### **Archdeacon's Letter**

### Hello Everyone,

As I write this, we are preparing to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Whatever your view about having a hereditary monarch from a historical point of view most of us alive today will not see such a long serving monarch again in our lifetime. This truly is therefore a once in a lifetime event and may never take place again. Queen Elizabeth II came to the throne 70 years ago and she has already reigned longer than Queen Victoria who reigned for 63 years and 7 months, and King George III who reigned for 59 years and 96 days. This is a significant historical event, and it should be marked with appropriate national celebration. Some of you reading this may have met the Queen and have clear memories of that moment and its impact. The jubilee coincides with Pentecost and the 'Thy Kingdom Come' global wave of prayer organised by the church, and it strikes me this is entirely appropriate given that the Queen has such a strong personal faith. As she herself has said on many occasions, it is her personal faith that guides her actions and her life.

"To many of us our beliefs are of fundamental importance. For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life. I, like so many of you, have drawn great comfort in difficult times from Christ's words and example." (Christmas message, 2000)

Whilst it is easy to complain or write off royalty as an historic anachronism, with no place in the C21st, we are fortunate in our nation to have a Queen who has publically stated her belief in Jesus, and takes seriously her role as head of the Church of England. She trusts in Jesus, at the heart of her life.

Whatever our view of the Queen as an earthly monarch as Christians we believe in a King and a Kingdom which is everlasting and without end. We can and should celebrate the Queen's 70 years of service to our nation shaped by her faith, calling and determination to serve God. We should also remember as Paul taught Timothy to pray for her and our nation's leaders, but remember too that the faith she so often speaks about is available to all of us too.

"I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— for kings, queens and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Saviour, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus." 1 Timothy 2:1-5



### **Garway Primary School and Pre-school**

STOP PRESS! We have just heard that the builders arrive to erect our new Early Years classroom immediately and should be finished by August. What excitement!

It has been business as usual at school, with a sigh of relief as normality seems to have returned after such turbulence because of covid. It always astonishes me, that despite the comparative size of GPS, technically called *small*, the pupils have so many exciting opportunities to broaden their experiences through the myriad of activities organised for them. (The school website publishes the weekly newsletter where you can read all about these activities). This is in addition to the solid curriculum teaching and learning.

Older pupils have been sitting SATS assessments as usual. Towards the end of the term all pupils are assessed to ensure that they are progressing as well as possible. This information is extremely useful for teachers to ensure there are no gaps in pupils' learning, particularly after the challenges of absences because of covid.

Recently the *GROUND FORCE CLUB* have been busy and school is so grateful to Henry's Dad and Pengethley Garden Centre for their generous donation of topsoil which has been added to the garden beds by Groundforce club. Thanks also to Allensmore Nurseries for donating some lovely perennial plants which are already in the flower bed and looking fantastic! Groundforce club would welcome donations of vegetable plants to go in their vegetable plot or drought tolerant perennials (e.g. lavender) to go in the containers around school.

Pre-school have been exploring the world of insects! Some of the activities include making playdough insect fossils, rescuing insects from string spider webs and gooey jelly, comparing common characteristics, creating paper chain caterpillars and designing insect inspired snacks! The *Butterflies Group*, older children, have been very grown up lately and have started to learn early phonics in preparation for joining school. They have been super at recognising and pronouncing some letter sounds and made great efforts to practise writing them.

The PSA are organising a Fashion Show and we are so grateful for their support for school.

### Orcop Neighbourhood Development Plan - Update May 2022

The draft NDP submission version has been completed by David Nicholson incorporating all the amendments agreed in the Response Log. The Steering Group agreed that this amended version of the NDP should be passed to Herefordshire Council for the purposes of Strategic Environmental Assessment and Appropriate Assessment. We are awaiting these Assessments in order for our Consultant to reflect their findings in the Basic Conditions Statement.

The Consultation Statement has been compiled by our Planning Consultant and approved by the Steering Group after amendments. This will accompany the NDP when it is submitted to Herefordshire Council – we are aiming for this to happen after Parish Council approval of all the documents at the next meeting, 18 May. The aim of the CS is to document the consultation undertaken during the NDP process, for the benefit of the Examiner.

# TRETIRE WITH MICHAELCHURCH AND PENCOYD

Tretire church was looking lovely on Easter Sunday, when once again, Rev Brian Phillips came to lead a service of Holy Communion. Our band of cleaners met on the Saturday morning and gave the church a thorough clean before decorating all the windowsills with Easter Flowers. We had a congregation of about 35 and so some lusty singing of the familiar Easter Hymns! The churchyard was all tidy too, after the mowing band had been busy, and still a fair number of Primroses, Bluebells and Violets had been carefully mowed around.

The following week we had our regular service of evening prayer, this time at Pencoyd, and led for us by Elizabeth.

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting was held at Orcop Village Hall on Tuesday 27th April, chaired by our Rural Dean, Rev Sean Semple. It opened with a report from our Assistant Priest, Rev Frances Phillips, who

thanked Sean for all his help in our Benefice during our interregnum, and also the help given by all the churchwardens whose ministry to their parishes has been considerably increased because of the absence of a vicar. They have been meeting monthly and helping to hold the Benefice together.

Frances has been holding a Zoom service of Holy Communion on the 1st Sunday of every month, and also taking a Communion Service rotating through the churches on every 3rd Sunday. She has continued to visit Garway School regularly and has dealt with much of the administrative work in the Benefice. This has included arranging for marriages and funerals to take place and visiting sick and elderly people. She has also led the Hoarwithy Singers, which she brought into being a number of years ago. She will be very much missed when she finally retires from Church ministry in October, and will leave a large administrative gap in our Benefice.

Rev Sean Semple then brought us up to date with the work of the Deanery Leadership Team, who have held consultation meetings with all the parishes in the Deanery, over the past year. He has requested that each Benefice should appoint two representatives to attend future Deanery Leadership meetings, and that between them they should present their Benefices with a Sustainability Document. Once this plan has been approved by all the Benefices, a final Deanery Pastoral Plan can be sent to the Diocese. No new incumbent can be appointed until this process has been completed. There is still hope that a new incumbent may be found for our Benefice, but it will not be for some considerable time. This will inevitably result in the workload of our already overstretched Churchwarden increasing, so we, the parishioners need to ease her load whenever and wherever possible.

### Wildlife in our Garden

Since Easter we have not been putting peanuts out as we think the birds are generally finding enough food elsewhere, but we do still put out mixed seed, largely for our own benefit, so that we can get an idea of what is still about.

Far fewer squirrels come to forage now; we have not seen Scratty at all, and the one with the kinked tail only once or twice. The tits have more or less stopped coming and we've not seen a nuthatch this year. Also, we hardly ever see the woodpeckers, the jays, the goldfinches, the greenfinches, the pheasants or the moorhen now. We are left with our faithful robins, blackbirds, house sparrows, dunnocks and plenty of chaffinches.

I continue to worry about the swallows. In previous years they have mainly been seen on and around Pursey's farmyard, but also enough for them to fly over our garden and a few to investigate our garage for possible nesting sites. This year, the numbers at Pursey's are down to a small handful and I have seen none up here at all. I nearly bought a swallow's nesting box from RSPB with a view to encouraging them, but as they don't even come here to look around there seems little point.

On the other hand, the garden is alive with birdsong. The robins are less vocal than they were in the winter, but the blackbirds make up for them. I said last month I had not heard a song thrush in our garden, but since then there has been one, and sometimes two, singing away each morning and evening from some of our taller trees. Although we don't see the birds themselves so much, we know they are about because of all the empty, broken snail shells lying around in various favourite spots on the stone paths.

On Good Friday, April 15<sup>th</sup>, we heard both a chiff-chaff and a blackcap for the first time this year. The blackcaps are prodigious songsters and are very vocal in nearly all parts of the garden nearly all day now. The chiff-chaffs are less consistent but heard on most days.

The insect world is waking up too. There are plenty of bees, though many more bumble than honeybees. I am indebted to Lesley Whistance for identifying for me the ashy mining bee, Andrena cineraria, the one that we see hovering above the lawn each spring. According to Wikipedia it pollinates fruit trees, but I must confess I have not spotted it yet anywhere other than

just above the lawn. We have seen plenty of orange-tip butterflies and a few brimstones and small whites so far this year. Margaret has seen some damsel flies in the last few days, a female beautiful demoiselle, Calopteryx virgo, we think from her description.



Judging from the number of black droppings found almost anywhere in the garden, we have plenty of hedgehogs about at night. We have not seen one in the day. I must get around to setting up the infra-red camera again and see whether I can get a better idea of the nightlife!

### **Book Review**

### Odd Boy Out by Gyles Brandreth

Brandreth is a witty and amusing raconteur - as might be expected of someone who is much in demand as an after dinner speaker and panel show guest, and whose career ranges from acting, studying prisons, being an MP, writing books and serving on Lord Longford's porn enquiry.

Born in Germany, he returned with his parents to England at the age of 3. He attended the French Lycée in London (where he was taught in French), and subsequently Bedales, a school that made a deep impression on him, and that was peopled with those who went on to become the great and the good.

I totally lost the plot on his pedigree, but did glean that he is from distant noble stock. I lost the plot too on his vast array of connections in the worlds, of politics, royalty, theatre and literature. His name-dropping is incessant: "I have shaken the hand of a man who has shaken the hand of ......" is a recurring tongue-incheek theme throughout, and famous names occur at the rate of roughly 3 to a page. Most of them seem to be gay, bisexual, promiscuous and permanently drunk.

He is fiercely insistent that he is middle-middle class and not upper, although his family lived the lifestyle of the better-off (private schools, meals at the Ritz), in spite of not always having the cash to back this up. His father was a solicitor, a wanabee barrister who had to settle for the role of legal advisor to the AA (cars, not booze). Brandreth's childhood was free and easy in comparison to nowadays: he roamed the streets of London visiting galleries and prisons apparently ad lib – his childhood interests were not the run-of-the-mill marbles and football – prisons featured from a remarkably early age. At the age of 7 he was sent off on his own to spend the summer in Switzerland – there was no-one to pick him up from the airport, and he had to make his own way by train to his host family, unable to speak German and with no instructions as to the route.

His youthful memories are contemporary with mine, which added to the appeal of this book: Spangles, tiny Hovis loaves ("the size of a Dinky car box") that could be cut into fairy slices, donkeys and Punch-and-Judy on the beach, Davy Crocket racoon hats, the Lone Ranger and Tonto, and of course Lyons delicious chocolate cup cakes with their peel-off silver wrappers whose edges could be painstakingly sucked to remove the last dregs of icing – those were the days!

Brandreth felt a deep devotion to his father but berates himself for not being aware of the many sacrifices that he made to keep the family afloat. The last section of the book is in the form of a letter to his father, which summarizes his life and hopes that he would have made "Pa" proud.

There are so many wonderful witty quotes that I could pull out from this book but to whet your appetite here are just two:

He found himself presenting the best crematorium award at the British Funeral Directors award ceremony – otherwise known as the "Crème de la Crem" prize.

And on Rex Harrison's first stage appearance, where he had one line: "It's a baby, fetch the doctor", which came out as "It's a doctor, fetch the baby!"

How many of Brandreth's gems are true, how many exaggerated and how many simply made up I do not know – but it all makes for a good read.

### **Garden Notes**

Spring has to be my favourite time of year in the garden, when everything looks so fresh, the forget-me-nots, primroses and tulips are in flower, the apple blossom is out and the ferns are unfurling. Our forget-me-nots are beginning to go to seed now but taking over at centre stage are the vibrant yellows and oranges of the Welsh poppies and the orange and red of brooms. The delphiniums are just opening and some of the shrubs are beginning to flower: Viburnum, Spiraea and Mexican orange blossom.

Recently a friend admired a small shrub that is growing just inside our front gate which appears to be sporting the cutest fuzzy white bottlebrushes. The flowers have no petals but are formed of clusters of white stamens. Having never seen one before, she asked for its name. This one is *Fothergilla gardenii* or witch alder, named in honour of, not Mr Fothergill the seed supplier, but Dr John Fothergill, a wealthy eighteenth century

Quaker physician. He had a highly successful and lucrative practice in London, and, like a lot of eighteenth-century scientists and Quakers, he had a great interest in botany (and conchology). He sponsored many botanical expeditions and acquired an impressive collection of rare plants from all around the world. He created a magnificent botanical garden which is now West Ham Park. His hothouses alone contained three thousand species. His collection was said to be second only to the royal collection at Kew – that's one very successful physician!

I find that knowing a little about the early plant collectors and the interesting lives they led, somehow makes the plants in the garden that much more interesting. *Fothergilla* is native to the woodland of south-eastern United States – North Carolina and Alabama – and is related to witch hazel. There are two main species: *F.major* and *F.gardenii*. They really strut their stuff in spring with their pretty flowers and again in autumn when the leaves turn the most glorious yellow, orange and red. They are not large – mine is ten years old and only a metre high - and so are great addition to any border. They do however need a lime-free soil – pH 5.0–6.0. Rather bafflingly, mine appears to be very happy on my clay soil which I had always assumed to be neutral to slightly alkaline as blue hydrangeas turn pink.

As I have never tested the soil and have no soil testing kit, I conducted a little test using ingredients from my pantry. I mixed a sample of soil with half a cup of water and then added half a cup of vinegar. A second sample was also mixed with half a cup of water and then half a cup of baking soda. The theory is that if the vinegar sample fizzes, the soil is alkaline; if the baking soda sample fizzes, the soil is acid. Well, my results were singularly inconclusive. The vinegar sample just sat there. The baking soda sample definitely produced some half-hearted bubbles, but no matter how excited I became when another bubble broke the surface, my husband was not impressed. Perhaps I need to buy a soil testing kit...

I'm with the Queen on *Shuggie Bain* by **Douglas Stuart** and *Girl, Woman, Other* by **Bernadine Evaristo** for the 2012-2022 decade, but disagree with the choice of *The Luminaries* by **Eleanor Catton**, it was one of the few books I didn't finish.
