Vicar's Letter

It's hard to believe I've been here with you now for a whole year. And what a year! Highs and lows, joys and challenges, a steep learning curve, a fair bit of getting lost, and a whole lot of very lovely people. I am humbled and slightly abashed when I think about the warmth of welcome I have received.

'I am still learning' (Michaelangelo)

I have a huge amount of learning yet to do. There's the learning I love to do just for the sake of it, the kind that is sparked by my own curiosity, such as the nature all around us, freestyle hand embroidery, stationary engines, 20th century architecture, Celtic Christianity, and Ignatian spirituality. There's the learning I hope to do about life and God and all the big stuff. And then there's the learning I need to continue so that I can grow to be better as your vicar.

We learn because we need to know how to do stuff, and knowledge is a wonderful thing. But really, I aspire to wisdom - and that is an altogether more exquisite and intangible thing, usually years in the making. It requires some knowledge I'm sure, but being brainy is never going to get you there. Experience is a big part of it, and not being afraid of your mistakes and failures, but even with learning, experience and courage to fail, you haven't necessarily got all the ingredients for wisdom. Taking the time to reflect honestly on your learning and experiences probably gets you much nearer to wisdom, and I think into that mix you need to add empathy, compassion, and open-mindedness.

A large-scale global study found that, although wisdom may appear to be shaped by cultural differences, the core aspects of what makes someone wise are largely the same across cultures. According to the study, real wisdom is about finding a balance between reflective and considered reasoning and understanding, and caring about the thoughts and feelings of others, considering different perspectives.

Yikes, I think I have some way to go! I'm grateful to know some rather wise people in our midst, wise in different ways. My prayers for all of us this month are that we can treasure wisdom where we find it, and all continue to grow towards wisdom together, because I don't think it's ever a solo endeavour.

THE BRAIDING OF PRAYERS



Gentle Giant visits Orcop to Pull Down a Big Ash Tree



"Moonraker" left the "Marshall of Gainsborough" factory on 1st July 1925, and was supplied new to Huyton and Roby District Council. It is the sole surviving 4NHP (Nominal Horse Power) "S-type" convertible tractor, which means it can be used as either a haulage tractor, or a road roller. After being sold a few times, it ended up working for a contractor called Herbert Gurnhill. He took the engine into the preservation era, and to the early steam rallies. By the early 80's it required some repairs, and was laid up until 2005, when bought in bits by Neil Mackinlay, who steamed it for the first time in 2009. Arial West, the current owner, purchased the engine in 2014. Since then, it has been used extensively, covering thousands of road miles and driving various machinery. In 2022, he carried out some remedial work, a few new gears, and the construction of a winch drum to Marshall drawings, (having not been selected as an optional extra

when new) which has been a well-used addition. Whilst Moonraker is just about to celebrate its 100th birthday, it is rarely found on the rally field, but often busy still doing a day's work, as it was on 25th May, when it was to be found alongside the lower road of Garway Hill.

Arial, appropriately attired in a smart shirt and tie, black waistcoat and black bowler hat, and his splendid machine, had been called in to pull down a large ash tree, which was shedding branches and had become dangerous. The tree was located in an inaccessible position at the foot of a steep bank. Having been pulled down, the tree was cut into large logs, which were dragged up the slope by Moonraker's very powerful winch. This was a great spectacle, and Betty Lovering and her daughter Charmaine were kind enough to invite their neighbours to come and watch. It was a wonderful social gathering, and Arial patiently answered a steady stream of questions about the proceedings.

Traction engines run on high-quality steam coal, of which the best in the world was mined in Wales. Arial has a good stock of this fine Welsh coal, but now that the last mine has closed, most of the coal needed for historic steam engines and railway locomotives is imported from Russia. This Russian coal is filthy stuff and produces much foul black smoke, whereas Moonraker, running on the premium Welsh variety, produces barely any. One has to question the wisdom of the Welsh government in closing the last steam coal mines. If a small mine were kept open, not only would it provide employment for Welsh miners, but also it would avoid the environmental impacts of transporting the stuff from Russia, to say nothing of the atmospheric pollution arising from its combustion!

Over the two weeks following her visit to Orcop, Moonraker was driven to the Abergavenny Steam Festival and then the Gwatkins Cider Festival before going home for a well-earned rest.

A big thank you to Kaya and Callum, who orchestrated the whole operation, and whose hospitality was second to none. Thanks go equally to Arial, Betty, Charmaine and the chain-saw team for inviting us to enjoy this rare opportunity to see a gentle giant in action, doing the kind of thing it was designed for 100 years ago.

A SWIFT UPDATE

Some readers may recall my article published in August last year about our attempts to attract swifts back to Whitehouse Farm.

This year, we set up the sound system playing the swifts' screams in May, and sure enough, we had up to six of these wonderful birds performing their aerobatics a few days later. They inspected closely the nesting box, which is attached to our bedroom window frame, and occasionally alighted on it. We are unsure as to whether they actually entered, but we understand it can take three years for the young birds to find and occupy a nesting site, which they then use for up to fifteen years.

The call system is amazingly effective and last week one bird found its way into the bedroom via the narrow opening through which the speaker cable passes.

It was very interesting to inspect this swift at close quarters, because we normally only see them from a distance when they are (as always) in flight.

The first point to note was the size. These are large birds with a wingspan of about 450mm. The second is that their tiny feet are totally useless on a gloss painted window cill, so the poor creature was flapping about and going nowhere. Once the window was opened wide, the swift was ushered out, emitting a glorious "thank you scream" as it departed, apparently unharmed.

Talking of the swift's scream, there is a wonderful description in my favourite bird-book "British Birds in Their Haunts" by the Revd. C. A. Johns, originally published in 1861 (my copy is of the 25th edition). It goes like this:

An early riser, and late in retiring to roost, the swift is always on the wing. Thus, whether hunting on his own account or on behalf of his mate and nestlings, his employment is unvaried, and the same amount of time is always at his disposal for exercising his vocal powers. These are not great; he has no roundelay; he neither warbles nor carols; he does not even twitter. His whole melody is a scream, unmusical but most joyous: a squeak would be a better name, but that, instead of conveying a notion that it results from pain, it is full of rollicking delight. Some compare it to the noise made by the sharpening of a saw: to me it seems such an expression of pent-up joy as little children would make if unexpectedly released from school, furnished with wings and flung up into the air for a game of hide-and-seek among the clouds. Such soarings aloft, such chasing round the pinnacles of the church-tower and the gables of farmhouses, no wonder that they cannot contain themselves for joy. Every day brings its picnic or village feast, with no weariness or depression on the morrow.

I think we have a lot to learn from the swifts.

Book Review

My Name is Why, by Lemn Sissay

I first read this book in paperback before subsequently finding an audiobook version read by the author himself and it was a revelation. Sissay, much loved British Ethiopian poet, read his autobiographical novel with such an understated passion that it brought me near to tears.

His description of a childhood in care without love, without physical touch and without continuity or security is painful to read. Children in care grow up without a sense of belonging, of personal worth, of being important to someone. He is under constant judgement, the subject of case conferences, and the central character in a raft of reports by, "The Authority", none of whom truly know his heart. He was not even allowed the dignity of his own name and spent his childhood known as Norman — his true given

name, when he discovered and adopted it, is Lemn, which means *Why* in the Ethiopian language Amharic – hence the title of his book.

His history is one of rejection: firstly by his mother, then by the long-term foster parents whom he truly thought cared for him, and finally by the various children's homes he moved around between, the last being little more than a junior prison.

There he encounters constant minor and major acts of cruelty from the damaged children around him. As he succinctly says: "Hurt people hurt people."

His colour was a bizarre double-edged sword. Frank racism came his way of course, but also his foster parents soaked up the kudos of taking in a black baby, and to some he was jealously seen as receiving special favours because of his colour, of being special in his social context. At his first Home he was dubbed Chalky White and to begin with felt important and part of the gang because he had a nickname – but he soon came to see how inappropriate it was.

I believe every word of his descriptions of the abuse perpetrated on the children in these homes. Even to this day I am plagued by the awful memories of my experiences working in a children's home during the summer before I went to university. As a mere 17-year-old I was not believed by the powers that be when I fed back what was going on. The sheer impotence of my situation mirrors that of children in care — they have no power. And no-one really cares.

"Memories in care are slippery because there's no one to recall them with as the years pass. In a few months, I would be in a different home with a different set of people who had no idea of this moment. How could it matter, if no one recalls it? This is how to quietly deplete the sense of self-worth deep inside a child's psyche. This is how a child becomes hidden in plain sight."

On leaving care and championed by a tenacious social worker, Sissay was allocated a flat – a space to call his own.

"Somebody left a gift for me outside the flat. I don't know who. It was a thing of beauty to me: a black Olivetti typewriter with a waterfall of ebony finger pads, each ingrained with one mother-of-pearl letter."

Garden Notes

Back in December, I wrote about how fascinated I was by Ginkgo trees. Well, I finally have one of my very own — a very small one but I am thrilled all the same. I spotted *Ginkgo biloba* 'Mariken' at the garden centre and just had to have it. This is a small variety and had already been trained as a standard so was ideal to plant in a large pot. Ginkgo are slow growing so I don't think it will be too arduous a task to keep it in shape. We have had rain in the last few days, and I noticed that the rain forms droplets on the leaves in the same way that it does on the leaves of *Alchemilla mollis* (Lady's Mantle) — just beautiful. If you've ever wondered why that is, it is because they both have

superhydrophobic (water-repellent) surfaces. With Alchemilla it is because the leaves are covered in dense, soft hairs which cause the water to form beads rather than spread out in a thin film. The shape and form of the leaf also helps to collect water on the surface. With Ginkgo, it is a due to a combination of the microscopic structure of the leaf and the waxy cuticle on the surface. The waxy layer has microscopic bumps which disrupt the contact between the water and the leaf causing the water to form beads. The waxy layer protects the leaf and the droplets of water rolling across the surface have a self-cleaning effect removing dust. Isn't that fascinating? You'll see the same beading due to a waxy cuticle on brassicas, hostas and nasturtium.

Do you know why Alchemilla has that name? It means 'little alchemist' and apparently alchemists believed that the droplets of water on the leaves were the purest form of water, and they used them in their attempts to transmute base metals into gold.

Standard trees seem to be the theme of my gardening this month. We have two standard bay trees planted either side of a path. They are now 25 years old (they have moved house twice) and, despite annual trimming, had grown so large that we kept walking into them. As late spring is the ideal time of year to hard prune mature bay, my husband gave them a scarily drastic haircut reducing their diameter by half, right back to the bare bones. We were left with two hedgehogs on sticks, but I am pleased to note that young leaves are emerging in abundance.

I was also tempted to buy a pair of standard holly trees (*Ilex x meserveae* 'Blue Maid'), which now stand proudly on either side of the front door in large pots – such a cliché I know, but I am pleased with them. My husband is pleased with them too – 'Oh good, I can put fairy lights on them at Christmas'. For the summer I have planted burnt orange and purple flowers at their base – beautiful dark-eyed bronze-orange *Osteospermum* 'Dalina Compact Orange Brique', the unusual *Bidens* 'Fiery Red' with large deep orange flowers, dainty little double flowered *Calibrachoa* (trailing million bells petunias) in apricot with a red eye, deep purple petunias and royal blue lobelia – rich colours that look great with the dark bluish-green leaves of the hollies.




