

This is the only service in our parishes on that day. Come and join us!



Each year, the Royal British Legion's Remembrance Festival focuses on a different aspect of honouring those who have served the Crown and country in the armed forces. This year the theme is *Service*, not just of those deployed on active service, but the unseen service of those who love them. We're encouraged to remember the impact that their absence, and their homecoming can have, not just on the service personnel, but on their loved ones.

These are the hidden costs of serving in the armed forces. Those at home, whether they be parents, partners, spouses or children, carry a load of anxiety for their loved one. There's the weight of managing without them, and then of re-shaping lives and routines around them when they return. If they return, of course. If not, there's the burden of grief which will be carried life-long.

If they do return, they're forever changed by what they've experienced in combat or on peacekeeping duties. They may carry physical and mental scars, and not know how to express them except among their comrades, who don't need words because they just get it, because they've seen and heard and smelled the same things. That can have an impact on loved ones too.

I often tell the story in Remembrance services of a man I knew in my home church who had been a prisoner of war in Burma during World War II. He'd seen and experienced unimaginable things but would never talk to his wife about them. He didn't want to. He didn't want those images to be spoken of in his home back in England. They weren't to invade that precious space, that haven. But that didn't mean he'd forgotten, or that those memories didn't trouble him. He and his wife learned to live with them, and with the fact that some things just remained unspoken.

Perhaps in this year's season of Remembrance, as well as remembering and giving thanks for the sacrifice of those who fought and died in the service of our nation and of peace, we can also remember to pray for those still serving now. For those who love them and support them, and for healing of the seen and unseen scars of war.

God of healing and of peace, in whose service is perfect freedom,

we hold before you those who serve our nation in His Majesty's Armed Forces, and those who love them.

We pray that during times of separation you would protect their relationships.

We pray that during times of reunion you would ease the transitions and be present in homecomings.

We pray for healing of bodies, minds, and spirits broken by experiences of combat, and for healing of grief for those who will never return.

Hold and guard all who serve on behalf of others, and their loved ones, we pray. Amen.

LUZZU is world cinema at its authentic best. Set on the island of Malta and using real life fishermen in its cast, this feature tells the story of Jesmark, a man who, like his father and grand-father before him, earns a meagre living by fishing from his 12foot multi-coloured traditional boat, a Maltese luzzu. But this way of life is being threatened by industrial sized fishing operators and by black market operators and out and out criminal practices. Many men are accepting an EU offer to buy their traditional boats and are joining larger fishing fleets. Personal problems are pushing Jesmark towards a difficult decision – his child needs specialist medical treatment, his wife is threatening to leave.

What we gradually witness is the erosion of Jesmark's principles and his loyalty to a family heritage as he struggles to keep his head above water. The film speaks with tellingly observed detail and wonderfully subtle performances from its largely non-professional actors. You can almost smell the Mediterranean salt. Made by writer/director Alex Camilleri, a Maltese American, LUZZU is a million miles from Hollywood glitz and is all the better for it. ## Autumn Extravaganza Flower Workshop at the Garway Coffee morning on November 7<sup>th</sup>

Pat Waters will be joining us once more for this fun workshop

Celebrate the autumnal colours of foliage and flowers as we move slowly towards the winter months.

Have a look in your garden and the surrounding countryside to source some foliage and coloured twigs, berries, seedheads and nuts. Buy some brightly coloured flowers in oranges, reds and yellows.

The flower arrangement can be made in a rustic jug, a pottery bowl, a basket or placed on a wooden board or platter. Copper items look very attractive at this time of year.

Items to bring to the workshop;-Scissors. One or two containers. A piece of floral foam ( or chicken wire if you have it) Your chosen flowers. A selection of foliage, dried grasses, berries or fruits, or seedheads etc of your choice

If you wish to add some SPARKLE to your arrangement for the dark nights, bring a string of battery lights!

#### **Garway Village Common Trees – Garway Parish Council**

Garway Parish Council has had a survey of the trees on the common done by a professional arboricultural consultant. This is due to safety concerns about the state of the trees lining the road into the village. As a result, the council has instructed a qualified tree surgeon to carry out a programme of work.

A number of trees require attention: mostly as a result of Chalara, Ash Dieback. This is a fungal disease that is affecting millions of Ash trees across the UK. The worst affected trees are becoming brittle and potentially dangerous, and it is hoped their removal will also reduce spread to other healthy trees. Some other trees will be trimmed where they are encroaching on properties, and a split oak by the croquet pitch requires attention now before it starts to fail. The children's play area will also benefit from having encroaching trees trimmed back.

The work will have the effect of increasing the light to a couple of the ponds on the common, which should reduce leaf fall into the water and increase plant and aquatic life.

The work should take place in early December. A number of local tree surgeons have quoted and the one selected represented both best value for money and protection for biodiversity.

'Garway Parish Council is without a Parish Clerk at the moment due to health reasons and is being supported by Herefordshire Association of Local Councils (HALC) who are attending to admin matters such as calling and attending Parish Council meetings and producing draft minutes. Items already put forward for the November agenda include: Quotes for fencing & bark in the play area, provision of dog waste bins, future provision for car parking once the areas outside the old village hall and the old school are no longer available, request to plant a memorial tree on the common, purchase of an oak bench for Broad Oak'

#### **Green Garway Book Group**

#### The Lost Rainforests of Britain by Guy Shrubsole

This book raises awareness of the lost habitat of the temperate rainforest, thought to have covered around one fifth of our country in times past and now just limited to a strip on the western side of Scotland, Wales and England.

This unique habitat is home to mystical ferns, spectacular lichens, velveteen mosses and rare birds and with such rich fauna and flora needs to be cherished and brought back to life. Shrubsole's enthusiam for lichen is infectious although the book is a bit repetitive in places (the ability of deer to jump over any fence is mentioned at least three times). His language is playful - when talking about what was restricting the development of Wistman's Wood he says "a suspect with a decidedly sheepish appearance".

So sheep are the baddies, jays are the winged heroes and rhododendrons are a menace. It is all very finely balanced, but he does finish positively with progress being made.

The annual British Legion act of remembrance will take place at 4 pm on Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> November, at the cross-roads war memorial. Given the conflicts now raging in The Ukraine, Israel and The Sudan, it is particularly important that we acknowledge the terrible price that is paid by those who engage in armed conflict.

## HOARWITHY AND HENTLAND

#### Wildlife in our Garden

I keep being astonished by the Red Admirals! All the more so now that summer is briefly back. Yesterday, as we were picking apples for the apple pressing event at Orcop, red admirals were thronging round and sucking the juice of the apples that had holes, presumably made by birds. Not only are the red admirals this year more plentiful, they also appear to me to be bigger and to have brighter colours than usual.

Other animals enjoy fruit too. A comma butterfly was on the apples. Voles go for the windfallers, and in one of the conference pears remaining on the tree, I found two hornets feasting. I decided to leave them to enjoy themselves. Of course many insects are making the most of this revival of warmth. Since they have no internal body heating system, they depend upon warm weather to give them the energy to move about and feed. I am glad that we have plenty of fruit in this garden and mostly we're happy to share it with wildlife. The only things we begrudged it this year were the strawberries. With the voles, birds and slugs getting at them before they were ripe, there were almost none left for us.



On 1<sup>st</sup> October we duly hung up a seed feeder and started putting out seeds on the low wall which we see easily from where we eat breakfast. Very soon all the usual suspects were back, a robin and a blackbird first, then a dunnock, great and blue tits, sparrows and chaffinches. These birds tend to separate themselves into ground and perch feeders. Robins, blackbirds and dunnocks prefer the ground or the wall;

tits all prefer to perch on the feeder; but a few are more adaptable and can manage either, notably chaffinches and sparrows.

When lifting seeds out of the large polythene bag where they had been stored through the summer, Margaret was surprised, and not at all pleased, to experience clouds of fruit flies swarming round her face. On investigation, it turned out that much of the seed in the bottom of the bag had somehow got damp and started to ferment, so that has had to be disposed of in the garden. We don't know whether birds will want to eat the fermenting seed, but we should soon find out. Anyway, we conclude that it's probably best not to try to keep large amounts of seed from one season to the next, so we won't be buying in such bulk in future.

I have just seen a very strange sight (at least, I don't think I'm dreaming?). It is evening and the sun still quite warm. Before coming in, I turned and looked towards an Abelia bush. There, hovering (more accurately, dancing up and down) above it, was a Mayfly! There did not seem to be any others. Either the climate has gone bonkers or I have!

#### **Book Review**

#### The Cut-Out Girl by Bart Van Es

Van Es, professor of English Literature at Oxford University, has written a remarkable and moving book that recounts the story of Hesseline (Lien) de Jong, a Jewish girl living in The Hague at the time of the Second World War. Van Es, of Dutch parentage, was brought up in Britain from the age of three, and was always aware that his grandmother, like many other non-Jews, had taken in Jewish children, of which Lien was one, during the war to save them from deportation to the death camps. He also knew that the relationship between Lien and his family had broken down many years before, but the details were not spoken of in the family. Following his grandfather's death, he sets out to pursue this hidden corner of his family's history.

From his many meetings, and his developing warm relationship, with the now elderly Lien, Van Es pieces together a shocking story that not only illuminates Lien's suffering, but also reveals that The Netherlands, which had a history of welcoming immigrant Jews going back to the 16<sup>th</sup> century, was, of all the Nazioccupied territories in Europe, the one with the highest number of Jewish victims. Despite the mass strike in 1941 protesting the first deportation of young Jews, studies indicate the presence of Dutch collaborators who played their part in this high toll.

But the resistance was also active in The Netherlands. and many Dutch families risked their lives to take in Jewish children who were absorbed into their families and registered at schools as non-Jewish. Lien was taken on one side by her mother "I must tell you a secret," she said. "You are going to stay somewhere else for a while." The next day a woman came to take her away, and Lien never saw her family again.

Things did not go well for all these fostered children – torn from their families, with very little understanding of what was happening. They found themselves plunged into a new culture and living on

the periphery of families that were not their own, whilst having no idea what had happened to their real families. Lien's sense of rootlessness and absence of truly belonging left lifelong scars. In addition, German police raids meant that often these children were moved from place to place at short notice. Van Es describes terrifying journeys, often by night, as Lien was shipped around in search of a safe haven. Friendships with her foster sisters and brothers were randomly torn apart, and sadly she suffered abuse from one of these "uncles." Returning eventually to the Van Es household where she had felt more a part of the family, once again the attempted attentions of the father of the family (Van Es's grandfather) caused further trauma. But she regarded them as the nearest thing she had to family, and the later rift, when it came, was deeply felt on all sides.

The book has two narratives: Lien's recollections of her wartime experiences, as told by Van Es; and Van Es's own 21<sup>st</sup> century research, both academic and personal, as his relationship with the octogenarian Lien develops and flourishes.

Van Es skillfully fleshes out the bald facts of the story by creating engaging and absorbing scenes and conversations that have the feel of a work of fiction and are charged with emotion. Central to the story are the many photographs that Lien shared; and also the contents of her school days autograph book in which her friends were invited to contribute poems which touchingly lend real human form to the characters in this sad story.

There is much to learn here about recent history, and some beautiful sensitive prose.

#### **Garden Notes**

My husband has a new toy, which I am not thrilled with. He is pottering around the garden singeing the weeds in the gravel paths and between the cobbles with a weed wand. I can't relax while he is doing this and I follow him round in a state of agitation, shrieking 'Mind my plants!'. I suspect that he won't use it again until I go out — it will be his guilty secret. My agitation is all my brother's fault who told me a cautionary tale about a man in the village his friend lives in. Earlier this year, he accidentally set light to his wooden decking with a weed wand. The fire rapidly spread to the semi next door before moving back to his own house. The elderly couple next door returned from a day out to find that they had no house and no shed.

I have mentioned before about my love of making garden compost. I had so much this year that I gave a few barrowloads to a friend down the road. She showed me her polytunnel last week and was delighted with the 'weeds' that had sprung up where she had added compost. She has foxgloves, *Verbena bonariensis* and *Nicotiana langsdorffii* – that's the one with dainty lime-green flowers. I have just the same flowers popping up in my own borders. It is probably five years since I last grew the Verbena and Nicotiana, so it was quite a surprise to see them growing in the borders this year. A line of molehills has also appeared on the borders, which was not such a nice surprise. I didn't mind when he was pottering up and down the track outside but now that he (or she?) has moved into the garden I'm not too happy.



Recently I have been looking into perennial tulips, which really means those that come back for more than one year rather than being truly perennial. I rarely plant tulips, glorious as they are, because treating them

like annual bedding seems such an extravagance and so wasteful. Tulips come from the Eurasian steppe which has cold winters and hot dry summers, so it is not surprising that they do not last long in our gardens. Some varieties are more reliably perennial than others - species tulips, Darwin hybrids, Forsteriana (which have large bulbs) and Viridiflora (the chlorophyll in the flowers helps build up the bulbs) - but it also depends on the individual garden, the location they are planted, the depth of the bulb, the amount of sun etc. In this garden a mixed selection planted a few years ago has mostly disappeared but one variety is still going strong. Tulipa 'Seadov', a beautiful medium-height Triumph tulip with long-lasting red flowers has flowered every year, and I am tempted to splash out and buy a few dozen more. I have also had success with Tulipa 'Spring Green' and the very beautiful scented T. 'Ballerina'. One tulip that is often recommended is *Tulipa sprenger*i. It will naturalise in grass and flourish in shade. It is indeed very lovely but at £9.50 per bulb it is not one that I will be planting here. It spreads by seed which is why it is a good one to naturalise. Chiltern Seeds sells packets of 470 seeds for only £2.26 which seems like a bargain except that they take 4 to 7 years to flower!






