

Letter from our future vicar Rev Angie Kateley

Well, hello! It's high time I introduce myself. My name is Angie Kateley and I am looking forward to joining you as your new vicar very soon. During June I will be moving to the vicarage in St Weonards, and then on Monday 1st July I will be licensed by Bishop Richard and installed by Archdeacon Derek as Priest-in-Charge of the St Weonards Benefice. After that, our adventures together begin! I will be joined by my dog Benji, and my adult daughter, Phoebe, will be around on and off.

I'm coming to you following a happy curacy with the team in the Abbeydore Deanery. It was there that I learnt to love the beautiful countryside and communities of these borderlands, with their hills, valleys and rivers, narrow winding lanes, every type of tractor and of course especially the wonderful people. My joy at being able to move just a little south and east to join you in your remarkably handsome benefice is resounding and abundant.

This will be my first time as a priest-in-charge, and I will be doing some learning as I go. She is very scathing of her husband and seems to be far superior to him in terms of intelligence and ability, she seems to handle him very well. She was the driving force, dealing with the day to day work on the farm and managing accounts along with dealing

with the emotion of losing children.

She's sympathetic to the local people and recognises that even though the convicts are sent there as thieves, they are indeed thieves themselves, stealing great tranches of land.

If times were different, you get the feeling that we would and should know the name Elizabeth MacArthur rather than her husband John.



Book Review

Maybe I Don't Belong Here; a Memoire of Race, Identity, Breakdown and Recovery by David Harewood



David Harewood, RADA graduate and esteemed actor, focusses his autobiography on the dislocation felt by black British people growing up and living in what he refers to as "the white space." I listened to this as an audio book, read by the author, and it was greatly enhanced by his acting skills and fluent reading.

The book charts his childhood in Birmingham, where his Barbadian parents had settled, and his love of school, where his performing interests were fostered and encouraged, with one teacher in particular changing the course of his life by suggesting to him that he might go to drama school and become an actor, something that simply had not occurred to him. But he proceeds to apply and receives an offer immediately from a very minor drama school, which, amazed and thrilled, he speedily accepts and cancels all his

other auditions, including one at RADA – he had no idea that this was the place to go! Fate deals him a lucky hand though, as it seems that RADA did not receive his cancellation, the audition goes ahead, and the rest is history.

But at age 23, after graduating, Harewood suffered a psychotic breakdown which he describes in harrowing detail, and he is sectioned to a psychiatric hospital. He believes that he can hear the voice of Martin Luther King urging him to pick up his mantle and serve the cause of racial equality. King's famous "I have a dream" speech was one that Harewood had performed at school, to great acclaim.

As one might sadly expect, Harewood endured racial abuse as a black child growing up in a street with predominantly white residents. There is the brick through the window and the elderly resident who told him to get "the **** out of my country", but his best friends are white, including those fellow RADA graduates who picked him up and sought help for him during his psychosis. On reaching young adulthood Harewood comes to realise the deep impact this early abuse had, and continues to have on him, particularly when he is out in the job market seeking acting roles. There were some stinging reviews – "Looked more like Mike Tyson than Romeo" – which sapped his self-confidence and increased his sense of not belonging.

Hospitalisation brought more stereotyping where his notes regularly refer to him as "a large black man" and where his drug regime reflected that view in doses of anti-psychotics and tranquilisers that were four times that recommended. "Were they afraid of me?" he asks upon reading back over his medical notes during his BBC TV programme Psychosis and Me many years later. "I'm absolutely convinced that had I been in America at the time of my breakdown, I'd most likely be dead," writes Harewood. "It took not one or two but six police officers to hold me down. One false move by me or any of them could have ended my life."

Harewood is convinced that his two episodes of psychosis were caused by the irreconcilable dislocation in his brain between being a British man and being black. Indeed, whilst in the grip of psychoses he believed himself to be two people. He is however aware of, but maybe places too little emphasis on, the role played by his cannabis usage, which had become habitual and is known to induce psychoses in susceptible individuals and to be especially toxic to young pliable brains.

This is in many ways a difficult book to read, full of the cruelties we inflict on those we see to be "other", but there are heartening aspects, notably his loyal friends from both sides of the racial divide who have stood by him. He is aware that there is much to be done and that the dark shadow of racism is very much still with us. The disproportionately high levels of mental health problems in Britain's black population remain, along with a much higher rate of the use of sections under the Mental Health Act. And he notes a frightening new aspect to that racism:

"The country's seemingly rising tide of populist nationalism reminds me of a time I've lived through before, only this time instead of people chasing me through gardens, they are writing newspaper columns and spewing division from social media, from radio shows and from parliamentary pews."

Garden Notes

There can be too much choice nowadays. Just like trying to decide which coffee I want in the coffee shop – when all I really want is a good strong Nescafe in my favourite mug – I can find it almost impossible to choose which seeds to grow from the many varieties on offer. Unable to decide on a variety of sweet pea and unwilling to leave the garden centre empty-handed, I opted for the bumper pack of six different varieties. The selection includes blue and white, two different mixed selections and the lovely old original variety *Lathyrus odoratus* 'Cupani' first introduced to the UK from Sicily in 1699. The dainty two-tone purple and magenta flowers might be small, but they make up for that with the most stunning scent. The sixth variety included in the pack is a dwarf selection called Bijou. Bijou only grows to 12", has no tendrils and needs no support so is fun to grow in clumps in the garden, in a container or even a hanging basket.



I haven't grown wallflowers for a few years because the mixed selection I grew last time turned out to be mostly yellow and a most unpleasant yellow at that. This year though I am sowing a single colour and I have chosen *Erysimum* 'Sugar Rush Purple' which I have grown before. Very different to the yellows, oranges and reds of traditional wallflowers, this has purple and magenta flowers which are larger than standard wallflowers, with a good old-fashioned scent. They look very good grown in a large drift.

Last autumn I collected seeds from the plants in the garden, dried them and packed them in small brown envelopes. Foolishly I forgot to label one of the envelopes and now I can't identify the seeds at all. They are so tiny I can barely see them, and it seems that when I sowed them in a tiny seed tray, I was rather too enthusiastic. It looks like I have 100% germination as the seed tray is completely crammed with seedlings – and I still have absolutely no idea what they are. Am I going to be thrilled to bits or bitterly disappointed when I finally identity them?

I have a special tool that I use to wage war on dandelions which I can plunge deep into the soil to remove the tap root. However, I have spared one enormous specimen because I am intrigued to see how it develops. The leaves are most definitely those of a dandelion, but the many stems are ridged and very sturdy with an abnormal number of flower buds (up to 20 on each stem). I am not sure that this is what is called fasciation (where a stem is malformed, usually flattened and as if several stems have fused together) as it looks perfectly well formed, just completely different to a normal dandelion. I have looked up all the other plants that it could be, but none match. I am intrigued to see what the flowers are like when they open and even more intrigued to see if I get 20 dandelion clocks on each stem. At that point of course I will swoop down on it with my special tool!
