

Vicar's Letter

"Not yesterday I learned to know The love of bare November days"

(from 'My November Guest' by Robert Frost)

Darling November is for me the most reflective of months, a time for remembering and pondering, before the exuberant jolly jamboree of December. The winter unknown lies ahead, the year of memories stretches out behind. An eventide season characterised by a sweet, gentle melancholy. Our culture embraces November with various remembrances. All Souls church services afford us the opportunity to remember, in calm candlelit stillness, our loved ones who are now out of eye's sight and hand's holding. Hot on its heels comes Bonfire Night, with its whizzes and bangs, commemorating something I'm never quite comfortable with. And then the national call goes up to remember with silent dignity those whose lives are lost in the military's quest for peace.

Moments of quiet stillness, intentional points of contemplation, prayer and meditation, are a blessing in my life that I all too often forgo in the hubbub and busyness. Words and sounds are everywhere, all the time. If I steal such a moment in my solitude, I often sense that God draws nearer, and I am not alone. In a quite different way, there is something heavenly about being together with others in calm reflective quietness. I love Taizé worship and group mindfulness meditations for that reason. It is my hope to start introducing more intentional silence into some of our church services (and not just the kind of silence that comes when I momentarily forget what I'm meant to be doing).

In Garway church in December we will have a Blue Christmas gathering especially for those who find that time of year particularly sad – more on that in next month's edition.

I hope that November will afford you some gentle, still moments to reflect and ponder, either companionably or in quiet solitude. I pray that if you are remembering a lost loved one, the silence is kind and not harsh.

Green Garway Book Group Grey Bees by Andrey Kurkov

Written in 2018, *Grey Bees* is a rich and beautifully told tale of a beekeeper struggling to survive in the noman's land strip between Russia and Ukraine, also known as the grey zone. His village has no electricity and is deserted apart from his old school frenemy. This moving story draws you into the tale of these two men living ordinary lives in an extraordinary situation.

Every year the beekeeper takes his bees away for the summer in search of pollen and his journey into Crimea creates an added layer of tension in his dealings with Russian officials. His bees are his family and as well as making an income from their honey they also create hope and purpose to his simple and quite lonely life. The contrasting vibrant landscapes and encounters with new friends are touching, a welcome relief from unimaginable life in a war zone.

Whilst the subject matter may not obviously appeal, the quiet and detailed descriptions make for a surprisingly engaging read, made all the more potent by the knowledge of what has happened since between the two countries.

Wildlife in our Garden

I cannot remember a quieter month in all the time I have been writing these articles.

September: the garden should be buzzing with insect life, dragon flies, comma butterflies, red admirals, bees of all kinds – there are the usual numbers of flowers for them. All I have been seeing are a very occasional dragon fly and some rather disconsolate-looking bumble bees. Most of the insects I see have come inside, presumably to get out of the rain. But there were not many in the garden last week, even when the sun did come out for a few days.

We have not been seeing many birds either, but this can be accounted for by us not having yet put out any seed or nut feeders. I intend to start doing so when we get back from a short Scilly Island break next week.

Meanwhile, I thought I might just mention some of the creatures that find their way into the house. We seem to have a plague of spiders for most of the year; these are the ones with very long, thin legs and quite small body-parts, though I think they are called "long-bodied cellar spiders" (not "harvestmen" with round bodies which are mostly found outdoors and are not true spiders at all). The ones I am referring to are found almost exclusively indoors, where they make very untidy webs and lurk, very still, in any relatively quiet corner. To me, their long legs give them a particularly sinister look. Actually, they are voracious predators. They love eating woodlice, which they suck dry, then make a heap of discarded, hollowed-out woodlouse shells underneath their webs. They also seem to be cannibals; I often find the remains of a dried up similar shaped spider nearby.

There are other indoor spiders of course, the most noticeable being the big black ones which live in holes and come out at night, sometimes moving at an alarming rate across the carpet!

There are many sorts of beetle, including ladybirds, which we all know well. More recently I notice there are typically beetle-shaped, black beetles. I think these are refugees from the wet weather, as they appear inside the back door and hide around the doormat.

Other refugees are mice. Margaret found one large one in the spare bedroom the other day, but we have not seen or heard it since, nor have we been able to catch it in a trap. I do not think we can have a family of house mice, as they are usually quite easy to catch. Maybe it has just gone outside again – in spite of the rain.

Book Review

Spare by Prince Harry

Having no royalist leanings, I had no plans to read this book – and then it came up on my audio book list and I decided to keep an open mind and give it a go. It is read by the author.

What a very sad book. Sad because this young man is so deeply unhappy, and also because of the light shed on the seriously abnormal lives of those born into royalty. All to be expected – but the degree of both is shocking.

Clearly there is a need to recognize that this book was written (or in fact ghost-written) by someone with a message to plug and several axes to grind. But those axes do seem to have some substance.

For a long time, Harry appears to have held on to the belief that his mother had not died, but had staged her oft-desired disappearance and would return at some point – a not unreasonable hope for a 12-year-old, but somewhat disturbing several years later.

The emotional black hole that is the royal family, as described in the book, would attract the interest of Social Services if this were any other family. The absence of affection and of physical contact is seriously pathological. What chance do any of them have of growing up as normal human beings?

Central to the narrative is Harry's total hatred of the "paps" – and this does not seem to be simply because he blames them for his mother's death, but because of his experience of their unrelenting stalking of the family and their complete absence of respect for truth or the well-being of their targets. Getting back at the press appears to be an obsession with him, but one that is entirely understandable if all he relates is true. And one that leaves little hope for any future normality in his life. He is not going to let this go.

Particularly chilling is the relationship he describes between the royal family and the press — a Faustian pact where behind-the-scenes deals are done to appease the voracious reporters. Image is the lifeblood the family — it is a matter of survival. Controlling that image demands the cooperation of the press, whose power is all-encompassing. They know that the royal family (and others whom they target) cannot spend their whole time/energy/resources suing them, so calculate that they will get away with most of their excesses.

What a strange being is the Great British Public to harbour this vast insatiable appetite for royal gossip. Utterly bizarre.

Security looms large throughout. It was the final straw that sent Harry and his wife and family across the water for what he sees as their basic safety. Keeping the royals safe is a costly business, for which we all foot the bill. They truly are sitting ducks for any terrorist or mentally ill person every time they appear in public. I think I would stay indoors! In this book, Harry is open about his army career and the people he killed during his time in Afghanistan - all apparently legitimate targets under international law and fired on with the backing of the hierarchy – but all making him a particular target for terrorists.

The bitterness continues unabated right to the end of the book. He is angry about the press, about his family, about living in a goldfish bowl, about his upbringing, about what he sees as his family's indifference to his safety and about their (in his eyes) betrayal. We will never know the whole truth and will never hear both sides of the story in full, but it certainly felt a sad read and deeply disturbing that this ingrained family psychopathology is perpetuated in the name of our political stability.

Garden Notes

Well, here we are back from our week in Somerset and finally our tomatoes and peppers are ripening in the greenhouse. The tomatoes might be lovely little orbs of redness, but goodness are they tart this year! After their drastic pruning last winter, the two old apple trees have produced a bumper crop. That can't be said of my pear arches though. I am always very proud of them due to the huge number of pears they produce. This year however, I don't know whether I pruned them incorrectly or whether I can blame the weather, but I have only five pears from the six trees – and just now in early October they show no sign of ripening.



Whilst in Somerset, we visited Hestercombe Gardens near Taunton. I have wanted to visit these for years, mainly to see the Grade 1 listed formal garden, considered to be the finest surviving example of a garden designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens and planted by Gertrude Jekyll. However, although I admired Lutyens' overall plan and particularly loved his beautiful 'Wrennaissance' orangery, I was decidedly underwhelmed by the planting. I think that the planting scheme adheres to the original plan as far as possible but generally everything looked

messy and uncared for. The pergola was overgrown and was the one aspect of Lutyens' design that I disliked. The stone columns are alternately square or round, as if he really couldn't decide which looked best and the whole 225 ft. long structure, which runs along the south side of the Great Plat, blocks out the most glorious view of Somerset countryside.

Perhaps the planting of the Great Plat looks better earlier in the summer when the roses, delphiniums, peonies and lilies are in flower, but in mid-September the overall scheme is dominated by wide bands of

Bergenia x schmidtii which edge the geometric beds. I always think of Bergenia as a plant you would only really use when you are truly desperate for something to grow in the most unforgiving corner of the garden — a tough plant for tough places. Apparently, they were Gertrude Jekyll's favourite plant — she admired their 'fine solid foliage', 'their grave and monumental look' and the way they took on 'a splendid winter colouring of warm red bronze'. Her own grave is planted with Bergenias. To me they seem an odd choice for a location such as the Great Plat and in such large quantities too.



I enjoyed the 18th century 16 acre landscape garden far more. This part was designed by Coplestone Warre Bampfylde (how's that for name?) and is situated in a lovely, wooded valley. It has a dramatic cascade waterfall, ponds (with ducks), various garden follies – the Chinese Seat, the Rustic Seat (a useful place to leave tired husbands and little dogs whilst continuing to explore alone), Gothic Alcove, Temple Arbour, Witch House and Mausoleum. I was interested to note that this was also where all the garden visitors were and that not a soul was in the Formal Garden. Perhaps a reflection of our current love of wilder, more natural places. It was certainly an enjoyable place to wander in for an hour or so.






