Dear Readers

'Oh the summertime is coming, and the trees are sweetly blooming', or at least, they will be by the time you read this. It's one of my favourite songs. We won't have got quite as far as the wild mountain thyme growing among the blooming heather, but summer is definitely on the way. We will have enjoyed the public holidays around Easter, and hopefully had a chance to meet up with family and friends.

Of course, there are more public holidays this year than usual, with the celebrations of the Queen's 70th anniversary of her accession to the throne. Instead of the usual late May Bank Holiday on the last Monday of May, we have Thursday and Friday joined on to the following weekend, so a run of four days, the 2nd to the 5th June. It coincides with the feast of Pentecost, one of the most important celebrations of the Christian world; in this country it used to be called Whitsun, partly because people would be dressed in white to process through the streets, commemorating the coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Christians 2000 years ago. 

Garway Youth Group

The Ghost of Garway Hall

Garway's "*Ave a Go Panto*" group laboured merrily for many weeks this spring to put together a small masterpiece to entertain the locals with four performances in Garway Community Hall last week. This was no run-of-the-mill village panto – it was a slick production under the deft direction of Tim Bannerman, who also wrote the script along with his wife Gill. A small village panto with original music is something of a rarity, but Garway's production was blessed with newly-written songs from the pen of local pianist Chris Northam.

The twisting plot involved: a headless ghost (formerly a peaceful medieval knight) who floated amongst the audience causing alarm and despondency and much hilarity; a sweet maiden (got to have one of those) who started life abandoned in a basket on the steps of Garway Hall; assorted mice (who squeaked to perfection); lusty ciderophile young farmers (I use the word young loosely – only one fulfilled that brief); several fading landed gentry (suitably attired and bust-enhanced where needed); a coven of witches (from punk to tattered recluse, all arriving on assorted household cleaning implements); two harassed tourists from "oop north" in search of "a rope with an "ook on the end" (please inset northern accent here); the obligatory clumsy decorators with their plank and bucket; a wandering bearded minstrel to keep the tale on the move; a tuneful songstress returned from the past to claim her beautiful daughter; and of course an evil villain in the form of local boy back from America with money to burn (cue boos and hisses).

This was a production to be proud of, which raised a substantial sum for the Hereford Hospitals Special Care Baby Unit and Phoenix Bereavement Support in memory of Rees Williams. Well done Garway!

With glorious music and fantastic dancing, this is a re-imagining of a masterpiece which in every way lives up to the original and even adds to it; a film which makes for a thrilling, emotional night out. TRETIRE WITH MICHAELCHURCH AND PENCLOYD

This year, Mothering Sunday was on the 4th Sunday, when we usually have an evening Service at Pencoyd or Tretire. This time it was at Tretire, and we had Rev Tiffany Jackson, curate from St Mary's Ross on Wye to lead our service. We used a different form of Evening Prayer from our usual one, produced by the Iona Community, and we had three candles representing the Trinity lit at the beginning of the service. About halfway through the service, we were invited to come up one by one, to the table with the candles on, and spend a few moments in reflection, before lighting a tea light in memory of our own mother. At the end of the service, we said together the prayer which Richard Bavin, the artist in residence while Elaine Goddard was our priest, chose for the Church at Tretire. I thought I would remind you of it, as it is not so long since Tretire churchyard had a carpet of Snowdrops.

Into a dark world, a snowdrop comes,
a blessing of hope and peace,
carrying within it a green heart,
symbol of God's renewing love.

Wildlife in our Garden

Do you remember "Scratty", the squirrel with the paralysed tail, the one we thought must have had some sort of accident? Well, about two weeks ago now when it came to feed under the seed feeder we saw, to our amazement, that the last 5 or 6 inches of tail had dropped off! The blood supply must have got cut off. It is left with a sad little stump, with no visible fur on it, about 4 inches long. It is just as active and apparently healthy otherwise but doesn't seem to have a mate.



A snake-bark maple, now about 12 foot high, has had one of its lower branches ring-barked, just above where it leaves the main trunk, about 3 foot off the ground. This happened back at the beginning of March when the tree was still dormant. We strongly suspect it's the work of a deer, probably fallow, as we know they have been in the garden before. So far, the buds on that branch have begun to open normally, but it seems inconceivable that it will continue to do so and I fear the branch will eventually die.

I do not propose to say much about the birds that come regularly to the feeders; they have not changed much this last month. We are surprised that the moor-hen is still coming every day, but with no sign of a mate. I read that its name derives not from moorland, but moor is a corruption of mere, meaning lake.

One species we have missed a great deal this spring is the song thrush. We have occasionally seen one hopping around on the lawn, but normally we enjoy being serenaded from the top of one of our taller trees. This has not happened this year. There has been one singing down by Tretire Cross Roads, but on the whole, they seem to be in rather short supply.



As soon as the warmer weather began on the 18th of March the bees were out, first a few bumbles and then the honey bees. We have also again seen those little black and white bees, about a centimetre long, that seem to emerge from under the lawn and buzz around a couple of inches above the ground. We still have not been able to find out what they are called, nor what they are doing hovering just above the short grass. We would be delighted if anyone can tell us about them.

Book Review

The Magician by Colm Toibin

Winner of the Rathbones Folio Prize for 2022, Irish author Colm Toibin has written a fictionalized biography of Nobel Prize winning 20th century German author Thomas Mann, in the form of a novel, with dialogue.

Mann lived from 1875 to 1955, and so was witness to both major twentieth century conflicts, in which his country suffered defeat. Winner of the 1929 Nobel Prize for Literature, he was a prominent figure in Germany's cultural life at a time when the views of such luminaries were much followed and taken to heart. We will know him best as the author of *Death in Venice* from its subsequent film.

Born into a rich merchant family in Lübeck, he lived a comfortable life, but had to contend with his wayward and outspoken brother Heinrich. Unable to openly follow his homosexual leanings, he married Katia – herself from a somewhat off-beat family – and sired six children. By Colm's account their marriage was relatively content. But his children were a source of anxiety to him – chaotic and opinionated, they courted publicity and caused him much embarrassment. His two elder children, twins Erika and Klaus, were flamboyantly unconventional – promiscuously bisexual, precociously talented as actors and writers, but too politically reckless and financially feckless to make careers for themselves.

Mann was gradually forced into the political arena and into taking a stance on Hitler and Nazism, when it became clear that he would not be able to return to Germany from France, where he had fled. An insular man, whose mornings working on his novels were sacrosanct, he was reluctant to put his head above the parapet. He was torn between keeping silent on his political views to protect his own peace, the safety of his Jewish in-laws in Germany, and the pressure from fellow authors and his own family to speak out. He knew that his views would be much publicized and that a return to Germany would become impossible.

He was proud of his country and its literary and artistic heritage, so the idea of decrying his country and leaving behind all that he held dear presented him with a dilemma. He finally emigrated to the US.

This novel combines the domestic with the international, painting detailed character sketches of the family with all their idiosyncrasies, alongside the backdrop of political upheaval and exile. The gradual collapse of

his national pride might be seen to have contemporary parallels as one imagines Russian intellectuals in 2022 surveying the aggression of their government in Ukraine. Plus ça change, plus c'est la même chose.

Black Mountains – The Recollections of a South Wales Miner

Whilst clearing out The Globe after the death of my father, Tony Smith, I found a photo copy of a couple of pages of an unnamed book. I'm not really sure of the significance of it to my parents, apart from the fact that this snippet of the story relates to a local farm near Garway. I did some online research and found that it came from a book by David Barnes called '***Black Mountains – The Recollections of a South Wales Miner***'. The book is about the life of David's grandfather, Alf, born in 1897 just over the border on the Hendre Estate, outside Monmouth. The part of the story I have in front of me is from the time when Alf was unable to take up his Monmouth School scholarship (his family being too poor to support him for another three or four years) and was starting work as a farm labourer at the age of 12.

.....My parents would be shocked that I was going away over the border and I fully expected a mighty row. But, although Mam was upset – I think she still hoped to find a way to get me to Monmouth School – my stepfather congratulated me on becoming self-supporting. So, at the end of the week, I left the Grange Farm and, instead of turning right to take the road for Monmouth School, turned left to take the Skenfrith road to Garway, there to learn some very different lessons.

The Gorsety – Mr and Mrs Porter were new tenants at The Gorsety, a farm that had been allowed to run down and which came by its unusual name because it had so much poor land covered in gorse. There were lots of sheep, a few cattle, horses and pigs and of course, the poultry. The Porters were a young couple with a small daughter. They wanted to make a go of the farm and put a great deal of energy into all aspects of farm life. Mrs Porter took charge of the poultry, feeding the chickens herself, and produced fine butter and cheese for the produce markets in Abergavenny on Tuesdays and in Hereford on Wednesdays. She had an incubator, which she called her 'magic chick box', which she let me examine closely: she could see how fascinated I was by mechanical devices and patiently answered all my questions.

Apart from me, the only other employee was Mrs Porter's young niece, who worked as the serving girl. I loved working for the Porters: they treated me like one of the family. We all ate off the same table and were served the same food. The Porters had a small book collection that they let me use and sometimes they would ask me to read to them in the evenings. I slept in my own bedroom in the farmhouse in a feather bed. They were so kind and trusting in every way that I could never do enough for them. They were church people and we would go to church together on Sunday for evensong. Mr Porter would only allow the bare minimum of necessary work to be done on the farm on the Sabbath. After the service I was free to join others of my age in the village, provided that I was back on the farm by 10 o'clock at night. I admired Mr Porter because he did his fair share of manual work. When he set off for the mart he was happy to leave me in charge of the farm. 'Keep your eye on things generally,' he would say, 'you'll find plenty to do.' And of course I always made sure that I did. How could I ever let him or his wife down? They set off to market or to town in a gleaming pony trap, for I always cleaned, blackened and polished the harness and washed and polished the trap. I wanted them to feel proud. And they always brought us a little something back from market, fancy sweets or cakes.

One spring morning, as soon as the Porters had left for market, I went out to a distant field, out of sight of the house, to work on a secret project. I wanted to see if I could improve some of the farm's marginal land. It took me several weeks to grub up all the gorse and stock up the soil on my experimental plot, but when I had done it, it looked fairer than any of the other land around it. Next, I swept the hay barn floor for seeds and sowed them broadcast over my secret plot. I didn't say a word to anyone but kept watch to see if the seed took hold and sure enough it did: the new grass was pushing up thick and strong. Mr Porter, it seemed had not noticed anything. One fine evening he said to me, 'Alf, shall we go up to the bank field and burn off some of the gorse now that it's dry?' We went a different way than usual, missing my plot, and spent a good couple of hours burning gorse before Mr Porter called it a day.

On our way back Mr Porter stopped dead in his tracks and exclaimed, 'Look, Alf! Something strange has happened to part of that field over there. It's greener than the rest.' I began to laugh and told him of my secret experiment. I shall never forget the expression on his face when we reached the plot: you would have thought

that someone had just given him a new farm. He wouldn't move from the spot, but sat down, telling me to run to the farmhouse and fetch his wife, daughter and niece. Then, before the whole family, I had to describe my experiment in every detail. Not completely sure whether I done right or not, I was relieved to be hugged by Mrs Porter as her husband exclaimed, 'What did I tell you! The rough places can be made plain!'

Garden Notes

There is something to be said for being a bit lazy when it comes to weeding and deadheading. I have never been able to simply hoe the borders to remove weeds as I am so anxious that I might destroy the tiny self-seeded primroses, forget-me-nots, aquilegias, Welsh poppies, violets and hardy geraniums. If they are in inconvenient places, I carefully move them. I particularly love to rescue the baby ferns. These are not particularly special ferns - just *Dryopteris filix-mas* or the male fern - but they are perfect for a cottage garden like ours and they quickly grow into decent-sized plants to fill those awkward shadier spots where nothing else looks right. I love the biennial *Angelica archangelica* which seeds prolifically here but never quite where I want it. If I don't move the seedlings when they are tiny, by their second year they have grown to six-foot giants, which are often too close to something precious or in the middle of a rose. I have one area of the garden where I do very little weeding or clearing. It is a mini thicket of lilac trees, viburnum and buddleja with a carpet of ivy. I have left it to do its own thing and there is something very calming about it; I like to think of the insects, the mice and voles scurrying about getting on with their lives without me getting in the way.



I remember once calling in on a colleague who lived in a tiny Cotswold stone cottage in Oxfordshire. I knew that Hetty was very interested in wildlife, but I wasn't prepared for the view from her kitchen window. The ancient stone walls of the garden enclosed a narrow garden which looked like the garden that time forgot. There were two ancient, gnarled apple trees and a meandering path mown through long grass. And that was it; nothing else. That doesn't sound very special but there were birds flitting everywhere, attracted to the numerous bird feeders hanging in the apple trees and I could imagine that rabbits and pheasants probably wandered in too. To me this very special haven looked completely magical and complemented the ancient cottage to perfection.

Of course, you can take a more relaxed approach to gardening too far. I have been re-reading a wonderful book about Wildings, the home of Eileen and Eva Soper. They were the daughters of artist George Soper, best-known for his etchings and paintings of heavy horses. Eileen and Eva were also very accomplished artists and Eileen is best known as a children's book illustrator, particularly Enid Blyton's Famous Five series, and for her charming pictures of the wildlife that came to her garden – the badgers, foxes, deer, and birds. George Soper created a garden that was a sanctuary for birds and animals, but as he was a keen plantsman, he included cultivated areas nearer to the house: lawns, a rose garden, iris beds. He planted clematis where they could grow over shrubs and clamber up trees, and he sourced rare ferns from all around the world. Further away from the house were woodland, thickets, scrub, and bog. After their parents died, the sisters looked after the garden but when they became frailer themselves, they allowed the four-acre garden to become overgrown. More wildlife moved in and gradually came nearer to the house. In the cold winter of 1962-63, Eileen built shelters in the thickets for the muntjac and put out chestnuts and Cox's Orange Pippin apples for them. Birds of all varieties would feed on the sisters' hands, and as the birds became even tamer, they would land on their heads to pluck out hair for nest-building. Over time both sisters became quite eccentric and even allowed the wildlife to share the house with them. Birds would fly into the house through open windows, squirrels would join them for lunch and dormice hibernated in the spare bed. Mice nested in the chest of drawers and even in Eileen's slippers. The vegetation took over the house, growing over the roof and in through the windows. Dead trees were left where they had fallen and saplings grew on the lawns.

I don't think I could ever allow nature to take over to the same extent that Eileen Soper did. However, I do like the idea of allowing nature to do some of the gardening for me and no matter how time-consuming, I will always rescue and nurture all those self-seeded treasures. **Julie Davies**
