# Letter from Bishop Richard



#### Dear Friends.

June marked the 25th anniversary of Refugee Week ( $19 - 25^{th}$  June). People were invited to celebrate what compassion looks like in action, so I was proud to support the launch of a fundraising campaign, set up by our Diocesan Mothers Union. They are supporting those who are seeking asylum who are currently housed at The Three Counties Hotel in Hereford. They are raising cash to offer each person the dignity of choosing basic clothing items.

Asylum Seekers are the real face of refugees in our midst – 'the stranger.' They flee their countries of origin often in fear, searching for something better, the freedom to live and eventually contribute through work. They find themselves in a strange place, reliant on the mercy and generosity of others – us.

I was reminded how vulnerable we are when we rely on the generosity of others during my recent visit to Nuremberg. The kindness and generosity of my hosts were gratefully received, and I am thankful for our strong links of friendship with the German diocese of Nuremberg which have stood the test of time for over 30 years. I was there, visiting the Evangelical Lutheran Churches biennial Kirchentag. Despite being post-Brexit, I was warmly welcomed, and Bishop Elizabeth and her husband made our stay easy. Even with our different languages, cultures and histories, we are genuinely brothers and sisters through our shared faith in Jesus Christ.

It is a healthy part of Christian discipleship to get out of our comfort zone. To be in Germany, a country I am not that familiar with, forced a certain dependence. My hosts gave me accommodation, fed me and provided a huge amount of inside information to help enrich my stay. There is a rich tradition of such Christian hospitality going back to the earliest times, particularly to foreigners and strangers.

In Deuteronomy 10 we read, "the great God mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality and accepts no bribes. He defends the cause of the fatherless and the widow and loves the foreigner residing among you, giving them food and clothing. And you are to love those who are foreigners, for you, yourself were foreigners in Egypt."

We have an opportunity to offer such hospitality to people who have arrived in our midst and live out the commandment in Deuteronomy 10. The writer of Deuteronomy doesn't speculate on whether the foreigners were smuggled into Israel slung under a camel. The sole criterion to help was the need.

I am very proud of our Diocesan Mothers Union who are seeking to provide support to our refugee friends. You can still give to the clothing appeal by arranging a retiring collection at a service and donating the proceeds online or if you can donate directly, please give what you can. <u>All the details are on the website</u>. Please be generous.

Despite a rather damp day, Ron Evans and friends generously brought their vintage tractors and engines to support the Open Garden at Treago. At the end we enjoyed a wonderful drive past!



The tea was as usual wonderful with so many delicious cakes and biscuits. Many thanks to all those involved and those who came to support this event who helped to raise over £1100 towards the ministry of the church in our parish and beyond.

We are most grateful to Rev Rob North who led our All Age Communion service. A special comment must be made about Edward Morris who took the part of a heavily laden young person with an overfilled rucksack, in a short drama, to illustrate the reading from Matthew's gospel, *Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.* We had time to reflect on our worries, and as usual after the service we shared some of our joys and concerns as we ate cake!

We are looking forward to the Lammas Service at Treessey Barns HR2 8NA at 10.00am on July 30<sup>th</sup>. Do come and take part in this simple service to celebrate the beginning of harvest.

As a church we try to follow Jesus' model of generosity by giving away 10% of our income: each year we aim to support a person or charity locally, nationally and globally. We are currently supporting leadership and agricultural training in Uganda; a young leader in a youth centre in the UK; and here in Herefordshire, we are giving and praying for the work of *We Are Farming Minds*, founded by Sam and Emily Stables from Kingsthorne. Parishes are asked by the Hereford diocese to contribute annually to what is called the Parish Share/Offer. While part of this money goes towards the work of priests in the diocese, it also supports training for ordinands, those who will in the future serve as priests.

## **Training for Church Ministry**



As many of you know, our daughter Alex Mynors Herbert, who usually leads our All Age Services, is training for ordination. But people often ask what that means! She writes –

"I'm training part-time, so that means three years of study alongside my teaching job at Whitecross School in Hereford. I go to evening classes in Ludlow each Wednesday, and then drive across to Cuddesdon College, Oxford for a couple of weekends each term (thankfully I share lifts with another ordinand from Craswall, and we can talk everything over in the car!)

Ludlow is great, as we are taught with people training as lay readers, as well as other ordinands, and we're from all across Hereford Diocese, so we can share ideas about rural churches and communities. We also have people who just come along for that module, if it's something they're interested in - they don't have to do the reading or essays if they don't want to, whereas I definitely do!

If all goes ok, I will finish studying and be ordained deacon (a kind of 'assistant priest') in 2025, and start working alongside an experienced vicar, before being ordained priest in 2026. Whether I stay teaching part-time, and serve the church locally part-time as a volunteer, as Frances did, or work full-time in a group of parishes, I don't know yet, but I imagine God has a plan!

I'm loving the studying and thinking, and hope what I'm learning will equip me well to serve God and people in the years ahead - thank you to all those of you who have encouraged me and continue to pray for me."



This was the inspiration of Christine Snell who masterminded the event and organised all the logistics. A total of nine couples applied to take part, and partners were drawn from a hat by Christine, and a programme of the heats was sent to all participants.

It was very fortunate that they were held in the morning which was beautifully warm and sunny.; some couples played on the hard court at Michaelchurch House, kindly offered by Edmund and Alex Inkin, and some couples played on the court at Pencoyd Court Farm, made available by Anthony and Christine Snell. There was a small band of spectators for each court, and it was a delightful way to while away a warm sunny morning.

The rain showed no sign of abating for some considerable time, but it did allow a fair number of people to listen to the cricket commentary on the radio, and heard England make their last three runs to win the test match!

Play on grass was clearly no longer an option, so eventually, the semi-finals were relocated to the Snell's hard court and a group of the players' supporters followed them to Pencoyd Court Farm, where they cheered on the final 2 couples, and witnessed the presentation of a cup to the victors, David Snow and Alex Inkin.

It was most unfortunate that the afternoon's weather rather put punters off returning to the Hall for tea, but at least no tablecloths had been spread on the tables in the garden! A gazebo had been erected over the main tea table, and Rosemary Evans continued to hold the raffle there against all the odds; and at least the plant stall didn't come to any harm, though the stall holders did get rather wet!

Our PCC members did a magnificent job serving teas, and washing up all afternoon, but I fear at this stage (I'm writing this on the following day) it is too early to say what funds have been raised for Tretire and Pencoyd churches.

#### Wildlife in our Garden

In June we stopped putting out seeds and nuts regularly for the birds. We think there should be enough food for them elsewhere. It does mean we see fewer birds now, but we are more aware of their singing, coming from their hidden places amongst the leaves.

It has been a bit like a classical music concerto, with one song dominating the melody while all the rest perform their own parts in the background. But unlike a classical concerto, it is not always the same soloist. Different species seem to take it in turns. After the first summer migrants arrived it was the chiff-chaff announcing its arrival, then two song thrushes took over for about two weeks, then some black birds; finally black-caps have been the loudest for about three weeks. In winter it is nearly always the robin of whom we are most aware, but now he forms part of the background along with chaffinches, tits, wrens and dunnocks. Most years I'm very aware of great tits early in the summer when they loudly proclaim "teacher, teacher" from a high perch, but not this year.

The insects have given us no great surprises recently. There were may-fly in May and plenty of damsel-flies since then. In our garden we expect dragon-flies later in the year, though I have already seen them near water in other places. There are the usual large white butterflies about and red admirals. There are commas around now too, though I haven't seen many tortoiseshell or peacock butterflies yet. For a few years now we have seen humming-bird hawk moths, especially on warmer days, behaving just like tiny humming-birds and skipping from flower to flower with their long tongues. It is not something I remember from younger days, so I wonder whether they have become more common in this country. As I have reported before, we have many

bumble bees and hover-flies, but very few honey bees these days. We know that nationally they are in decline, so I suppose we have the honey producers with their hives to thank for keeping them going.

We have seen little piles of poo in various places in the garden, such as might be left by a small dog. I thought it meant we were hosting more hedgehogs, so I set up a night camera to observe, but to my surprise, the next day it revealed a fox cub sniffing around the area, and he or she was back the next night too. Since the rain has come back the moles have been very active tunnelling under and through the lawn. We still have a colony of bats in our roof and I have at last got round to counting them coming out on warm June evenings. The last time I did this I counted 113 emerging between 9.30 and 10.30 pm, but I cannot be sure this is accurate as I may have gone out a bit too late to see the early ones.

#### **Book Review**

# Shrines of Gaiety by Kate Atkinson

Pure Atkinson, this novel transports us to 1920s London, to the drug and drink filled nightclubs and to the streets of the criminal underworld. It is Dickens for a new era, brimming with larger-than-life characters (rather a lot of them) and seasoned with Atkinson's casual wit and cynical charm.

As the novel opens Nellie Coker is greeted by crowds on her release from a six-month prison term for breach of the licensing laws. Middle-aged Nellie, separated from her husband and mother of a brood of financially privileged adult children, presides over a lucrative string of jazz-age nightclubs, frequented by many of the great and good, who can rely on Nellie's discretion at all times and in all circumstances. Skating around the edges of the law, Nellie and her family milk the aristocracy for all they are worth.

Loosely based on real-life Kate Meyrick, the 1920s "Queen of the Soho night club scene", Nellie's first stroke of luck is the death of her landlady whose handbag she has the wit to investigate before phoning the police. The astonishing contents fund her future and set in train her empire.

Woven into the plot are members of the Metropolitan Police (both upright and corrupt, and not averse to Nellie's back-handers); a young librarian Gwendolen Kelling from "up north" who comes to London in search of two stage-struck runaway girls, Freda and Florence; and a whole varied cast of thieves and rogues.

The character of Gwendolen is central to the story. Only daughter of a northern widow who, after her two sons die in the Great War, ties Gwendolen to a financially straitened life of doing her bidding. It is only on her death that Gwendolen discovers the true extent of her fortune, freeing her to spread her wings. Gwendolen is fresh from her bereavements and from the horrors of nursing at the front: "one grief after another—her brothers, Father, the money, not to mention the war itself—had taken its toll on her and she had allowed herself to be worn down on the grindstone of Mother."

"Everyone she worked alongside in France had been insatiable letter-writers and resolute diary-keepers, but Gwendolen had felt no urge to chronicle, no desire for an aide-mémoire. Life was for absorbing, not recording. And in the end, it was all just paper that someone would have to dispose of after you were gone. Perhaps, after all, one's purpose in this world was to be forgotten, not remembered."

There is true horror within these pages – the death hole in the Thames where bodies regularly wash up, shootings in night clubs, and innocent girls drawn into prostitution.

Unless you have read Atkinson before, it is hard to describe the way in which acts of ruthlessness are written with such brio that the reader almost glosses over them; but alongside this there is also sympathy and sensitivity in the masterly way she paints her characters. She is mistress of the throw-away line:

"Lying came easily to Niven, he thought of it as a means of protecting the truth."

"Life was all just coming and going, wasn't it? And then eventually it was just going."

Underneath it all Atkinson, as always, projects a sense of the random nature of life, of its pointlessness – it is as if she stands back from life and watches it with her acutely cynical eye.

#### **Garden Notes**

I have been finding it more and more difficult to find a peat-free potting compost that I like and am considering mixing my own. I have never coped with coir-based composts as I struggle with the watering; shrubs that I have bought that have been grown in coir invariably die when I plant them in the garden. Other composts are poor quality, containing twigs, large chunks of uncomposted bark, stones and plastic. Potting compost is not cheap and I find it frustrating that manufacturers rarely list the ingredients on the bag. This year I mistakenly bought a bag that must have been nearly 100% peat – I felt suitably guilty and very annoyed that there was nothing on the bag to say it contained peat. There are numerous recipes on the internet depending on what the compost is to be used for and what ingredients are available. The Gardeners World website tells us that Monty Don recommends a mix of three parts coir, one part sieved garden compost, one part sieved loam and one part sharp sand, perlite or horticultural grit. Other recipes use different proportions of these ingredients, or are based on a combination of loam, garden compost/leaf mould/composted bark, and sharp sand. Some add fertiliser; some add lime.

Part of my frustration is because in a previous life I worked for a compost manufacturer for five years. We made a range of composts – seed, general purpose, ericaceous, aquatic and a peat-free compost. We also supplied specialist nurseries for whom we made compost to their own recipes. It was such excellent compost that our clients included Wisley, Kew Gardens, Hampton Court, Windsor Castle, National Trust gardens such as Hidcote - a reflection of the fantastic quality of our products. The company was sold when the owners reached retirement age and now no longer exists – hence my constant search to find a compost I like as much.

I expect it will be a matter of trial and error, but I will start with a mixture of loam (I have a lovely pile of turves rotting down in a corner of the garden), my home-made garden compost (I have a plentiful supply), sharp sand and vermiculite (to improve drainage and to make it lighter) and fertiliser. I will have to experiment with the proportions, and I might even try including a little coir. Even if I have to buy some of the ingredients it will work out cheaper and ultimately, I might create a compost that I like. I will still buy seed compost though as my home-produced ingredients are not sterile – and are full of weed seeds!

Well, that was all very boring. On a more exciting note, I have a birthday soon. My idea of a birthday treat is not a celebratory meal or a boozy evening in the pub, but to visit a garden centre. In my single days, having no-one to celebrate with, I would plan a tour of the county (Oxfordshire back then) visiting all my favourite garden centres: morning coffee at the first, lunch at the next, afternoon tea at the last. I enjoyed it hugely and although I didn't necessarily buy anything, I had a lovely tootle around the countryside through villages I hadn't visited before, I didn't have to do any cooking or washing up and I could have a lovely browse around all the beautiful plants and gardening paraphernalia. My idea of a good day out!
