Vicar's Letter

During a recent Q&A session with the younger classes at Garway Primary School, I was asked some insightful questions by the children. One of those questions has stayed with me: Have you ever seen God?

Probably the most truthful answer is that I don't know. What does God look like? Who knows! Some people – including me – have been heard to say that we see God in the face of every human being, or that we see God in the wonder of nature and scientific discovery. Probably both of those things hold a good amount of truth. One thing I do feel confident to say is that God is the author of love. So perhaps there is a comparison to be made with the wind. We don't see the wind, but we see what it does. When we witness or experience or practice compassion, kindness, forgiveness, grace, generosity, warmth, companionship, inclusion, justice, peace – all in their truest sense – then perhaps we see God.

With that in mind, let's embrace the wonder that is March. Nature starts to awaken – and so do we – from the Big Gloom of winter. We listen out for the beginnings of the dawn chorus. And it's time for the hard work of the big Spring Clean in our homes and gardens.

Easter is late this year so Lent starts in March. I've heard Lent described as an opportunity for an internal spring clean. Whether or not you are someone who does the whole 'giving something up or taking something up' thing in Lent, whether you're cleaning up your soul, your social media feeds or your fridge, I would like to offer a challenge.

In February, church met in the snug at the Garway Moon where we discussed and prayed for peace for the world, leaning into the wisdom and prayers of many different traditions and religions, all united in a strong desire for peace. Maybe what the world needs from everybody now it to make peace our higher intention. So my challenge is this: throughout Lent, whatever words you use, whatever actions you take up or resist, let them be for the purpose of peace.

The annual Borderlines Film Festival will be coming to Garway Hall again this year giving us a chance to see films which rarely make it to multiplexes.



FRIDAY 28th February – MY FAVOURITE CAKE. This Iranian film tells the story of Mahin, an elderly woman who decides that she want to find romance again. She changes her routine

in order to seek out a companionable man and finds Faramarz who has got into trouble with the regime by playing a musical instrument in a wedding band. Mahin offers to bake him her favourite cake and this intimate moment provokes a profound outpouring of everything they feel and have in common. A wonderful, brave film which led to the film makers' offices being raided by the Iranian authorities for its (gentle) assertion of things like the right not to wear the hijab; it is a privilege to show it.

TUESDAY March 4th – HOW TO MAKE MILLIONS BEFORE GRANDMA DIES. This film from Thailand broke box-office records in several countries across Asia in 2024. Amah is a prickly grandmother with grown-up children who mostly ignore her. When she is diagnosed with cancer they vie for position in order to inherit her house. Inspired, if that's the right word, by a cousin who looked after their wealthy paternal grandfather before he died and inherited his millions, Amah's grandson, M, decides to move in with her as her carer to give himself pole position in the inheritance wars. Unsentimental, spiky Amah is wary of his motives but, eventually both find themselves developing a bond beyond expectations. The film belies its overly comic title – it's a real tear-jerker which contains an amazing first film performance from 78 year old Usha Seankhum and was nominated for an international feature film Oscar.

TUESDAY MARCH 11TH 7.30pm GARWAY HALL £5.00 ASTEROID CITY

Set in a blazingly bright candy-coloured 1950s desert town famous for its enormous meteorite crater, Asteroid City is director Wes Anderson's first foray into sci-fi — although this is a laugh aloud send-up of films like Close Encounters and the 1953 classic, It Came from Outer Space. We're asked to witness the making of a play about an astronomy convention for Junior Stargazers, all brought to the location by their hopeless parents. They are staying in a retro-futuristic motel in which you can buy almost anything, including land, from a vending machine, with mushroom clouds erupting in the background with nonchalant regularity. The space cadets and their adults orbit one another with a perplexing degree of emotional cluelessness.

The arrival of a rather endearing alien, played by Jeff Goldblum, means the convention is put into military lock-down in order to study this invasion from another world. Under all the Kodak coloured comic slapstick is a coming- of- age drama which touches on the nature of grief and the need for love and, like the clear sky above Asteroid City, the film is chock full of stars: Tom Hanks, Scarlett Johanssen, Tilda Swinton, Margot Robbie, Adrian Brody, Willem Dafoe, Steve Carrell and, would you believe, Jarvis Cocker as a singing cowboy.

It is a long time since Orcop News was dominated by condolences, but sadly, there are a number of deaths to report this month, perhaps due in part to the unremitting February gloom and damp.

We extend sincere condolences to the friends and families of Bob Leeson, Andrew Lewis and Andy Hoare. Bob was a former soldier, accomplished mechanic and distinguished bell-ringer and his wife, Barbara was for many years our Orcop organist and a senior figure in the Royal British Legion..

Andrew was a very active member of the St. Weonards congregation, and his memorial service is to be held in St. Weonards Church on 22nd February.

Andy Hoare, also a former soldier, was a skilled bugler, who played at the Orcop British Legion Act of Remembrance in November 2024 from his wheelchair. This was one of four performances on that day, sadly the last time his bugle was heard.

Whilst I was in the church recently, I had the opportunity to welcome visitors from London, who knew Francis Horovitz as a young woman in East London and had come to visit her final resting place. It is good to know that, 40 years after her death, her memory lives on in Orcop.

CPRE (Campaign for Protection of Rural England) is conducting periodic training sessions for "Citizen Science Volunteers" in the porch of our church, in the sampling and testing of the waters of the tributaries of the River Wye. Afterwards, the trainees are all given a guided tour of the church, where they find much history and inspiration. The signature of Winston Spencer Churchill seems to hold a particular fascination.

Dydd Gwyl Dewi Hapus!

As this is the March issue, and St. David's Day is the first of March, it is appropriate for us to join our near western neighbours in its celebration.

Dewi Sant (St. David) is the only one of the UK's patron saints to have been born in his homeland. He died on 1st March 589 CE. Allegedly, he was born on a clifftop on the coast of Pembrokeshire during a storm. The elements celebrated his birth by delivering a bolt of lightning that split an enormous boulder in two. There is a holy well near his birthplace that is believed to have curative powers and remains a site of pilgrimage to this day.

He went on to establish a monastery at Glyn Rhosyn (now St. Davids) in Pembrokeshire, where the monks practised extreme self-discipline. David himself was an abstemious vegan who ate only leeks and drank only water. He enjoyed reading from scripture whilst submerged up to his neck in a freezing lake. I cannot avoid the rather irreverent thought that this is second only to lying naked in a bed of nettles on a freezing night whilst reading the Book of Job, as related by the late Peter Cook in his E.L. Wisty monologue about spinach.

He is reported to have performed miracles, including restoring a blind man's sight and bringing a dead boy back to life by splashing tears on his face. His missionary travels included the founding of a second monastery at Glastonbury and even took him to Jerusalem, whence he brought back a stone which is kept at St. Davids.

His deathbed words were famously uplifting: "Be joyful, keep the faith, and do the little things that you have seen me do". "Gwnewch y pethau bychain mewn bywyd" (do the little things in life) remains an important part of his heritage in Wales today.

So we should all be wearing a daffodil and brandishing a leek on March 1st!

Book Review

You Are Here by David Nicholls

Author David Nicholls is best known for his love story *One Day* which charts a romance through the vehicle of twenty years of St Swithin's Days and is famous as a hit Netflix film. His latest novel, *You Are Here*, also a romance, is centred around a hike in the Lake District, with each chapter named after a section of the route.

Central character Michael, a 42-year-old geography teacher from York, is embarking on the cross-country walk in the aftermath of the breakdown of his marriage and the trauma of an attack in the street by thugs, which has left him emotionally fragile and on a gradual return from sick leave. He is painted as a pleasant but colourless character, unlikely to set the world on fire, but a man of genuine kindness and a good teacher who regards his pupils with tolerant affection. His fellow teacher and friend Cleo decides to join him on the walk and organises a small party to accompany him for the first few days: Marnie, a copy editor from London, Conrad, a pharmacist, and her teenage son. Two other potential walkers drop out before the start, thwarting Cleo's match-making plans.

Michael goes along with this with some reluctance, sensing some behind-the-scenes machinations in the mix, but his love of the wide-open spaces and his delight in expounding on the geographical features along the way see him capitulating to the arrangement.

Marnie too is smarting from a failed marriage, having reached the point where she feels that "Three days of walking with strangers was the kind of potentially awful experience she needed" "Sometimes, she thought, it's easier to remain lonely than present the lonely person to the world, but she knew that this, too, was a trap, that unless she did something, the state might become permanent, like a stain soaking into wood. It was no good. She would have to go outside."

Cleo's planned pairings did not include a Michael/Marnie link-up, but fate decrees that these two finish up as the only two walkers for the last few days of the trip. They tiptoe around each other, sharing both humour and sadness, slowly revealing their true personalities and opening chinks of light onto their pasts. Neither seems particularly enamoured of the other, and they jog along in an almost matey fashion. Predictably the emergence of something closer is fraught with misunderstandings and a reluctance by both to acknowledge the inevitable.

What keeps this novel from the fate of pure cheesiness are the witty asides on life and people – the city slickers, the caricatures of new walkers with their unbroken-in shiny boots and plastic map pockets, the fusty landladies in the B&Bs who push postcards under the doors of bedrooms to deter overnight visitors, and pubs where "real-ale drinkers snored and farted." And the gentle unfolding of the backstories of the central characters is well-handled.

In the end, this tale is about not sinking into mediocrity and letting life pass you by.

"You know that thing when you're watching a film that you're not really enjoying and the other person doesn't like it either, but you've paid for the rental, you're halfway through, you sort of want to know what happens and, besides, there's nothing else on. But really, you're just waiting for someone to say, "Can we stop this? I hate it." Some people sit like that for their whole lives together. Waiting for it to pick up, waiting for a good bit."

Garden Notes

It is decision time. Several shrubs are no longer looking their best and I need to decide their fate. I have three stunning broom plants, one red (*Cytisus* 'Déwy'), one rust coloured and one a glorious apricot ('Apricot Gem'). They all put on a spectacular show in April and May, but each one of them is now leaning at 45° and smothering the adjacent plants. Broom are very shallow rooted, and with the ground being so wet this winter they have all lifted out of the ground and keeled over. I will be sad to see them go but will allow them to flower one last time before doing the dastardly deed. Broom are not expensive to buy and are fast-growing so I will happily buy more even though I know that they will inevitably suffer the same fate.

The Mexican orange blossom (*Choisya ternata*) also needs attention. It too has keeled over. There is a bit of theme going on here, but I don't think there is anything wrong with my planting technique. I don't know whether it has suffered the ravages of winter (snow, rain etc. weighing the branches down) or whether a certain flagpole might be involved ('Well, I might have just rested it on there temporarily'), but the main branches have split at the base and the only solution is to cut the whole shrub back to a stump. I can't do this with the broom as they won't grow from old wood, but I am confident that the Choisya will sprout again quite happily. With its beautiful glossy green leaves and scented flowers, it is a shrub I would always want in my garden.



It is always fun to sow a few annuals, and I have the ideal patch in front of the large greenhouse where I can experiment a bit. This year I will try various annual grasses in addition to the *Panicum* 'Frosted Explosion' that I grew two years ago. Perhaps some bunny tails – *Lagurus ovatus*, some quaking grass - *Briza media (or minor or maxima)* or some foxtail barley – *Hordeum jubatum*. I spotted a photograph of the perennial grass *Panicum virgatum* intermingled with Zinnias in mixed colours and it was so effective that I could try to achieve a similar effect with annual grasses. I remember growing some scarlet flax (*Linum grandiflorum*) in the first garden I ever had and being thrilled with its beautiful silky red flowers. I think this might look good with the grasses and the drooping green bells of *Nicotiana langsdorffii*, which is now such a firm favourite of mine. And if it is doesn't work, there is always next year.




