Vicar's Letter

'It was the third of June, another sleepy dusty Delta day...'

'Ode to Billie Joe' by Bobbie Gentry is one of the few country songs I can sing from beginning to end in the shower. I love a song that tells a story, and this one does so hauntingly: a desperately sad story which leaves more questions unanswered than truths revealed. As a family sits around the dinner table chatting and gossiping, our narrator, the daughter in the family, slides unnoticed into a state of shock and grief at the nonchalantly delivered news that Billie Joe has died. For 58 years, people have mused and debated the lyrics' various allusions and dangling threads. Was it left deliberately ambiguous? I imagine so.

For a lot longer than that, people have mused and debated the meaning of almost every part of the Bible. Some people have staked their reputations, careers, even their lives, on the premise that their interpretation of a section, a sentence or a word is the right one. Such arguments have been used by many different groups to determine whether somebody is 'in' or 'out', saved or damned, loved or despised by God. So perhaps we should ask the same question: was the Bible left deliberately ambiguous?

The Christian Bible has been through many stages to get to the thing you read today. Initially passed on by the tradition of storytelling. It was then written down across centuries by many authors, then translated and compiled a few hundred years later by a bunch of chaps who argued passionately about what was deserving of inclusion. Eventually translated into almost every language in the world, in English alone there have been over 900 differing translations. Preachers, authors and theologians impart their interpretations. And then you read a passage and what it says to you might differ entirely from what it says to your neighbour. At every single stage, there has been nothing like universal agreement of what constitutes Biblical Truth.

I used to think I had to have all the answers, a lens through which everything I experienced could be viewed and made sense of, but nowadays I seek to live well within the ambiguity, reading with an open prayerful heart. Jesus speaks love: I despair when the Bible is used to diminish or exclude. If it isn't inspiring dynamic love, its meaning and credibility is lost. Ambiguous? Definitely. Full of rich wisdom and truth? Yup. Worth pondering? Absolutely!

April and May proved to be busy months for our parish. We had a packed church for our Easter Sunday communion as many local families returned for the festival. We were greeted by the joyful ringing of the bells led by Peter Hallewell and were glad to welcome people from other parishes who came to share this special occasion. Gillie and her flower team decorated the church beautifully as always, and she also generously provided Easter Eggs as well!

In preparation for the VE Day celebrations, written about above, Carole Day volunteered to repair the rather frayed British Legion Flag hanging in church.









She wrote:

As you can see from the pictures, the flag needed extensive work. It was covered with mildew (which is an allergy hazard) so it was carefully rinsed in a washing solution designed for silk and line dried. The original panels of the flag are made from silk which is a natural protein which has started to denature over time and break down, they will eventually disintegrate. The fringe, on the other hand, is quite robust and formed a good basis for the work:

- A few of the letters on the gold section were coming away from the base fabric and needed to be reattached with fabric glue
- Each panel was colour matched and recovered with taffeta lining fabric (the wording remains clearly readable through the gold section)
- The Union Jacks were reconstructed using taffeta lining fabric and red ribbons (only this part needed to be machine sewn)
- The bit that slides over the flagpole was also recovered
- The tassels were washed and the worn pieces of cord were trimmed off
- The exposed part of the flag pole was dull where the varnish had worn away, so it was lightly sanded down and given two coats of an oak coloured varnish
- All of the new panels have been hand stitched onto the original flag

This really was a fantastic piece of work. Do take a look next time you are in church and many thanks to Carole for using her skills and time for this.

On Sunday June 8th, in aid of the church, from 2.00pm we are looking forward to the Open Garden with vintage tractors and cars at Treago Castle. Jim Poyner is bringing his machines, and tractors and cars are coming from a variety of places. We are grateful to all those who have given prizes for the Grand Draw including local businesses. Tickets will be available on the day, at the shop and from members of the PCC. This is an excellent family event so don't miss it. All we need is a lovely sunny afternoon! Like the literary form of the TV series *The Detectorists*, *The Perfect Golden Circle* is a beautiful tale of male friendship, long summers in the English countryside and creating mysterious geometric corn circles that baffle the public as to their overnight appearance.

However, although this book takes us through the process of how one may go about making a crop circle it is predominantly a book about two friends, bound together in their quest to 'fuel the myth and strive for beauty'. They are both damaged souls, Calvert seeks solace in the countryside as he recovers from PTSD and Redbone lives day to day from his van and the crop circles bring purpose to their lives.

With the international media dominated by wars, geopolitics and natural disasters, we hear little of Zimbabwe, a beautiful country, richly endowed with natural resources and with the potential to be the bread-basket of Africa. The news that does reach us dwells on the political, economic and administrative chaos into which the country has descended over many years. The effects of this decline are felt most severely in the cities, especially in the capital, Harare.

Away from the urban areas, there is a different Zimbabwe, with vibrant and resourceful local communities remaining cheerful and positive despite the challenges posed by the political situation. Ecotourism plays an important part in maintaining this rural resilience, especially in and around the National Parks, which are managed by dedicated and highly skilled professionals, committed to sustaining the ecological abundance and diversity for which the country is well known.

The Parks Department appears to operate without significant government interference and the ZPGA (Zimbabwe Professional Guides Association) is an effective body whose guides and rangers operate to the highest standards, demanding broad, in-depth experience across all aspects of the rural ecosystem as well as knowledge of cultural traditions, music, dance and herbal medicine, the latter utilising an astonishing range of naturally occurring ingredients.

The animals of the National Parks have long suffered the effects of poaching. Despite international initiatives to ban the trade in ivory, rhino horn and other animal products, poaching has continued, using increasingly sophisticated and often cruel methods. The poachers are ruthless and will shoot to kill anyone who seeks to interfere with their operations. The response has been, until recently, uncompromising, with the Parks Department supported by heavily armed police and army units. Any poachers captured alive faced long-term imprisonment. However, a recent move to a more subtle strategy has proved successful: Under interrogation after capture, many poachers cited lack of employment opportunities as their reason for entering the illegal trade. So, instead of putting poachers in prison, they

were offered employment by the Parks Department on condition that they provided credible intelligence on the poaching gangs and their methods.

One such captive poacher turned informer revealed that, having killed an elephant and removed its tusks, the front feet of the animal would be cut-off, then dried and fashioned into "shoes", in which the poachers would then go about their business leaving elephant, rather than human, footprints, thus fooling the expert trackers of the anti-poaching units. Although they were indeed leaving authentic elephant footprints, these were front foot only impressions, spaced according to the gait of a poacher, not an elephant. Hence, once alerted to this deception, the anti-poaching units were able to track and apprehend the criminals.

As a result of this intelligence-led approach, poaching is much reduced, to the extent that it is more or less under control. There are 55,000 elephants in the Hwange National Park.

Book Review

Brazzaville Beach by William Boyd

This book is about wars: the civil war in the African country where British primatologist Dr Hope Clearwater is working on a chimpanzee project; the war that rages between academic scientists to be the first to publish new information; and the battleground that was Hope's marriage.

Hope has arrived in Africa following the break-up of this marriage to mathematician John, who suffers a manic-depressive episode that destroys their union. Dealing ever in abstractions by profession, his slide from sanity to insanity is imperceptible but relentless.

Hope is researching the activities of a group of chimpanzees, and we are rather unsubtly invited to draw parallels with human behaviour – the backdrop of the civil war points up the sudden change in the studied group of chimps, as they randomly divide themselves into two factions (for no apparent reason) and begin perpetrating cruelties each upon the other. Hint: like the African tribes engaged in the civil war. Got it?

In the African chimp project, academic jealousies result in acts of chicanery and pure savagery. What matters most to some scientists: truth or academic kudos? Truth is the casualty during the course of this narrative.

Boyd makes occasional attempts to be philosophical, but none of those attempts have any profundity: "What can I know? Nothing for sure. What ought I to do? Try not to hurt anyone. What may I hope for? For the best (but it won't make any difference)." Well, thank you for that insight.

The crude parallels between human and chimp behaviour are thrust in the reader's face, whilst seeking no explanations or analysis. And the author's attempt to write in the voice of a woman is not a success, as male preoccupations filter in apace. This failure runs like a fault-line throughout the entire book.

William Boyd is an author of renown, but this novel left me cold.

Garden Notes

Is it my imagination or has everything been flowering particularly well this spring? The primroses in the garden have been wonderful and now, the hawthorn trees on the common are completely smothered in blossom. In our own front garden our red hawthorn, *Crataegus laevigata* 'Paul's Scarlet' is looking so good that our neighbour requested cuttings. The rest of the garden is very colourful too with Mexican orange blossom, three different brooms, viburnum, and deutzia all in bloom. The pear blossom was good this year so I should get a good crop of pears to make up for the single solitary fruit that I harvested last year.

We escaped to the New Forest at the beginning of April so I delayed sowing any seeds until we returned – and then went a little crazy sowing every packet in my seed tin, even ones left over from previous years just to see if anything would germinate. Admittedly some were ancient so it will be a miracle if any of those show any signs of life. The large greenhouse is now full to bursting with seed trays, tiny pots of seedlings, tomato and pepper plants, colourful pelargoniums and begonias. We ordered black-eyed Susan plug plants to grow on the trellis at the front of the house, and we are looking forward to those arriving; they are somewhere in the postal system.

For fun we also ordered a bonus pack of plug plants without knowing what we would actually receive. For only £6.99 we received 36 teeny-tiny plug plants of verbena, cineraria, gazania, nicotiana and two varieties of petunia; potted up they are making impressively rapid growth. We will have enough plants for several large pots and for an old tin bath tub; £6.99 well-spent. This year the fence around the hen run is sporting four large half-baskets which, along with two old chimney pots either side the gate, will be planted with busy lizzies which we also bought as tiny plug plants.



Whilst enjoying our week in the New Forest, we visited Exbury Gardens which we enjoyed immensely. We were a week or two early for the main show of rhododendrons and azaleas, but there were some early flowering ones, camellias and magnolias. I fell in love with some trees planted in an arc around their plant sales area. These were *Pyrus calleryana* 'Chanticleer', which looked spectacular smothered in beautiful white pear blossom. All the trees were an identical conical shape. I spotted another dozen in a row outside a Hillier Garden centre which were looking equally stunning. Some people say they have an unpleasant fishy smell, but we didn't notice that at all. If we were lucky enough to own a house with a long drive, I would be tempted to grow an avenue of them.

I have started removing our very poorly box balls and carting them off to the tip. I have had them 19 years, growing them from pots of cuttings bought from Lidl and B&Q and I even moved house with them. I thought I would be distraught to see them go but this garden is so densely planted I can hardly tell where they were. Strangely, I almost feel glad to be rid of them – no more feeding and worrying about them and no more backbreaking pruning. What a relief!


