Vicar's Letter

*'When we see a beautiful object, a beautiful garden, or a beautiful flower,
let us think that there we behold a ray of the infinite beauty of God'*

- St. Alphonsus Maria de Liguori

Spring is the season of hope and of promise. Seeds, bulbs and buds all contain such exquisite possibility. Pretty spring flowers splash colour over our gardens and hedgerows, almost anywhere where there is a bit of soil.

"All the flowers of the tomorrows are in the seeds of today." — Indian Proverb

There is much to be gained from time spent in the contemplation of flowers. To meditate on the intricacies of a single bloom or spray is a practice well worth pursuing (dear little forget-me-nots are my favourite for this). All flowers have humble beginnings. We can learn from them about tenacity, about pushing on through the dark patches in search of light, about being comfortable in our own skin, about nurturing, about vulnerability not as a weakness but as a strength, about the nature of God.

A jar of daffodils in Hentland's vestry smilingly invited me into a tender moment alone with God in preparation for leading worship. During the solemn season of Lent many churches remove flowers. Which means chocolate is not the only thing I'm looking forward to on Easter Sunday morning!

I wish you all a wonderful Easter when it comes: chocolate, flowers, fluffy bunnies, the lot. And I pray for you to have the opportunities to gaze and to wonder.

St Weonards Church was privileged to hold the memorial service for Andrew Lewis. This was a joyful, yet poignant celebration. Wonderful tributes from his family reminded us of his life and his many, many activities supporting his family and community events. In addition to the packed church of more than 300, it would have been hard to seat another person, more than 70 joined the celebration from the village hall where the service was live streamed.

To mark the beginning of Lent, Rev Angie led us in the short quiet contemplative service of compline. Doing a little research into the origins of this service, it was fascinating to see that it was first mentioned as part of the daily round of monastic prayers in about 375 AD! It derives its name from a Latin word meaning 'completion' (*completorium*). It is above all a service of quietness and reflection before rest at the end of the day. This service is also being held at our other parishes throughout Lent.

In early March we were pleased to welcome the Burton family for the baptism of their young daughters Grace and Olive. This was a joyful occasion. Rev Angie used the parable of the Lost Sheep to remind us of God's love for each person. The reading of the story was enhanced by Derick Hill vividly playing the part of the shepherd, and his 'lost sheep' *Baarbara* brought it all to life!

On Sunday 6th April at 10.00am, St Weonards holds the monthly benefice communion. This is the only service that day and it gives us the opportunity to meet members of our other parishes.

As part of the preparation for Easter, the Palm Sunday Walk is being revived. Do come and join us for all or part of this. On Sunday 13th April we start from Broad Oak and walk to Garway Church stopping en route to share worship at Broad Oak Methodist Chapel and Garway Baptist Church. The Baptist Chapel have generously offered to provide refreshments at the end.

Please see the rota of services in the middle of the magazine for other ways in which to take part in Lenten preparation, leading to our Easter Day communion 9.30am.

At the APCM I will stand down as Churchwarden. I would like to take the opportunity of thanking my co-warden Anna Lewis, the PCC, and all those who have supported me in this role.

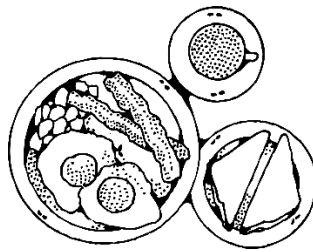

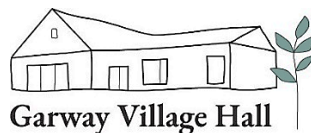

Peace for Evermore

Peace for Evermore is a journey through two diaries - one from the First World War, the other from the Second World War. They were written in the form of letters by Tim Bannerman's grandfather and father to their spouses, Tim's grandmother and mother. Each has a distinctive character and style as befits their differing eras and the individual qualities of the writers. Despite the odds, each author survived the traumas of war, and with them, their diaries. Tim takes us through them, including other relevant writings and recollections, beginning and ending with a local Herefordshire connection.

Tim lives in Orcop with his wife, Gill, and they make variously successful cider and perry from the orchard they planted on arrival back in 2012.

SMALL THINGS LIKE THESE**

"If you want to get on in this world, there are things you have to ignore". That is the advice, given by his wife, to Bill Furlong, a coal-merchant living with a boisterous gaggle of daughters in a small Irish town in the 1980s. And that advice gets to the heart of this quiet, understated film, based on the wonderful novella by Clare Keegan.

The Catholic church looms large over the town, both physically and emotionally. The chilling Mother Superior, played by Emily Watson, preaches compassion and mercy and yet has a heart of cold stone. Bill, who has been brought up carrying his own kind of shame and guilt, discovers that the convent is running a Magdalene laundry, one of the cruel institutions which were set up by the church and the Irish state. Like other such laundries across Ireland, this convent is taking in young "fallen" women, imprisoning them and abusing them mercilessly in the name of holiness.

The town is full of sealed lips; unspoken things are allowed because the church is all powerful. But Bill is a man of conscience and, ultimately, he must speak out – Furlong, the quietest of men who rarely says a word.

You will see some brilliant acting here from Cillian Murphy who plays the coal-merchant. He does it with almost wordless skill. It's a film about how good people let bad things happen. And it's one which packs a

Uganda Visit

Thank you for all the supplies which we were kindly given to take to Fountain of Peace Children's Home in Kyenjojo in Uganda. They have all been given for use in the houses and their nursery and primary school.

FOP is a very happy and special place, providing a permanent home for abandoned babies. The children live in family houses of about nine, each with a mother and nanny. The babies stay in one large house and the toddlers live in another.

The children are wonderful - happy, settled, confident, full of life and thriving. They are very polite in the Ugandan way. The babies are beautiful. Another new baby had been rescued a week before we arrived, the change in him each day was surprisingly rapid. He filled out and lost his startled look. He will now have a bright future with stimulation, education and opportunities.

The staff are amazing and cope with very basic cooking and washing facilities to give the children stability and lots of care and love. Lots of fun and laughter too.

We were busy for a fortnight painting and decorating the nursery classrooms, putting up gutters, planting flower and vegetable gardens and Evie taught some mothers and nannies to sew using the treadle sewing machines which Neil repaired. They learnt to make patchwork quilts and school uniforms and loved it.

We were very sad to leave FOP, but had a fantastic experience on safari in Murchison Falls National Park. Uganda is a beautiful verdant country with red, dusty, productive soil. There is a huge amount of deep poverty but no shortage of food. Subsistence farmers grow bananas, coffee, cassava, sweet potatoes, millet, maize, chickens and goats on small plots to eat and sell. We saw several large-scale tea and sugar cane plantations too. There are many reminders of the colonial past and much Chinese investment, particularly in the roads and infrastructure. It is an interesting time in Ugandan history to visit.

Thank you for all your contributions, they really will make a big difference to the quality of life of the children at FOP.

Book Review

***A Perfect Explanation* by Eleanor Anstruther**

Author Eleanor Anstruther is a descendant of the dukes of Argyll, and granddaughter to Enid Campbell. For her debut novel, she sets out to trace the story of Enid's marriage to Douglas Anstruther during the interwar years. She fleshes out the bare bones of diaries, court and medical records to weave a fascinating semi-fictional account of this dysfunctional upper-class family. We see her as a downtrodden daughter to the overbearing Sybil, sister to Joan (a feisty lesbian) and mother to three children, Fagus, Finneta and Ian.

Enid's marriage is an act of rebellion that condemns her to the life of a society wife, and even more problematical, a mother. Her first child Fagus is born with hydrocephalus, and Enid is at a complete loss as to how to care for him in the context of the oppressive silence that prevails around his disability. In early childhood he falls down the stairs while on her watch and becomes both more seriously disabled and blind. Enid simply does not have the emotional resources to cope with either motherhood or marriage. She watches with envy and puzzlement as her sister Joan enjoys her cocktail-swigging life with her partner Pat, free of the obligation to produce a healthy heir.

Woven throughout the novel is the influence of the Christian Science movement, to which she had been attracted before her marriage and to which she escapes when the pressures of family life overwhelm her. And she sinks into what we would now describe as post-natal depression – so sensitively described in this book.

Anstruther's debut novel centres on a shocking truth from her family history: Enid sold her younger son Ian to her sister for £500, following Enid's divorce and bitter custody battle.

The novel volleys between the 1920s and 1964, with Enid in a Hampstead nursing home before a prospective family reunion with her daughter and Ian, whom she hasn't seen since she gave him up 25 years earlier. Here she ponders a "perfect explanation" for her life choices, some of which were outside her control.

Garden Notes

It is wonderful to be out in the garden again enjoying the sunshine and getting some jobs done. The hydrangeas have been dead headed, the roses pruned, dead stems of perennials cut down and the dead fern fronds removed. It doesn't take more than a few minutes in the garden before my spirits are lifted; there are no dismal news broadcasts, the birds are singing, the sun has some warmth in it, I am surrounded by dainty primroses and all's well with the world – well, my small world anyway.

Trimming the hydrangeas is one of the most satisfying jobs at this time of year. There are the varieties such as the mopheads which just require the old flower head to be snipped off right next to some lovely plump leaf buds, and the varieties like the paniculatas where you can go a bit crazy and cut off as much as you like. The more you cut off, the larger the flowers will be. If you only trim off a little, there will be more flowers, but they will be smaller. I like large flowers so cut mine down quite drastically. I have fifteen hydrangeas, so this task takes a little while but is immensely satisfying.

The winter aconites that I planted 'in-the-green' last spring were a no-show this year, which was disappointing, but I am not surprised. Aconites are notoriously difficult to get established which is why I ordered them 'in-the-green'. However, when they arrived, they had been sent out far too early; they had very small roots and the flowers were only just beginning to emerge, with no leaves at all. I am tempted to re-order some but from a different company and hope for better plants this time.

I planted *Rosa* 'Complicata' around 12 years ago. This is a very large shrub (this one was 12 feet across), which although it only flowers once a year has very beautiful single pink flowers about 5" across. I have enjoyed it for a few years but in recent years it has succumbed to black spot; for much of the summer it looks truly dreadful. If you can control the black spot, it would suit a wilder garden very well, but it is so large I have made the decision to remove it. It took a while to remove all the stems – I do resent being attacked by plants (it is very thorny) – but all I have left to do is remove the stump one day soon when I am feeling energetic.

My already ailing box balls (all 15 of them) are looking very sick after the winter. The day is looming when I will have to remove them, which, as some are over two feet in diameter, will totally change the look of the garden. I will miss them, so I am looking at alternatives and am considering using one of the Portuguese laurels - *Prunus lusitanica* 'Angustifolia'. It is such a lovely plant with its shiny dark green leaves and eye-catching red stems. Ready-trained topiary balls are prohibitively expensive but small untrained plants are reasonably priced, and as it is fast-growing I would soon achieve the effect I want. They would need trimming to shape twice a year but that would not be too onerous a task and I think they would be a very handsome addition to the garden.

Letter from America

One evening over dinner, back in July 2024, my husband Jonathan asked our 13-year-old son what he thought of us going to live in America for a few years. James answered him with immediate whooping and 'oh yeah' - followed by questions to me of "Will I be American?" and "Can I call you Mom?" (no and no). And so we were all set for new adventures.

We've been living in Boston, Massachusetts for nearly six months and we LOVE it. Then again, we love Herefordshire too.



Boston is beautiful. It's a very green city, trees and parks everywhere. Everything is tidy and well looked after. We live in Roslindale, a residential neighbourhood next to the Arnold Arboretum of Harvard University, a lovely 281-acre space, which is part of The Emerald Necklace, a seven mile, 1,1000-acre chain of parks and waterways and all walkable. The architecture is wonderful; in the city there are modern buildings right next to old buildings which somehow enhances the best of both. The residential houses are mostly clapboard in wonderful colour combinations (I particularly like the blue) all with steps up to big, wide front porches.

Our neighbours are very friendly, but I wouldn't say any more or less so than our British neighbours. Generally, everyone is very polite, and I'm often called 'Ma'am' by shopkeepers, policemen etc. Oh and they do like to run here, joggers everywhere and in all weathers. Not just in the arboretum but alongside the frozen Charles River in Downtown Boston, on ice and snow, when the air is so cold it's hard to breathe, sometimes in shorts, crazy! Talking of crazy – Boston drivers...

Okay, so I knew they drive on the wrong side of the road, but I thought that would be the only challenge. I learnt to drive in London, so I thought I'd easily get to grips with driving the streets of Boston, silly me. They speed, not just a bit, a good twice the limit. No one takes any immediate notice of a red light. You are allowed to turn right at a red light here, unless there is a sign saying otherwise but no one stops for any red light unless they really have to as four lanes of oncoming traffic roar towards you. They have roundabouts here, called rotaries but there's no lane discipline, no indicating and very little clue as to who gives way (yields) to whom. Yes, there are a lot of shiny big cars driving about with big dents in them. And should you take more than a nano-second to get into gear when a traffic light turns green, someone will beep their horn at you. But it isn't an aggressive beep, it's more an impatient 'the light is green, let me help you notice we can go now'. One road rule I've never seen broken is the one about not passing a school bus with its lights flashing and stop sign on. And those buses stop whenever and wherever they want (and they really are all yellow).

But what about the weather? A very British question but Bostonians also talk about the weather all the time, they are New Englanders after all. 2024 was a drought year, the driest in 100 years (I know, all the rain was in Herefordshire). Autumn was warm and sunny and winter extremely cold - and sunny. It has snowed about 10 times. The snow is light and fluffy (no good for building snowmen!) and shovelling snow from the sidewalk outside your house (a legal obligation) is a great way to meet the neighbours and keep warm. Every day the sky has been clear and blue. Temperatures have often been -14C to -16C but it's still so dry there is little or no frost to scrape off the windscreen in the mornings. No, we're not missing the grey skies of the UK.



Eating out – We haven't found a restaurant yet without LOTS of TV screens, all on loudly and showing different programmes, mostly sports. The food is delicious and the service is excellent though a bit different in that immediately you finish your plate it's whipped away. Huge portions of course, we've never yet made it through to pudding. It must be why everyone goes running.

Navigating my way round the supermarkets has been fascinating, there is all sorts of fresh produce I wouldn't know what to do with (aloe leaves?) and some totally unidentifiable without Google. There is so much processed food, which I leave on the shelf. And some things I just can't find, such as crème fraiche or full fat dairy yoghurt. Their sausages are not remotely related to the British banger, a lot are turkey or chicken and many contain cheese, in fact there is a lot of cheese in everything. The sandwiches are ENORMOUS. And the prices – a dozen large brown own-brand eggs are \$8.49/£6.58, a box of cereal \$6.49/£5.03, bottle of Head & Shoulders shampoo \$9.79 and these are the best prices I can find. The good news is the wine is good and comes in big 1.5L bottles for about \$7 and 1.75L Gordon's gin is \$22.99/£17.81.



I know the cost of living is exceptionally high here and living entirely on credit is the norm, I can *almost* understand why one would consider voting for a president promising to bring that down.

Living in Boston is definitely different from life in the UK but it's not really 'foreign'. I can't possibly say which is better, we still have spring and summer to experience and it's all so exciting still.
