

Vicar's Letter

My friends, as you read this I will already be living in your midst, having moved into the vicarage in June. I'm probably still surrounded by half-unpacked boxes and wondering where the tv remote and corkscrew are. Preparing for the move, my third in five years, I was dismayed at how much 'stuff' I had somehow acquired. We all have our consumerist weaknesses: mine are books, chairs, jigsaws and teaspoons (judge not, and all that).

I wonder if you too find yourself encumbered with 'stuff', either literal or metaphorical, perhaps both. Baggage that weighs you down or tethers you in some way. I sometimes find my creativity, even my capacity to simply breathe and be, is stifled by all that I carry around with me. Then it's all too easy to reach for the superficially easy fixes that only mask the problem. I will admit to an envy of those who have achieved some sort of minimalist Shangri-La.

The Bible encourages us to take our cares and worries to God, to entrust them to God. It's especially important if you are involved in carrying the troubles and burdens of others as well as your own. I sometimes forget, and it will be a nudge from something I read, or something said in conversation that will remind me to talk with God about what's weighing on my heart. It's not that God takes it all away, but there is something in the sharing of it with the One who is the source of love and light, something in the knowledge that I do not walk alone.

It's not always easy to pray, particularly if it's not something you're used to doing. I'm here to pray with you if ever you need, and there are many others who can do that too. God loves you and is always ready to listen.

Our human connectedness, too, is vital to our wellbeing. Inevitably, we all have 'stuff'. We can all be mindful of the unseen things that may be weighing heavily on those around us. Within community we can support one another, be it with the offer of a listening ear, perhaps a catch-up at the garden gate or over a cuppa at the kitchen table or be it with an offer of practical help like picking up shopping, an invitation to join in with an activity or being company at a difficult medical appointment. Rarely will any of us be able to remove somebody's troubles, but a little bit of kindness can go an awfully long way. Even something as simple as a smile can change the course of a day.

Now, where did I put that corkscrew...

Green Garway Book Group

Our book for June is John Lewis-Stempel's *The Running Hare: The Secret Life of Farmland*.

John Lewis-Stempel is a prolific nature writer and has paid homage to owls, sheep, oak trees and many more in his books. This book tracks his field called Flinders over a year, with particular focus on the hares and other residents calling Flinders home because of his natural approach to farming which introduces wild flowers and keeps out chemicals.

It's always great to have a connection with a book and it's really interesting to hear place names we know so well: St. Weonard's, Orcop and Wormelow are mentioned. His natural approach to the field has seen wildlife flood back and he compares Flinders to that of his "chemical brothers" neighbours and their dearth of variety of species.

I'm writing this before we've chatted about it at the group, but I found it a pleasant and informative read and a good example of Lewis-Stempel's writing. Rating 3.5/5



I write this on Thursday 6th June, as Europe and our allies commemorate the 80th Anniversary of the D day landings. It has set John and me reminiscing, as he was four years old, and I was three at the time. All I remember of those few years during and just after the war is my Mickey Mouse gas mask and playing shops up in the summer house of our garden with old ration books! My parents looked after five boys who were weekly boarders at the local grammar school which two of my brothers attended. All of us were given a small dish of butter (which was rationed), on Monday, which had to last till Friday! So I copied these big boys who smoothed their butter to fill the dish, then marked lines in it, five lines down to portion it for each day of the week., then three across, for the three meals of the day.....

Better get back to Tretire!

On June 2nd, St Mary's Tretire hosted the benefice service, which was led by Rev Nicol, who is the Bishop's Chaplain. Richard Mynors played the organ, and the singing was enhanced by the benefice choir, who brought the numbers up to 31., a very good number for our little church. LLANWARNE AND DISTRICT GROUP PARISH COUNCIL NEEDS YOU

Llanwarne & District Group Parish Council which comprises the parishes of Llanwarne, Pencoyd, Harewood, Llandinabo and Tretire with Michaelchurch, is looking for local people to join their team to help make a difference to the local community.

Why should I consider joining the Parish Council?

As a Parish Councillor you will represent the whole community and will become involved in providing a focus for the community to identify concerns and projects.

By joining the Parish Council can I help make the parish of Llanwarne & District a better place to live?

Yes – Parish Councillors can play a vital part in representing the interests of the communities they serve and improving the quality of life and the local environment.

How can the Parish Council make a real difference to the community of Llanwarne & District?

“ The Parish Council typically has sole or joint responsibility for the following issues:

- Drainage – of ditches and ponds
- Footpaths
- Highways – lighting, parking places, right to enter into discussions about new

roads and road widening, consent of parish council required for diversion or discontinuation of highway, traffic signs and other notices, tree planting and verge maintenance.

- Litter - provision of litterbins and support for any anti-litter campaigns.
- Planning – parish councils may be notified of any planning applications for the area
- Recreation – provision of recreation grounds, public walkways, open spaces, village greens and playing fields.
- Public Rights of Way – footpath and bridleway maintenance
- Signs – danger signs, place names and bus stops signs

What other ways can a Parish Councillor make a difference to the community?

As part of the Parish Council, Councillors may have responsibility for managing and maintaining public open spaces, and potentially much more. For instance

- Councillors also decide how much to raise through the precept in order to deliver the Council's services. For example, the Parish Council has set the precept at £11,000 which is the amount of money it expects to spend in 2024/25 in delivering its responsibilities.
- Councillors look to influence and shape the long-term development policy for the parish, and as part of the planning process, commenting on planning applications in the parish.
- Improving the quality of life and the environment in the local area through, in part, the Lengthsman who undertakes routine maintenance in the parish.
- Working to identify issues which are important to the lives of the residents you represent.
- Working to bring about improvements through local projects, lobbying other service providers and working in partnership with other Parishes, local authorities and agencies.

Do I need any particular skills and experience to join the Parish Council?

Absolutely not. The Parish Council needs people with a commitment to serving and representing the needs of the whole community. The Parish Council recognises that people from different backgrounds better represent the whole community and possess different enthusiasms, skills, attitudes and interests. Training is available to new Councillors.

How much time will I expected to spend on Parish Council business?

There are no hard and fast rules on this, but you will be expected to attend the meetings which take place every second month in Llanwarne Village Hall. It is appreciated some Councillors have busy lives but there will be opportunities to contribute towards the work of the Parish Council between meetings which has the potential to make the role even more rewarding.

What is the process for joining the Parish Council?

It is very straightforward. All you need to do is fill out a simple form and return it to the Clerk. The Parish Council will consider your application and all being well will appoint you at the next meeting through a process called co-option.

How long will I expected to serve on the Parish Council?

That is largely up to you. Parish Councils are subject to elections which take place every four years with the next due in 2027.

What if I need further information of the role before applying to join the Parish Council?

The Parish Council employs a Clerk who will be happy to provide any further information on the roles and responsibilities of Councillors. You can contact the clerk via email to

Book Review

The Wife, by Meg Wolitzer

Narrator and protagonist, 64-year-old Joan Castleman, is enroute to Finland with her husband Joe who is about to collect a literary prize: *"The moment I decided to leave him, the moment I thought, enough, we were thirty-five thousand feet above the ocean, hurtling forward but giving the illusion of stillness and tranquillity. Just like our marriage, I could have said."*

Wolitzer's novel dots back and forth between the present day and the start of her relationship with her husband, when she was college student to his lecturer. It provides an insight into the lives of women in the 1950s and 60s as they fight their way through a time of change, on the brink of "Women's Lib" – not quite free of the domestic ties that have held them back, but not yet truly allowed to soar. The stumbling block for her, within the literary world she inhabits, lies with the entrenched views of men:

"..... the men who own the world don't get to do that by being magnanimous and overly interested in other people. They get to do it by taking care of themselves along the way. They stoke the fire of their own reputations, and sometimes other people come by, asking: What's that you're doing there? Oh, stoking the fire of my reputation. Can I help? Certainly. Go get some wood."

But she acknowledges that women can be their own stumbling block: *"Everyone knows how women soldier on, how women dream up blueprints, recipes, ideas for a better world, and then sometimes lose them on the way to the crib in the middle of the night, on the way to the Stop & Shop, or the bath. They lose them on the way to greasing the path on which their husband and children will ride serenely through life."*

Joan's subservience to Joe, despite her intelligence and literary talent, is gradually revealed in the course of the novel, and is in a different league from most; and is fundamental and in some ways shocking.

"Everyone needs a wife; even wives need wives. Wives tend, they hover. Their ears are twin sensitive instruments, satellites picking up the slightest scrape of dissatisfaction. Wives bring broth, we bring paper clips, we bring ourselves and our pliant, warm bodies. We know just what to say to the men who for some reason have a great deal of trouble taking consistent care of themselves or anyone else. "Listen," we say. "Everything will be okay." And then, as if our lives depend on it, we make sure it is."

Thankfully, this is not an anti-men diatribe, but rather a systematic examination of what makes a marriage or a relationship; of the accommodations and adjustments that people make in order to preserve that central relationship of their lives.

It takes Joan over 60 years to fathom how this might work for her, concluding: *"Do not shrink yourself for anyone. Do not dim your light to make others feel comfortable."*

The novel was made into a film, which I have not seen. It is hard to imagine how the subtle and really rather clever text might properly be reproduced onscreen; but sadly only too easy to imagine how the events of the story might be dumbed down and over-dramatized to suit the medium. I think I will stick with this rather splendid book.

Garden Notes

The new greenhouse is finally complete and is filling up with tomato, pepper, aubergine and cucumber plants. Building a large (12'x7') greenhouse almost single-handed is not really to be recommended, but now that it is done, I am feeling suitably proud of myself. It wasn't without a couple of hiccups, but the very helpful James in the technical department of the greenhouse supplier gave me some useful hints when the very last pane of glass refused to fit (overlap it) and the door refused to slide open or shut (design fault – enlarge the fixing holes for the little wheels).



Fitting the very large sheets of glass was scary, especially on the roof, but I managed the installation fine. I had nearly finished, when feeling very tired and not thinking straight, I proceeded to walk straight through the one I had just fitted. In my defence it wasn't there two minutes earlier and was so immaculately clean I really couldn't see it. I didn't hurt myself as it is toughened glass, but the sudden sparkly and explosive shower of 2mm fragments of glass was spectacular. The resulting river of diamonds (I wish) stretched across a flower bed and an area of gravel and even reached the back door some 20 feet away. It was a laborious task clearing it up and I have no doubt I will be finding fragments for years to come. I ordered another sheet to be delivered overnight – and the courier broke that one too! The supplier sent another which arrived safely, and I installed it immediately before any more damage could be done and quickly moved all the staging in to protect the walls from clumsy gardeners.

Last year I filled the small octagonal greenhouse with pelargoniums. This year I want even more colour and I have opted for begonias – red, orange, pink, white, lemon; upright ones and trailing ones; large chunky double flowers and dainty flowers; green leaves and dark leaves. There is even a scented one – Begonia 'Fragrant Falls Lemon'. All fabulous. The sun could scorch the leaves, so I will be using shade netting inside the roof. A member of staff at the garden centre spotted my trolley full of begonias and asked if I knew of the hardy begonias – I didn't. He has several in his garden which survive the winter and even self-seed. The most common hardy ones in the UK are all various forms of *Begonia grandis*, particularly *Begonia grandis* subsp. *evansiana*. *There are others available which are border-line hardy and would need mulching to survive the winter.*



By the time my 'not-a-dandelion' plant (see last month) had reached three feet tall, it was so obviously not a dandelion that I asked a friend to identify it with a clever app that she has on her phone. It turned out to be hawk's-beard but I'm not sure which one – smooth, rough, northern, beaked? A thought : why are there several wild flowers with 'hawk' in the name – hawkbit, hawkweed, hawk's-beard? **Julie Davies**

Wildlife in our Garden

In early May, we stopped putting out seeds in seed feeders or on the wall. There should be enough other food available now in the wild for our seed eating birds. It gives us a chance to thoroughly clean the feeders and put them away for the summer. However, if we want to see birds, we have to go for walks round the garden. Actually, in summer we are more likely to know what birds are about by listening to their songs. Many years ago we managed to gain a rudimentary but useful knowledge of garden birdsong by listening over and over again to some tapes we'd picked up in one of the RSPB shops. This has stood us in very good stead for all the years since, but because we can now only play discs, which you can't rewind when it suits you, our knowledge has never increased beyond that rudimentary stage, for which reason we mourn the passing of the humble audio tape.

We have welcomed the songs of some of our summer visitors, especially warblers. Early on was the chiff-chaff, then the black-cap. Sadly, we never hear the wistful song of the willow warbler anymore. Nor have we seen any spotted fly-catchers for the last two years.



I am very worried about swallows. This year I walked down to the farm towards the end of April, and they still had not arrived. But then, I thought, there has been a cold north wind blowing for over a week. Perhaps they somehow know about our weather, so have delayed their departure from southern Africa? More likely they got as far as Spain; then they would feel the wind from the north, and that would put them off from flying further until they felt that conditions were right. On May 6th the weather had turned warm with a southerly wind, so I went down to the farm again. This time there were swallows, but only three. As well as ranging up and down the field opposite the farm, they occasionally flew through a gap above a door into a barn, exactly where they did last year. On 11th May I looked again, hoping more swallows would have arrived, especially with the warm weather. Still I could only count three, though I waited around watching the skies for ten to fifteen minutes. On 30th May there were still only three. Looking back to articles I wrote in the last three years, I see numbers were similarly low: in 2022 I saw “a small handful”, in 2023 also three. When we came here 20 years ago, there were dozens; they even nested in our garage. Since then, we have witnessed a steady decline. It seems this family is hanging on, but only by the tips of its wings.

On a more positive note, the song-thrushes have been very vocal in our garden this last week. Sometimes it seems like just one, down by the stream. At other times it sounds as though there are two. I am still not sure, but given their ability to ventriloquise, I would not be surprised if the double effect was being produced by one. His song has been getting stronger and his repertoire more varied. A moorhen has been spotted on the stream a few times. Since 26th May we have spotted a red kite soaring overhead several times.

I had not seen toads in the garden for some years, but was delighted to discover a big one under the wheely-bin on the 26th May. We need them to keep down the slugs which have done much damage to vegetable seedlings and young plants this year. I wish there were more toads. When we came to Tretire 20 years ago, there seemed to be a toad, and often a newt too, under every stone I turned!

Saint of the Month

Saints remembered in July include St Anne, the mother of the Virgin Mary, who is the patron saint of grandmothers. We also remember St Benedict, who funded the Benedictine order, and John Neumann, the

only male US citizen to be named a saint. But the two important saints to be honoured this month are St Thomas on 3rd and Mary Magdalene on 22nd.

St Thomas was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus according to the New Testament. He is commonly known as "Doubting Thomas" because John's gospel relates how Thomas initially doubted the resurrection of Jesus Christ; he later confessed his faith when he saw the wounds left over from the crucifixion. According to tradition he subsequently founded churches in a wide area stretching eastwards from Palestine to India, and ended his days in the town now called Mylapore, near Madras. If you go to Kerala today you will find a church called the Ma Thomas church, which was certainly there long before European missionaries reached India. When I worked as a missionary in Iran, there was a plaque in Chinese in our church which had been placed there by Chinese Christians who were converted to Christianity by missionaries sent out from the church in Iran founded by St Thomas. So you could say that St Thomas was responsible for converting a much larger part of the world than St Paul.

There are many legends about Mary Magdalene; in fact, Mary Magdalene is probably most well-known for the false details and unproven facts in her life. She is often identified as a former prostitute, but there is nothing in the Bible to support this rumour. People also identify her with the sinful woman from the city who anointed Jesus' feet with ointment, but again there are no hints in the Bible to tell us who that woman was, so there is no reason to believe that it was Mary Magdalene. At other times she has been confused with Mary of Bethany, Martha's sister, but they were actually two quite different people. We really know very little of Mary Magdalene's life from the Bible, except that she is included in a list of women who provided for Jesus and the disciples from their own supplies, and that she was freed from seven demons, although it is not clear exactly what kind of bondage she was freed from. But the most important moment of her life was probably when she was the first person to see Jesus after the resurrection, which you can see depicted in the painting by Graham Sutherland on the altar of the chapel dedicated to her in Chichester Cathedral.
