#### **Letter from Bishop Richard**

Dear Friends,

May marks the end of the Easter season and the beginning of what is affectionately known as 'ordinary time' in the Church calendar. The pivot happens at the feast of Pentecost on May 19th this year. Every Sunday is always a celebration of the resurrection, so it's hard to see what is ordinary about it. The events of the Christ's death and resurrection are the turning point of history. It is a world-shattering event that means life can never be the same again. The book of Acts tells us how the disciples' lives were turned upside down by it. In their grief at the loss of Jesus a number were considering returning to their previous occupations. Once they encountered the risen Lord, they decided to change the world instead!

However, it was not just historical events which changed things. It was the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The Christian faith has always been a supernatural one. In the struggles to fill rotas, find volunteers, maintain buildings and serve our communities we can easily forget this. If the Christian life was just a set of rules to obey, religious acts to observe and an institution to maintain, it would not have lasted very long.

Trusting in the Holy Spirit to empower and lead is less safe than seeking to control events ourselves. Periodically in the history of the Church the Holy Spirit has broken through in ways that have upended our conventional way of doing things. It happened in the Wesleyan revival of the 18th century, numerous mini revivals in the church (of which some happened in our diocese) and in the great outpouring in Azusa Street in 1906 that gave birth to Pentecostalism. This is now the third largest stream in the Church today. In many ways it is hard to see how our current institutional predicament can be served by strategic thinking alone. I am praying for another (likely messy!) outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Diocese of Hereford. Only the Holy Spirit can give us the courage we need for the evangelistic challenge. Only the Holy Spirit can turn the hearts of those currently indifferent to Christian things to help see their need for the Lord. So, 'Come Holy Spirit and kindle the hearts of your people with the fire of your love'. Today, we need that more than ever.

#### **Cathedral visits**

In the week before Easter I went with our family to the Passion Play performed by local people in the cathedral. It was an amazingly moving experience. As we were a little late arriving, the cathedral was full, but as usual with Church of England congregations, the front seats were empty! So we were lucky to be so close to the action.

The stage rather fittingly was directly under the 'crown of thorns'. The story of Jesus's last week from Palm Sunday through his trial, execution and resurrection was simply told. The atmosphere was electric as the story unfolded, and the intense quiet of so many people listening and watching in the cathedral was extraordinary.

The play emphasised the political conflicts amongst the leaders of Jerusalem and the fears of civil unrest. It reminded me of visiting the crowded, old walled city of Jerusalem when on a pilgrimage many years ago. When you consider the numbers of visitors for the Passover celebration in Jesus's day in that crowded place, it was easy to imagine the potential for trouble feared by Pontius Pilate.

Two particular moments of the play amongst many stand out for me. One was the shout of fury from Pontius Pilate-Rev Nicholas Lowton- as he pointed at the high priests and rejected any responsibility for Jesus's execution. The other, from the back of the cathedral, was the chilling sound of large nails being hammered into the cross.

The Chancellor of the cathedral Rev James Pacey had been a producer in the theatre before being ordained, and his enthusiasm and direction led to this wonderful production.

On a lighter note I went with my granddaughters to *Messy Church* in the cathedral which was great fun with lots of children and their families! Plenty of different craft activities were based on the Easter theme which gave me some ideas for our All-Age worship! We gathered round the lifelike tomb with its stone rolled away as James Pacey told the Easter story. We also sang an extremely active song/ hymn with actions (I am not quite able to get up off the floor to sing our part like I used to, but the children could!) and we also enjoyed pizza!

If you have children or grandchildren of primary school age, do consider taking them to the next *Messy Church* which is in half term on 30 May, 12 noon – 2pm.

Although there have been no regular services at Garway church during 2023/24 we have got together for the combined Benefice Advent service in December. This was well attended, and it was good to see lots of new faces.

Last June, as requested by The Grand Priory of England - Knights Templar group, a service, approved by Bishop Richard was held, when new members of the group took vows and were sworn in. The church as a place of pilgrimage is thriving, due to the Knights Templar connections and the "*Teas and Tours*" that are organised by the Friends of Garway Church.

The Friends of Garway Church continue to be a valuable asset to the life of the church. Regular joint meetings are held with the Friends and the PCC who are working towards more regular services and how to grow the church in faith. The Friends deal with the general maintenance of the church building and grounds, and organise the flower, grass cutting and cleaning rotas. They are also committed to improving the church environment, to make it a welcoming and peaceful experience to worshippers and visitors.

Our ancient church is inevitably in need of significant repair. The Friends have been working hard to obtain grants and funding for work to begin on replacing lost and damaged tiles to the tower roof and extensive repointing of the stonework. A faculty list B application has been completed and is awaiting approval from the diocese. Quotes from accredited builders for the repairs are in place. However, the timing of this work is dictated by the presence of bats. As the hibernation period is now over, it is hoped that work will begin in the autumn.

I would like once again to give wholehearted thanks to the work that The Friends do to ensure that St Michael's continues to be a special place for people to come to. The church is a place where our community can come together, to gather in friendship, to enjoy its special atmosphere of peace and calm, and of course to worship.

You won't just watch this film – you'll find yourself taking a deep soothing sensory bath in it. *THE TASTE OF THINGS* tells a story of love, devotion and food in a way that only a French film could. Juliette Binoche and Benoit

Magimel, (one-time real-life partners), play Eugenie and Dodin, he, the master of a French manor house sometime towards the end of the nineteenth century, she, his cook of twenty years. Surrounded by French countryside and birdsong which make you think you've stepped into a Renoir. Dodin and Eugenie share a devoted passion for food and its preparation. He is a gourmand and she is a culinary artist. They are also occasional lovers with Eugenie refusing all Dodin's offers of marriage; she likes things as they are. Their love is expressed through the food, the care in its preparation, the fleeting joy of its taste in the mouth. Don't expect bad behaviour, devious people, dramatic cliffhangers – there aren't any. #### **Garway Piano Trio**

The programme is firmly embedded in the final quarter of the 19th century, with music by Cesar Franck, Tchaikovsky and Dvorak. With one step, we test the 20th century with Bartok's arrangement of *Romanian Dances* for violin and piano. The original tunes were recorded on a phonograph by Bartok in peasant villages and can be listened to online.

The item not involved in the folk idiom of more than half the programme is the *Sonata* by Franck, heard here in its version for 'cello and piano. Written late in the composer's life, it was intended as a wedding gift to an old friend. It exudes a rich warmth and passion which makes it one of the best loved pieces in the late romantic era. The programme begins with the *Dumka* by Tchaikovsky for solo piano, a rarely played masterpiece depicting scenes from country life.

Finally we come Dvorak's farewell to his native land before his move to USA. He played this trio in 40 farewell concerts. You can hear in the music, his love of his Bohemian heritage and everything he is about to leave behind.

#### **Green Garway Book Group**

Here's our review of The *Arbornaut* (<u>A Life Discovering the Eighth Continent in the Trees Above Us</u>) by Meg Lowman.

Dr Meg Lowman is an inspirational scientist, not only for her studies on tree canopies around the world but for her ability to be at the top of her field in a very male dominated world. She's obviously a very driven and focussed woman, and as a child she had the support of her family in pursuing her botanic dreams. She's incredibly brave and took a year's course in Scotland then set off for Australia where she married into a farming family.

However she soon realised that her scientific work clashed with the family's view that a woman should be in the home baking cakes and keeping house. She headed home to the US with her two sons, bringing them up as a single mum.

She's very innovative with her tree climbing designs and a lot of what we know today about tree health is based on what she has discovered in the treetops. She talks a lot about how much she has achieved as a woman and the misogyny she has faced, and it is truly remarkable ... however the book is a bit too heavy in leaf and tree science and doesn't make for a particularly compelling read.

## TRETIRE WITH MICHAELCHURCH AND PENCOYD

I have just returned from visiting Tretire church to check on the Easter flower arrangements, which are still all looking fresh and colourful after the week since our Easter service there. The cold but light and airy church is good for maintaining the flowers for several weeks and they will be a welcoming sight for any visitors.

We were delighted to welcome over 30 people to our Easter service plus 5 children, and so grateful to Rev Brian Phillips for coming to lead our worship and make an Easter service possible in our little church. We had some fun and games with our hymn singing for that morning, as the list compiled on paper for the use of Rev Phillips did not fully correspond to the numbers for hymns displayed on the hymn board. Our congregation therefore struggled to fit the words for our first hymn to the tune of the second hymn, owing to a discrepancy created by the organist, ( ie me) who had written both the paper list, and put the numbers up on the board, but in a different order.

I remained blissfully unaware of the consternation I had caused within the congregation, and played all three verses of the hymn tune for second hymn, whilst thinking to myself what pathetic singing it was from 30 people on this Joyful Eastertide! However, our Churchwarden, Elizabeth did come forward before the playing of the second hymn, to check whether the numbers of the remaining hymns were correctly displayed on the hymn board, thus ensuring we did not have a repeat of that fiasco! The rest of the service proceeded without further hitches. I haven't been dismissed as organist, but I suspect our Churchwarden will be checking up on hymn board numbers before future services!

Hymns for services are sometimes chosen by the priest or lay person leading the service, but the task is sometimes allocated to the organist. Traditionally, it has fallen to the organist in our parish, and I do spend a fair amount of time choosing hymns which appear to have some connection to the bible readings for that Sunday, but there is always a worry that members of the congregation won't know the hymns I have chosen. This is particularly true at our Evening services where we are often fewer in number, so I have suggested that those people who come to Evening Prayer at Pencoyd and Tretire churches, should bring a list of hymns they particularly like, for me to include at future services, ensuring that at least one person will sing them! I repeat that invitation now. #### Wildlife in our Garden

With the arrival of some warmer weather, and in spite of or perhaps because of, the constant damp, there are now numerous insects about: bumble bees, honey bees and the interesting ashy mining bees which I wrote about two years ago, hovering over the lawn. We also regularly see on our feeders: blue and great tits, chaffinches, house sparrows, a pair of great spotted woodpeckers, and more recently goldfinches. On the low wall where we put seeds are: dunnocks, chaffinches, house sparrows, the cock pheasant and occasionally a wren.

The two squirrels that we thought were probably a mating pair are still coming regularly, usually one or the other, but not both together. As we had read that they have litters in March, we assumed the missing one was the female, up in its dray with the young. However, we also read that only the female looks after them, so seeing them swapping about, and later seeing both together down here in the garden, seemed to suggest that they never were a breeding pair, or that the books had it wrong, or that the young were now mature enough to look after themselves.

Another mystery is the tale of "Ratty" the rat. We believe he was living under the compost bin where there were likely holes in the ground. I always thought that rats were normally nocturnal, but every day throughout March, this one would run along a short length of hedge, emerge from the long grass, run to the patch under the feeders, run to the low wall and having scooped up a piece of nut or seeds, run diagonally back to the compost bin, all in broad daylight. We also believed that rats lived in families or

colonies, but in all the time he was out and about, some six weeks, we never caught a glimpse of any other rat.

We had many times of entertainment watching this rat, especially when he encountered the squirrels. He nearly always challenged one or both by running towards them, whereupon the nearest squirrel would become very frisky, flick its tail and jump about. Sometimes the squirrel would run a short distance away, stop and jump about a bit then come back to feeding, or sometimes flee up a tree. We never saw the rat give way, even though the squirrels were at least as big. They all gave way to the cock pheasant though!

All the accounts online and everyone we spoke to, assured us that rats were never solitary for long, and even if he hadn't a family yet, we'd soon be over-run. This led to a small family disagreement. Margaret began to worry that we should be doing something, while I argued that, so far he wasn't doing any harm. In six weeks we'd never seen any other rats, and anyway received wisdom wasn't always right. However I finally relented, and about a week ago we put some sachets of rat poison in a box and put it near his run. For about four days Ratty continued to keep up his normal routine, while inspection of the box revealed all the sachets untouched. On the 5<sup>th</sup> day, Ratty did not appear, and has been absent ever since. We thought he must have finally eaten the poison and would be lying dead somewhere. Not so! There were still no missing or damaged sachets in the box! How do you explain that?

I remain quite uneasy about the tale of this rat, even if we didn't succeed in poisoning it. It shows how readily we are influenced by the prejudices of those amongst whom we live, and also how we humans, as a species, very quickly start to scapegoat certain animals, or even other humans once they start to get a bad name. I am quite sure that the bad reputation acquired by rats grossly exaggerates the actual harm that they do. I believe they have the same right to live on this planet as any other animal and that in their history, they have done less harm than we have.

One final sad tale: sorry! A few days ago Margaret came out of the back door to find a large bird sitting on a wall, about shoulder height (the wall, not the bird!) less than four metres away to her right. The colouring was similar to that of a bird of prey, but small, so likely to be a juvenile. At first, she thought it might be a young owl, but its eyes weren't big enough, so she decided it was a sparrow hawk. She went back inside, crept round another way to call me, then we both had a good look with our binoculars. We agreed it was a young sparrow hawk, but old enough so that when we got too close with cameras, it easily flew off into the hedge. Two days later, she found a dead sparrow hawk lying on the lawn down by the stream. We do not know how it met its end, but perhaps it was just too tame to fly away quickly enough from a passing fox.

#### **Garden Notes**

Like everyone else I am thoroughly fed up with all the rain, and, itching to be out in the garden, I have been trying to do anything I can without treading on the sodden soil. We have tidied the tin shed and taken the old motor mower to the auction at Pontrilas, where it sold for all of £12. I have sorted through the plant pots and thrown away the damaged plastic ones and the cracked pottery ones and that ugly green one that was left by the previous owners of my last house. I have no idea why I brought it with me when I moved and no idea why I have been giving it shed room for 13 years.

We ordered a small skip (have you seen the price of skips!?) and cleared out the tat that has been accumulating behind the two wooden sheds. Who left an old toolbox behind the head gardener's shed (mine) and the plastic crates and broken dog bowl behind the under gardener's (hubby's)? The metal dustbin with the rusted-out bottom can go too – why do we keep this stuff? We have dismantled and discarded the old rotting rabbit hutch with no roof and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  legs. And the largest thing to go is the ancient

wonky greenhouse which has served me so well for years. In between the rain showers I have carefully dismantled it and added it to the skip. There were too many damaged panes of glass and too many corroded components to pass it on to anyone else, so I don't feel too guilty getting rid of it.

I am awaiting delivery of a smart new greenhouse in two weeks: a magnificent 12' x 7' in the same subtle green colour as the octagonal one that I built last year. It has the luxury of eaves a good 12 inches higher than the old one, and the additional 12" in width and 4' in length will give me so much space I will be in seventh heaven. I will enjoy being able to work in inclement weather without the rain dripping through gaps in the ridge. It does mean that our already reduced vegetable plot will shrink even more, but we will still be able to grow a few climbing beans, leeks, parsnips etc. in the patch that will remain. And of course there will be plenty of room for tomatoes, peppers and salad stuff under glass.

I delayed sowing any seeds until the beginning of April, knowing that they would catch up anyway. The corner of the kitchen looks like a weird laboratory - the heated propagator is tucked in at the end of the worktop with strange red lights hovering over it. Red light is supposed to help germination (for some seeds anyway) so it is an experiment really. I have my doubts as to whether the red light will help as I have noticed that generally my seedlings pop up overnight, so what does that say? I will report back!

Must go, it has stopped raining and I have buddleia prunings to shred. Julie Davies

#### **Book Review**

#### After the Party by Cressida Connolly

It is 1938. Phyllis Forrester is newly returned from years abroad with her rather stuffy husband Hugh, 20 years her senior and a retired naval officer who has been working for a rubber company in South America. On their return, they and their children are forced to rely on the grand country house hospitality of her sisters, Nina and Patricia, while their new house is being built.

So – an upper middle class family saga begins to take shape .... but there is a twist.

Naïve and slightly vague, Phyllis joins in with her peers as they talk of their fears of another war looming and the desperate need to prevent this. They have lived through the carnage of one war. That is enough. Thus, she finds herself involved in "peace work" with her sisters and their husbands and their privileged social circle in the "British Union" under "The Leader" (or Tom to his inner circle) — drinks parties and jolly summer camps for the children are the order of the day. It is almost as if Phyllis becomes involved because she is quite simply at a loose end.

To Phyllis' alarm, she and Hugh are arrested and interned for she knows not what crime. Throughout her incarceration, initially in Holloway and then on the Isle of Man, she appears clueless as to why she is there and protests her innocence of any wrongdoing. She seems genuinely puzzled and unaware of the true nature of the "Union" and of its leader, whose name is only slowly revealed, although most readers will have cottoned on fairly swiftly that this is Mosley with his British Union of Fascists. To Phyllis he is just a great leader who could have prevented the second world war and restored England to its former glory. And it is implied throughout that the whole of their social circle was unaware of the true nature of the party. Further indignation is to come when Hugh is refused his naval pension and loses his job with the rubber company.

To rub salt in the wound it seems that their incarceration has been initiated by one of her sisters who happily shops them to save her own skin, although equally involved in the party.

Part of the narrative is set in 1979 with Phyllis widowed and settled on her own in a flat in the north of England, where she has little contact with her family and remains completely baffled by her life:

"We all have our crosses to bear, our own personal sorrows. Mine is that the people who should be dearest to me, my own children, my sisters, consider me a bad woman. The grandchildren have been taught to be wary. I think I'm a disgrace to them, really. After the war when the newsreel film was shown of what had gone on in Germany and Poland, those places, the horrors . . . It all got tangled up in their minds, as if we'd stood for such barbarism."






