#### Letter from Venerable Fiona Gibson Archdeacon of Ludlow

One of the most moving services I have ever attended took place on Ash Wednesday 2009, in Westminster Abbey. I was an ordinand, in training for ministry, and was on placement at the Abbey. As the choir sang the achingly beautiful setting of Psalm 51 "Miserere mei, Deus" (Have mercy on me, God) by Allegri, complete with perfectly piercing top C from the chorister given the solo that year, we all went forward.

The Dean said the solemn words, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you will return," as he marked my forehead with the sign of the cross, using ashes from the previous year's palm crosses.

It was a new experience to me, as the imposition of ashes hadn't been part of the tradition I'd known up to then. I confess I was overwhelmed - by the depth of my human sinfulness, the depth of God's mercy, and the depth of the love of Christ in going to the cross for the sin of the world, including mine.

Far from being frightening, or leading me to despair, those words, "Remember you are dust, and to dust, you will return," seemed in that moment to be strangely comforting. They reminded me of words from Psalm 39, where the Psalmist says to God, "Show me, Lord, my life's end and the number of my days; let me know how fleeting my life is." We, humans, are frail and fragile creatures of the creator — a truth we don't always recognise or accept. To dwell on that truth during Lent, holding it together with the equal and opposite truth that we are, as the title of a book says, "*Beloved* Dust" seems to me a good spiritual discipline for these 40 days.

For by the grace of God in Christ, we are both fragile *and* strong, mortal *and* immortal. We are dust, and to dust, we will return, yes. But that's not the end of the story, for from dust we shall rise, clothed with life and immortality, to live with God eternally.

As we move through Lent together, I invite you to take time to meditate on these paradoxical truths: that we are creatures, limited, finite, and weak, and that we are held in the hands of an unlimited, infinite, and strong God; that our time in this life is brief, and that our time with God in the world to come is eternal; that we are as humans deeply flawed, and we are deeply loved – and that in the cross with which we are marked in baptism, and may be marked on Ash Wednesday, all of that comes together.

# TUESDAY MARCH 14th 7.30pm GARWAY HALL £5.00 MRS HARRIS GOES TO PARIS

You might think, from its title, that this film is full of treacly, girly niceness. And yes, there is a lot of sheer uplifting goodness in it. But it turns out, it's so much more than that, as nearly all the hard-bitten film critics out there agreed. Lesley Manville stars as a working-class post-war widow who falls in love with a Dior dress that is way beyond her means. But, for her, it's more than a posh frock, it's hope, escape, self-realisation and adventure. She scrimps together enough cash and heads for the Dior atelier in Paris. Here she encounters the frosty, snobbish Claudine Colbert, *directrice* of the famous couture house, played by the legendary French actress Isabelle Huppert. Madame is determined to fend off anyone who risks sullying its image or offending Dior's high-class clientele. But Ada from London has a lot more to her than a cockney accent and a fanciful dream, as the House of Dior and its acolytes are about to find out.

This is a film that carefully and cleverly shows niceness needn't equal slush. It will send you away with little sequins of happiness hanging on your winter coats, (and which one of us doesn't need that, these days?). It also offers a glorious trawl through a real-life couture house i.e. it's got dresses to die for. # BORDERLINES FILM FESTIVAL at Garway Hall March 3<sup>rd</sup> & March 10<sup>th</sup>.

The Uk's biggest rural film festival comes to Herefordshire again this year and Garway Hall will be hosting two much-lauded films.

#### AFTERSUN on Friday March 3rd at 7.30pm £5.50.

Winner of 6 British Independent Films Awards 2022. We are so delighted to bring this profoundly affecting film to Garway, not least because its cinematographer, Greg Oke, was brought up in our

village. Greg, who now lives in Berlin, will be introducing the film and will be answering questions afterwards. **AFTERSUN** is a profoundly affecting exploration of the relationship between a young father and his eleven- year- old daughter as they share a rare holiday together in Turkey. All seems wonderful under the Mediterranean sun until cracks begin to show in their relationship and in Calum the father's life. It's film about making memories, longing and loss and is an astounding debut from director Charlotte Wells.

#### UTAMA on Friday March 10th at 7.30pm £5.50.

This is a film of dazzling visual power and poignancy, which tells the story of a couple who work on the land in a remote, uncompromising area of Bolivia. When a long drought threatens their way of life, Virginio and Sisa have to decide whether to continue or move to an easier life in the city. But Virginio is stubborn and insists that his way of life is bred into him and is not to be forsaken, despite expediency, family pressures, and climate change.

The two main actors in this film had never performed before which has resulted in a film of great honesty and integrity where every frame breathes meaning and beauty.

#### **Green Garway Book Group**



In January we held our first Green Garway Book Group and the first book to be discussed was *I Bought a Mountain* by Thomas Firbank. A best-selling classic and pioneer of nature writing, this is the autobiography of Thomas Firbank, a Canadian who decided, aged just 21, to buy himself a hillside farm in Snowdonia the 1930's. He initially knew nothing about farming but managed to ingratiate himself with the local farmers. With his indomitable wife Esme and her great Ideas, and the support of the local farming community, they overcame some pretty massive challenges and, on the whole, made a success of their farm.

This is a thrilling tale of adversity and triumph, in an extremely inhospitable environment, told in a very direct and sometimes humorous style. It is very much a book of its time though with some cringy stereotyping and some of us found it a bit too much of a sheep farming manual.

Our overall rating was 3/5.



The process for appointing a new vicar is well underway and the post is currently being advertised in the Church Times. The churchwardens of the parish churches of the St Weonards Benefice will meet to consider the responses to the advert in late February and early March. In mid-March, shortlisted candidates will visit the Benefice for "orientation" and an interview. It is hoped that the new incumbent might be in place by the end of the year.

Meanwhile, there will be a Benefice service at Orcop on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> March, to be led by Bishop Anthony Priddis (former Bishop of Hereford).

Jane Rigler is kindly hosting the Orcop Lent Lunch on 29<sup>th</sup> March, advertised separately. Please support this if you can, especially as the proceeds will go to those in desperate need in Ukraine.

Looking ahead, there will not be an Easter service in Orcop this year and those wishing to celebrate Easter are urged to go to St. Weonards at 10.00am when Bishop David Thomson will be celebrating communion. The monthly Orcop communion service, at 11am on the second Sunday, will resume from May. Bishop Anthony and the Revd, Crispin Pemberton have kindly agreed to take these services until further notice and you are urged to support them as we strive to keep the church alive until such time as we have our own vicar.

It is worthy of mention here that, despite our being without a vicar, we are nevertheless paying towards our annual Parish Share for the ministry of the church in our benefice amounting to £3500 for 2023.

There are a number of important events coming up in April. These will be advertised in next month's magazine, but they are mentioned here by way of early warning.

Firstly, the annual *Churchyard Bingo* will be held on 21<sup>st</sup> April.

Secondly, we are planning a Spring poetry and cello recital in April, on a date to be advised. Thirdly the Garway "Ave a Go Panto" team is planning a variety show in April, in which Orcop will be well represented. Finally, we are thinking about the annual Orcop Fete, traditionally held on the August Bank Holiday Monday (28<sup>th</sup> this year). Maybe we should do something different this year?

#### How nice to have some feedback!

My sincere thanks to Ian Holdsworth for his well-informed and valuable comments on my "Chicken Gun" story, which are reproduced below with his permission:

First, it was BAC (Filton) that built said gun – not Rolls Royce. The gun was specifically built to test Concorde windscreens.

The gun was a length of steel pipe with a flange at one end. Chicken (4lb) was inserted at flange end. Large air tank was bolted to said flange with a sheet of ½ inch Perspex between them. Air tank was pumped up to pressure. 0.22 rifle built into air tank shattered Perspex to 'fire' the gun. I seem to remember that max velocity claimed for the chicken was of the order of 400 knots. On impact the chicken spread itself over the surrounding area in a very thin layer.

How do I know? I was one of the apprentices occasionally sent to the butcher's shop opposite the Filton site main gate to get the chickens!

The rumoured American activities were just that – a rumour.

Having flown in Concorde, I wish to record thanks to Ian and BAC (Filton) for their diligent research to safeguard passengers (and crew) against bird-strikes! **Peter Garratt**

### TRETIRE WITH MICHAELCHURCH AND PENCOYD

At the beginning of February, the Benefice service was held at St Mary's Tretire on Sunday 5th, when we celebrated the Presentation of Jesus Christ in the Temple. In Jewish times, a new baby was brought to the temple in Jerusalem to be blessed, when the official forty Days of Purification of the mother had been completed. In the Catholic tradition, this day is also known as the Purification of the Virgin Mary.

When Jesus was presented at the temple in Jerusalem, St Luke's gospel tells us that Simeon took the child in his arms. He recognised him as the Messiah and said the now familiar words of what has come to be known as the Nunc Dimittis which predicts that Jesus will be "a light to lighten the Gentiles", which is the origin of the other name for this Sunday, Candlemas.

The retired Bishop David Thomson very kindly came to lead this service, and it happened to fall near his birthday, so that was another reason for decorating the chancel with candles! He commented on the lovely flowers bringing additional light to the church on such a sunny day.

So the theme running through the service was "Jesus the light of the world."

Richard Mynors kindly played the organ and brought with him the benefice choir. They sang an anthem, *In a world where people walk in darkness* after which, everyone was given a lighted candle to carry to the font at the back of the church, and the choir sang *Simeon's Song*.

Snowdrops are known as Candlemas Bells because they are often blooming at this time of year, and some recognise them as symbols of hope. People arriving for this service will surely have felt welcomed by the wonderful display of snowdrops in Tretire churchyard.

The season of Lent begins on February 22nd and some of the parishes are again holding Lent Lunches. Traditionally, this is a frugal lunch of soup, bread and cheese, at which anyone in the benefice is made welcome, and donations are requested for a charity chosen by the parish.

#### Wildlife in our Garden

Another (apparently) quiet month in the garden has passed. The birds coming to our feeding stations are much as before. The only event that was a bit different was the brief visit of a family of long-tailed tits on January 24<sup>th</sup>.

They had a quick feast from the seeds on the wall and then they were off again. It is noticeable how much busier the bird life is on cold mornings than mild ones like today. This is consistent with what we are told by wildlife experts, that birds need to take in enough food during daylight to supply enough energy to keep their bodies warm for 24 hours. This can be very difficult for them on short, cold days and nights when there is not much food about, unless they are fed by humans.

I wonder how many people reading this take part in the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch? We did once again. I always wonder why they have it at such a quiet time of year (quiet for bird numbers I mean). I suppose they're most interested in the residents. Our list was topped by house sparrows and chaffinches (5 of each), with blackbirds and blue tits second (4 of each), a bit different from the national count in which, although house sparrows and blue tits were the top two, next were starlings and woodpigeons. We never see a starling but their chaffinches (our top) didn't even feature in the top 10!

There are very few insects about. I was delighted to hear, then see, quite a large number of honey bees feeding from the winter honeysuckle this morning. I had not realised it was mild enough. Also, on previous years I have seen bumble bees well before any honey bees. I suppose they are opportunistically getting in a quick boost before the cold weather comes back and they have to retreat back to their winter quarters again.

But generally it feels as though nature is having a good sleep, much of it underground, biding its time, and this in spite of the reassuring appearance of daffodils and snowdrops along the side of the stream and golden aconites under the magnolia. I hope to have more to tell you about when spring really arrives!

#### **Book Review**

#### The Man Who Died Twice, by Richard Osman

The Man Who Died Twice is the sequel to Osman's first book, The Thursday Murder Club, which became an instant bestseller – and with good reason.

Four residents of an old age facility form an unlikely alliance that solidifies into friendship and fierce loyalty in the course of their membership of the Thursday Murder Club. Eschewing the jigsaw room and sedate teas, they create their unlikely club with the purpose of adding some spice to their lives.

Elizabeth, ex-secret service, has a sharp intellect and a hard exterior, which appears to be oblivious to the trail of dead bodies that litter their lives, but has a gentle side, caring lovingly for her husband Stephen as he lapses further into dementia. Joyce, a former nurse, is nearer to the stereotypical elderly middle-class woman, but her interest is piqued by the dangers of the club's activities, and she embraces every new experience with a naïve relish. Ron, a former trade union activist, is a fighter and solving murders fills the

gap left by his militancy. Gentle Ibrahim, a retired psychiatrist, forms a thoughtful backdrop to the other three.

Donna and Chris are two police officers who, against their better judgement, find themselves sucked inexorably into the club's activities, as Elizabeth proves to be a better crime-solver than they; and the club members willingness to engage in risky illegal stratagems gets the job done and forces Donna and Chris to turn a blind eye.

Drifting in and out of the narrative is handsome, muscly East European Bogdan, ostensibly a handyman but in reality, a hitman with a heart. All the female characters swoon before his tacitum charm.

Add in a complex plot and you have a splendid novel, a page-turner. But there is more to it than that. Here we have wit and humour thrown in at every turn; pithy but insightful dialogue with throw-away laughs, and, above all, a real grasp of what it is to get older: the pathos of the loss of physical abilities; the desperation to wring every tiny drop of excitement from the time you have left.

"It is fine to say, 'what doesn't kill you makes you stronger.' It is admirable. But it no longer applies when you're eighty. When you are eighty, whatever doesn't kill you just ushers you through the next door, and the next door and the next, and all of these doors lock behind you."

What could be more exciting than chasing the whereabouts of a cache of diamonds worth £20 million and pursuing a murderer? The friends cannot resist.

The juxtaposition of old people pottering about with the usual preoccupations, and the cutthroat world of crime and espionage is inherently funny, and Osman milks every drop of this humour, and misses no opportunity to insert dry comments on modern day society.

This is a very entertaining book to be highly recommended. Incidentally, I listened to it as an audiobook on my smartphone, having downloaded it via the Borrow Box app, which allows you free access to both audiobooks and ebooks, provided that you have a membership of your local library. I am hooked! I can read while preparing lunch!

#### **Garden Notes**

Twelve years ago, I acquired my father's diaries, which contain detailed daily entries of nearly fifty years of his life, written in 2H pencil in minuscule script. I couldn't bear to dispose of them until I had worked my way through every entry — after all, they contain my own history too. This winter, I finally started to select the most interesting nuggets and transfer them to the computer with a view to finally clearing a space in the cupboard. Amongst the tedious descriptions of his work as a university lecturer are all the details of the garden of our childhood home and the plants that he grew.

Our house was an interwar Tudorbethan semi with a typical suburban garden; it is only now, reading these diary entries, that I realise just how typical it was. A student of mid-20<sup>th</sup> garden design would be enthralled.

Here is the immaculate front garden with the small square lawn, surrounded by narrow beds of stiff rose bushes, a tall narrow flowering cherry (*Prunus serrulata* 'Amanogawa') and next to the gate, a beautiful red peony. Between the bay window and the front door with its stained-glass windows is a Nelly Moser clematis. The back garden is just as you might imagine. Metal Crittal French windows in the sitting room open onto concrete paving slabs, and a small rectangular lawn is edged by a border containing a mountain ash, lilac, forsythia and witch hazel all underplanted with Rose of Sharon. Beyond the lawn a mass of pink and white heathers, a potentilla (Elizabeth), azalea (Hotspur) and a pieris. Alongside the garage are more roses and *Clematis armandii*; behind the garage, concrete coal bunkers and mop head hydrangeas. Dad's notes were so detailed that I know the names of all the roses he planted (28 in total), where he planted them and where he bought them. They included Peace (of course), Super Star, Ena Harkness, Queen Elizabeth, Iceberg, climbing roses Danse de Feu and Maigold and many others which no longer seem to be available. A very straight line of concrete paving slabs ran all the way down the garden.

Beyond the shrubs was the vegetable plot – potatoes, cauliflowers, purple sprouting, sprouts, carrots, parsnips, onions, leeks, Swiss chard, runner beans and more unusual vegetables such as asparagus, salsify and scorzonera. Unusually for the 60s, Dad grew sweetcorn, which he had developed a taste for while working in Vancouver. He also grew globe artichokes which were an annual treat for our Sunday tea. For

reasons only known to Dad, he also grew horseradish. Much as I love Colman's horseradish sauce on my roast beef, I don't recommend growing your own - we tried using it once, and only the once...

Beyond the vegetable plot were rhubarb, gooseberries, blackcurrants, strawberries, Laxton Superb apples and Conference pear trees. He grew some of the apples as oblique cordons trained at 45° on the fence and the rest were vertical cordons so that he could cram in as many trees as possible. Beyond the fruit was a row of Christmas trees grown from seed. Every year Dad would dig up the best-shaped Christmas tree and pot it up for the sitting room – and then replant it in January. Occasionally he would dig them up to sever the tap root and replant them, presumably to ensure that he would always be able to squeeze them into a pot. At the very end of the garden were three small sheds and the compost heap.

Dad only used hand tools in the garden. The lawn was mown with a Ransomes hand-pushed mower - such an evocative sound – and shrubs were trimmed with hand shears. Back then we weren't as aware of green issues, so everything was dusted or sprayed for this and that. Dad was never one to follow fashion, so (fortunately) there was no rockery, no crazy paving and no gnomes! However, in the plants that he grew he was definitely following fashion. The roses were surrounded by bare earth (something I would never do in my own garden) and there were no perennials. Every year he sowed seeds and planted out annuals which were dug up again in autumn. The list is so typical of the 60s and 70s: sweet peas, snapdragons, pansies, begonias, lobelia, alyssum, iberis, busy lizzies, carnations, and mesembryanthemums (by far my favourite with their pretty starry flowers and strange fleshy leaves). Every year he ordered chrysanthemums from Woolmans, yellow and bronze, to provide Mum with flowers for the house.

Looking back, I find it extraordinary how productive that garden was, whilst still having room for trees, shrubs, flowers and a lawn for our deckchairs. Dad kept it immaculately tidy and although my own garden here is very different, it worked extremely well for our needs.
