of our discussions, resulting in the Consultant now re-writing that section. A further meeting will soon take place to hopefully approve draft v3. That will be followed by submission to Herefordshire Council for an Environmental assessment which takes 6-8 weeks. Thereafter is the public consultation.

Book Review

Lies Behind the Ruin by Helen Matthews

Emma Willshire, divorcee and Mum to Owen from her first marriage, finds happiness with her second husband Paul and their daughter Mollie. All is now well.

But Paul, who works as an executive in the construction industry, is plagued with worries that centre around a fatal accident at work. Failures in safety procedures leave Paul less than squeaky clean in this incident, and he can see that blame is beginning to fall on him. He is rescued by a fellow employee, Genevieve, who covers up for him. But her rescue is not without strings, which Paul proves unable to resist.

The novel opens with Paul and Emma looking round a dilapidated property in France, whilst on holiday there. Emma sees it as a diversion, but for Paul it represents a way out of his dilemma, and to Emma's disquiet, he buys the property behind her back. Financial ruin follows on from the fatal accident at work, and retreat to the French property seems the only solution: a chance to leave the troubled past behind him and make a new life.

But, as in so many novels in this genre, the past will not lie down and die, and Paul finds himself in a tangled web of deceit and lies.

What appears at first to be a repeat of the well-worn saga of middle class Francophile Brits buying a renovation project in France turns into something altogether more sinister. The tale unfolds in the voices of both Emma and Paul, a device that can be clumsy but works well here. The ending is a bit of a damp squib, but it is still a good read. *Hilary Smallwood*

Uriah Heap Plays Put and Take

About this time a series of cigarette cards was issued in entitled 'Characters from Dickens'. Uncle Humphrey made a collection of these as he was fascinated by the Dickens characters and was also intrigued by their names. He chortled when a card about Uriah Heap turned up, and for some reason known only to himself started calling me Uriah Heap. I didn't think this much of a compliment as this chap was a strange sort of character. It would be Uriah Heap , 'Come here!' or ' Uriah Heap. Do that!' or 'Where is Uriah Heap?' until I was heartily fed up with my new name. Granny told Uncle Humphrey that if he did not stop calling me Uriah heap she wouldn't make him any more meals.

Uncle Humphrey invented a new game involving cigarette cards. At least it was a new game to me! He had a little gadget like a brass spinning top which spun when twisted between finger and thumb. I think it had six flat sides and when it has been spun it came to rest with one of the flat sides uppermost. The flat sides were inscribed consecutively PUT 1, TAKE 1, PUT 2, TAKE 2, PUT 3, TAKE 3.

The players each started with the same number of cigarette cards and spun the little top in turn, putting or taking cards as indicated when the top came to rest. This little brass top was appropriately called' PUT and TAKE' and was frowned upon by granny. She said it was a gambling machine, however as we only used it for gambling with cigarette cards I don't think Uncle Humphrey was leading Uriah Heap astray!

Wildlife in our Garden

The heavy covering of foliage has now made it nearly impossible to see the birds that like to stay in the trees. We can tell they're around by their songs: blackcap, chiffchaff, greenfinch. In previous years, I think I remember, our songthrushes have stopped singing in summer. But this year they're still to be heard all June, though somewhat outsung by blackbirds now. We still regularly see all the birds which come to feed from the low wall outside our breakfast room where we are offering seeds every day: chaffinches, robins, blackbirds, house sparrows, dunnocks, a young great tit and of course the faithful cock pheasant. Because we now often find him quite close to us, we are able to hear him, especially when feeding, making a soft "wup", "wup", "wup" noise. Quite a contrast to the raucous "quaaaark" which announces his arrival!



A bird which does not feed on seeds but which we now see easily is the spotted flycatcher. There are at least two, maybe the same pair as were nesting and breeding last year in some trellis against the house. We're not sure, but their young maybe the ones we sometimes glimpse down in the field. The books tend to describe them as having rather drab plumage, but we think they are very smart in their two-tone brown-grey, sitting pert on a post, attentively watching for flies.

Oddly though, we don't think the spotted flycatcher is at all spotty. Apparently, the young do have more spots on their head, back and breast, but the adults are left with what is described as streaking over the tops of their heads.

Watching birds coming to feed near the house, in May, June and July, we can see that the young of several species are more spotty than the adults. This is most obvious with robins. The young are rusty red and spotted all over and look nothing like their parents at all. It also goes for blackbirds with quite spotty young; the spots fade to a few speckles on the flanks of the females and are hardly visible at all on the males. In thrushes though, the spots become more accentuated on their breasts as they mature. Adult dunnocks have black streaks over their backs, like house sparrows, but the young have them in most places. And so the young of several species are more like each other than their parents who are more differentiated and recognisable.



There used to be a hypothesis in embryology, though now discredited, that as embryos and foetuses grow and change, they pass through stages which resemble the evolutionary stages of development of their species. I was reminded of this by these birds and wondered whether their ancestors in the distant past would have all been spotted! *John Oubridge* 6th July 2021

Garden Notes

We have had some strange weather this year and the plants have been behaving accordingly. With such a chilly April we delayed planting any vegetables but goodness do they look fabulous now! Our much-reduced vegetable plot is crammed with the healthiest vegetables we have ever grown. The Brussels sprouts are looking quite extraordinarily perfect, which perhaps makes up for the miserable little things that we have grown some years. The lush green leaves of the French beans are climbing up their arches and looking as decorative as anything you might plant in a flower border. Even the parsnips all germinated successfully.

Our roses have been exceptionally good this year, especially the immense *Rosa complicata* which was a picture. The one exception was *Rosa mutabilis* which was looking so pretty and then suddenly dropped every one of its leaves. I suspect black spot which is not something it has ever suffered from before. I gathered and burned all the fallen leaves and it is now producing healthy new leaves so I hope it is not going to be a recurring problem.

Other plants are slow coming into flower. We have had a few sweet peas but they too are very slow. I am rather disappointed with the colours this year - as usual I sowed a packet of mixed colours but these turned out to be a dismal combination of pure white and a very dark purple. Next year I plan to buy single colours instead so that I can choose my favourites.



African marigoldI haven't grown African marigolds for perhaps thirty years but, wanting a large plant with chunky orange flowers, sowed seeds of marigold 'Elevate Orange'. I suppose the clue is in the name (and the words 'towering beauties' in the description) but I really wasn't expecting them to be three feet tall. They have lots of buds but like everything else they are taking a long time to open. Likewise, *Tithonia* 'Fiesta del Sol' - I do wish it would hurry up though as the leaves, described in the catalogue as velvety, are dull and ragged and truly, truly ugly. I love snapdragons and I like my snapdragons to be large and showy. This year's choice of *Antirrhinum* 'Overture Deep Orange' is certainly large and showy – its promised height of 2'6" has been exceeded by a foot and the first few flowers that have appeared are fabulous.

Although I love propagating from seed, I've never done much propagation by taking stem cuttings. However, this year when strong winds broke off a branch of the climbing hydrangea, I used the broken chunk to take cuttings. I also tried *Sambucus* 'Thundercloud' – not sure why as it's a dull old thing with mud-coloured leaves. I had instant success with both and I am so thrilled with my ten new Hydrangeas and five Sambucus, that I am now keen to have a go at other shrubs. It is great to learn new skills at any age and finally after years of gardening, I am learning which plants respond best to particular types of cuttings: softwood, greenwood, semi-ripe, ripe, hardwood; and whether to take a cutting from the leading shoot or the side shoots; and what the terms leaf-bud and inter-nodal cuttings actually mean... There is a lot to learn but I'll only really do that by actually trying some more plants. The excitement of seeing new green shoots and white roots peeping out of the bottom of the pot is just as thrilling as seeing seeds germinating. I have my eye on the Forsythia, Choisya, Viburnum, Weigela, Deutzia, Spirea, the Potentillas, the Fuchsias...

Another curious pet



In the South Transept of Chichester Cathedral there hangs a large panel originally painted by Lambert Barnard for the visit of Henry VIII to Chichester Cathedral in 1526. The main picture shows Henry VIII talking to the Bishop of Chichester, Robert Sherburne. The left-hand panel shows St Wilfred talking to King Caedwalla, who ruled the West Saxons from 659 to 689. By Caedwalla's feet Barnard has painted a monkey. Most visitors to the cathedral imagine that this is Caedwalla's pet monkey; but this cannot be the case, as it is clearly a Capuchin monkey. These are native to central and southern America, and nobody was sailing between southern England and south America in the seventh century. But the interesting thing is that Catherine of Aragon, Henry VIII's first wife, had a pet Capuchin monkey, and at least two paintings of it have survived; one of them is shown here. It looks as though Barnard has deliberately painted Catherine's monkey at the foot of the Anglo-Saxon king, and this (like many other things in the painting) is a coded message to King Henry, saying 'We understand. Catherine is ancient history. We are on your side'. The whole painting was probably a desperate attempt to prevent Henry from wrecking Chichester cathedral as he damaged so many others.


