Farewell from Frances Phillips

Dear Readers

As many of you will have heard, I am retiring from being a 'voluntary vicar' for this group of parishes at the end of this month, and Les and I are moving off Garway Hill and down into Ewyas Harold, to benefit from the various services and amenities there.

I started training for ordination in 2010, immediately after retiring from my 'proper' job as a GP. I have often been asked whether I missed my medical career, but my answer has always been 'no', because in ministry I have been able to continue doing what I loved best in medicine - i.e. getting to know the people I was looking after, listening to their stories, understanding their family relationships, seeing where they come from and wondering where they are going, and sharing their good times and their bad times with them. Being a priest has a great deal in common with being a GP.

Because I have had to work part-time in my present role, I have not been able to do as much as I would have liked, and I have sometimes had to say no to requests for weddings and funerals. But for those which I have been able to do, it has been a great joy to be part of them: to witness the happiness of a wedding couple, tying the knot in front of their family and friends; or to share in the joy of the arrival of a new baby in the family, when it is brought to church for christening. And I feel privileged to conduct a funeral when someone dies, especially if I have known them during their lifetime, and to hear the reminiscences and memories and stories about them being shared, and to see the way in which even sad occasions like these can be very positive in bringing families and friends together, and in helping to support those who have been bereaved.

So I would like to thank all the many people who have supported and helped me in this role over these last 12 years: you know who you are!

The St Weonards group of parishes will probably have a new vicar (a real one!) by the end of next year, and I know you will give him or her your support in the same way. *Frances*

The Lammas service, held in Frances's wood, celebrated the first fruits of the summer. We were a goodly crowd and plenty of people brought their well-behaved dogs for blessing, and to enjoy the cool of the beautiful wood. Frances encouraged us to take time to stop, sit, listen and look around at the beauty of God's world. In these troubled times it was so helpful to hear a local good news story. A field near Frances has been unploughed for many, many years and yields a wonderful variety of wildflowers and seeds. It is now to be protected, and much co-operation on the part of the farmer and others has made it possible for the seed to be collected. This will be used to create another wildflower meadow in St Weonards.

Anna Williams and I as churchwardens hosted a triennial 'Visitation' by the archdeacon. He inspected all our parish documents, including our registers, legally required, and found them to be satisfactory. These formal visits, which used to be regular, but were suspended, have now been reinstated. THE DUKE

Ever fancied holding the government to ransom? Well, this film offers you a blue-print of how to do it. It's the improbable, but absolutely true, story of a Newcastle pensioner who, in 1961, decided to pop down to London and steal a Goya portrait of the Duke of Wellington from the National Gallery. Somehow, Mr Bunton (played wonderfully by Jim Broadbent) managed to pull it off. The police suspected a professional gang, but eventually found out that an odd-ball ex-bus-driver with a mission had done the whole thing. A long-time campaigner for the elderly, Kempton Bunton aimed to hold the government to ransom: if pensioners get free TV licenses he will give the Goya back. His arrest and trial had all the characteristics of a classic British farce. Playing opposite Jim Broadbent, as his long-suffering wife is Helen Mirren, grouchy, cynical but principled, endlessly trying to keep her exasperating family solvent. This was the last film of director Roger Michell

(Notting Hill) who died before the final print was finished. More than an amusing ramble through British eccentricity, the end of the film packs a surprisingly moving emotional punch. And its politics speak the difficulties of this autumn of 2022. The consultation began on 15 June 2022 and will finish on 27 July 2022.

TRETIRE WITH MICHAELCHURCH AND PENCOYD

On the 23rd July, a meeting was held for our Benefice in Orcop Village Hall, when we met with the Archdeacon, Derek Chedzey to consider the future plans of the Diocese for a new priest in charge, to be appointed by the Bishop. This appointment would be for a priest whose time will be divided each week between the Ross Deanery, and the St Weonards Benefice, and they will be housed in St Weonards Vicarage.

We were invited to form groups with people from different parishes to discuss what things about our Benefice are attractive and encouraging, and also, those things which might prove off putting.

Our church wardens will also be meeting in due course to consider these same points, and a small group of people will ultimately be asked to produce a Benefice Profile in order to publish this post to potential applicants, by the Autumn. It is hoped that a successful applicant will be appointed by the Bishop in spring next year.

Our evening service in Pencoyd church on July 24th was led for us by Rev Tiffany Jackson from Ross; Frances took a communion service for us on August 21st.

On Sunday September 18th, Frances will take her last service in our Benefice at Hoarwithy Church at 10.00 am. Then between 3 and 5 pm that afternoon, there will be a farewell tea for her at St Weonards Church, which will be an opportunity for us all to show our appreciation for all she has done for our Benefice in the years following her ordination, and most especially in this last year since Elizabeth Cathie's retirement. As our assistant priest, she has looked after us all month after month, so this farewell tea will be a great opportunity to thank her, and wish her, and her husband Les much happiness in their new home in Ewyas Harold.

This last Sunday, August 7th, was another "last" occasion, as Frances and Les hosted the last. "Service in the woods", the woods having been planted by Frances back in 1996. The Lammas service has been held for many years there, when we give thanks, through readings, prayers and hymns, and through the symbolic sharing of a loaf baked by Frances, for all God's gifts of his creation. A number of people had brought with them their pet dogs to receive a blessing, (and a little of the loaf!) and they all behaved impeccably!

Wildlife in our Garden

Our garden is full of holes at the moment. There are three sizes: the smallest are about 2 cm in diameter, go vertically down and appear to be quite deep; the middle size are about 4 cm across and go down diagonally; the largest are up to 10 cm wide and are just shallow pits which don't lead anywhere. I am confident the small ones are made by voles of which we must now have a substantial population. Voles have some holes just behind the wall on which we put out seeds, and from time to time one will pop out onto the wall and remove a seed. The middle size holes I think, are probably made by rats. The large ones are a bit of a mystery; as far as I know squirrels are not burying nor digging up nuts at this time of year, but we have seen more rabbits about lately, so maybe it is they, though why they would make a shallow pit but not bother to continue burrowing, I have no idea. Any suggestions?



Last month I said we had not had very many young birds being fed by parents this year. An exception to this is dunnocks. We now have a family coming to feed on the seeds we put out. I always used to think of dunnocks as very shy, inconspicuous birds, hunting under hedges in the shade, but these are very happy to be seen, and rather like robins and chaffinches, do not immediately fly away when they see a human approaching. They have also moved from hunting under the hedgerow to pottering about around the flowerpots with the wrens.

Though not strictly wildlife, back in June I wrote about the acer with a branch which had a ring of bark stripped off it, and I was surprised that it seemed to be growing normally. Well, it has now undergone a change: while the other branches bear leaves which are big, deep green and presumably healthy, the ringed branches leaves are smaller, paler and have a pink, autumnal blush at the tips. I think they may be lacking some minerals, especially magnesium which I understand is an essential element in chlorophyll.

Book Review

This Much is True by Miriam Margolyes

How to write a review of this famously crudely outspoken actress's autobiography that will pass muster for a parish magazine? Deep breath – here goes!

Margolyes was born at the end of the war, the only child of second generation British Jewish parents. Her father, who hailed from Glasgow, was a doctor and her mother, to whom Margolyes was devoted, bought and sold property - and was, by all accounts, a force of nature. Both parents had high aspirations for their daughter, aspirations that were steeped in snobbery – they wanted her to meet the right people and to speak with the right accent, hence many years of elocution lessons and a place at the prestigious Oxford High School. She must have been an impossible pupil, who perpetrated an incessant stream of practical jokes and insolences and was not slow in voicing her opinions. She recognized herself as being short and fat and hopeless on the sports field but found other ways of making her mark.

When Cambridge was mooted as the next destination, Margolyes' mother invited Isaiah Berlin to dinner and brazenly asked him to sign the university sponsorship form – she did not know him; he did not know Miriam – but he kindly obliged. With a mother like that, who could fail?

She arrived on her first day at university smoking a pipe – a calculated decision intended to make an impression. Of course, as an aspiring actress, she joined the Cambridge Footlights, but sadly at a time when women were not welcome. The men ignored her with a "studied cruelty." Sharing a stage with famous names like Cleese, Oddie and Chapman was not a joyful experience. She describes them as "total shits" Only Brooke-Taylor later apologized.

She name-drops incessantly, having rubbed shoulders with the famous both on stage and in film, and modelled nude for Augustus John as a student. She does not hold back on her opinions of these people and thrives on undermining their images - she is also thought to be the first person to use a certain 4 letter word on TV, whilst representing Newnham College on University Challenge in 1963.

However, her behind-the-scenes descriptions of the process of acting are fascinating, the cast becoming a temporary family with the same passions and animosities - and the sad parting when the run is over. We know her best in character roles, but it is interesting to learn that she kept herself in luxury in the US for many years by means of voice-overs for cartoon films and adverts.

When she "came out" to her parents, she caused immeasurable distress, and she is plagued with guilt over her mother, whom she adored, and who shortly afterwards had a stroke from which she never fully recovered. "I realise now that telling people things they can't deal with is an indulgence." But it does not seem to have stopped her voicing her opinions, however personal and potentially hurtful, at the drop of a hat.

Margolyes can be sensitive and insightful about literature and theatre and about life - "We are all scared. We are all secretly shaking with fright inside, uncertain of what we should be doing, saying and thinking; anxious about what our lives are going to be." But moments later she falls victim to the irresistible desire to be outrageous and plummets once more into fart world. One minute she is whipping off her top at an interview and thwacking her substantial boobs onto the table, the next she waxes lyrical on the subtleties of the acting process and the beauty of Shakespeare's words and characterizations.

She is fiercely proud of her Jewish heritage, in spite of her atheism ("I think laughter is better than God.") — "I push being Jewish down people's throats; it's my way of saying: Hitler did not win" Wherever she is she joins the local synagogue and she keeps all the Jewish feast days and traditions. "I can't let it be. Why should I let it be when, in my lifetime, six million people were murdered because of it?" And she is equally vehement about the fate of the Palestinians when the Zionists reclaimed Israel: "That's where, as a people, we Jews fell down, and where Hitler won. He changed us from being a compassionate nation into a destructive, uncaring and inhumane one. The tragedy of the Palestinians is just as much the tragedy of the Jews."

In spite of insistently declaring herself to be gay (her partner Heather has been in her life for over 50 years), she has a bizarre relationship with the male member ("Such an odd dangler to have") and, if she is to be believed, doles out frequent casual manual and oral favours to random unknown men in passing. It is interesting to speculate as to why she feels the need to do this – and to brag about it.

This book created something of a stir when it first came out as Margolyes claims that her US therapist (wow-what a job that therapist had taken on!) had assisted in the death by suicide of 42-year-old cellist Jacqueline du Pré, rather than her dying of multiple sclerosis, as stated on her death certificate. Where does the truth lie? – is this simply another Margolyes attention-seeking ploy or is she relating the truth?

The entire book suffers with this paradox – we know Margolyes will do anything to be noticed, so how much of it are we to believe? She has been seduced by her own outrageous image, and whilst insisting that this is not all she is, she will belie this in her next sentence. She is a strange mixture of the frankly rude (plonking herself down on a man's lap in the tube because he would not get up for her) and the warmly sociable – "Most people like to pounce on an empty [park] bench, but I long for human communion – that to me is Holy Communion." There is much here to enjoy with fascinating insights into an actor's life and the strange world they inhabit – all overlaid with an insecure character who has created a persona that she cannot quite shake off, and probably does not really wish to – she is making a very good living out of it. So here we have her: a talented actress, compassionate, caring, thoughtful, full of life, inquisitive, politically aware – does she really need the "potty mouth" that has now become her trademark?

Garden Notes

My garden is not looking itself; it has not been enjoying the sunny weather one little bit. The annuals have flowered and gone to seed too quickly, the sunflowers have flowered, wilted and died, my favourite clematis has turned crispy, the hydrangeas (fourteen of them at the last count) are wilting and the apples are falling off the trees before they are ripe. Despite the 2 cubic metres of home-made garden compost that I add to the borders every year, the soil has turned to dust. Every year I fill the gaps with colourful rudbeckias but this year I just used up the opened seed packets left over from last year - which didn't include rudbeckias – and the result is an August garden lacking its usual cheerful yellows, oranges and russets, and it doesn't feel right at all.

It is not all doom and gloom though. The roses are better than they ever been, especially the *Rosa x odorata* 'Mutabilis' which has not stopped flowering. One of my David Austin English roses, *Rosa* 'Canterbury' is the best it has ever been and now, in early August, it is flowering abundantly. Its pretty single pink flowers are delightful. Roses with fewer petals tend to be more drought tolerant and, as I prefer single roses, I have inadvertently chosen roses that will survive the lack of rain. I suspect too that I have trained them to survive without much water. When I plant shrubs, I give them a good watering and then generally don't water them again. If the weather is extremely dry, I might give the most vulnerable ones that have just been planted a good drenching but generally I never water our borders. I don't want the plants to get lazy; I want to motivate them to send down roots and find their own water. My method seems to have worked with these roses anyway. Water is precious and the fact that our water is on a meter does limit our enthusiasm for filling watering cans.



Although some of the annuals flowered quickly and died, I am pleased with *Amaranthus caudatus*. I have never grown these before but received a free packet of seed with a magazine. What a fun plant it is, with its long - extremely long - red tassels. I planted out the young plants, watered them and left them to it - and they are thriving. Very impressive.

One of the best shrubs for dry weather was our *Cistus x purpureus* which was planted eight years ago in an old galvanised dustbin next to the log store. It tolerated the most appalling neglect, as we rarely remembered to water the poor thing, but every year it displayed the most beautiful vibrant pink papery flowers. I am using the past tense because, despite all that, it had become a nuisance; it had grown too large and we could no longer open the log store door. Two days ago I cut it down, emptied out the soil and removed the bin. We can open the door now but I feel like a murderer; I have destroyed a perfectly good plant but, needs must; it

was a case of the wrong plant in the wrong place. However, if you are looking for drought tolerant plants, I would certainly recommend this one!

Well, who spotted the error in my walnut pickling method last month? Anyone who is an ardent maker of pickles will know that you don't, of course, simmer your walnuts in the pickling vinegar. I should have said that you simmer the pickling spice in the vinegar and then pour the hot vinegar over the walnuts in their jars. I do hope that I am not responsible for ruining anyone's pickles! I have high hopes for my own walnuts – the first super- heatwave that we had in July was perfect for drying the walnuts which obligingly went black and shrivelled until they looked just like the ones in the shops.

TALES FROM THE NORTH

We have just returned from a wonderful holiday in the far north of Scotland, staying in a croft at Drumnaguie, north of Kinlochbervie. We attended the Durness Gathering, where there were amazing feats of strength and endurance and the grandchildren participated in the junior athletics with some success. Many readers will recall Geoff Capes, a multiple award-winning shot-putter, who went on to win the accolade of "The World's Strongest Man". Over the period 1981 to 1987 he competed as a professional on the Highland Games circuit

and participated each year in the Durness Gathering, where he set the record for tossing a 20Kg weight (about the weight of a sack of cement) vertically over a horizontal bar. His amazing record of 16ft 2 inches stood for about 35 years. Just imagine casually tossing a bag of cement 5 metres vertically. The Durness Games attracts foreign professionals. This year a giant turned up from the Czech Republic. He won many of the "heavy" events and, amazingly, broke Geoff's record by a full foot, with a throw of 17ft 2 inches!



We went north in our tiny campervan and stayed the first night on a delightful site near Skipton, in the Yorkshire Dales.
