Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

November can feel like a rather reflective month, can't it? The clocks have gone back, the evenings draw in, and the kettle seems to whistle a little more often than usual. Out in the fields, the work slows: hedges are trimmed, muck heaps steam gently in the cold, and our Herefordshire hills take on their winter browns and greys.

It's also the church calendar's *season of remembering*. We begin with All Saints' Day, giving thanks for the great crowd of witnesses who've gone before us — the heroes of faith who have, as one wag put it, "made it into God's Hall of Fame." 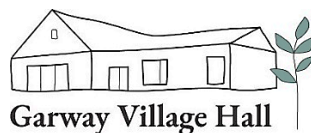

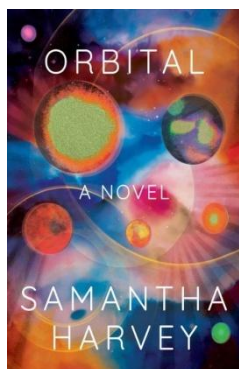

If you love gentle folk-rock, the Pembrokeshire coast and films which make you both laugh and pack a wistful punch, then you will most certainly enjoy *The Ballad of Wallis Island* starring Carey Mulligan, Tim Key and Tom Basden.

It's the story of a lonely, garrulous oddball, Charles Heath, who is also the biggest superfan of one-time folk-rock duo McGwyer and Mortimer. Having won a shed-load of money in the lottery, Charles wants to splurge it on tempting the duo back together to play one last gig on the remote Welsh island on which he lives. He has other motives though; he has naïve hopes of bringing the pair back together romantically following what was a very messy break-up.

When Nell, the female singer, turns up with her American husband, it becomes obvious that the path to past love is not one that everyone wants to tread. One critic described this lovely film as "relentlessly funny" but it has a gentle melancholy aspect too, especially with regard to Charles's own aloneness and his charming, tentative romance with a very awkward island shop-keeper.

Tom Basden is excellent as the singer songwriter who split up the successful group hoping for a solo career. Now washed up, he too is full of regrets, not only for a past love but a lost career. And, by the way, the final scene is one of the best in any film – ever.

Come and join us for laughs, lovely music and community. As ever, we'll have lots of home-bakes and liquid refreshments to choose from before the film and in the interval.

Alice and Max Oliver - Goulding were married at St. Catherine's on Thursday 9th October. We wish them well for their future life together.

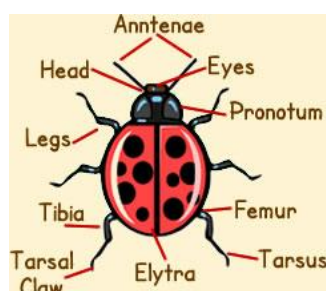

A Loveliness of Ladybirds



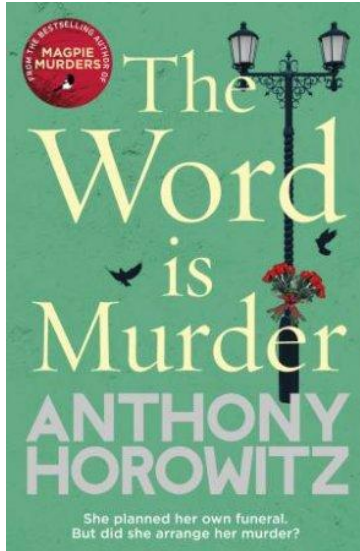

Book Review

The Word is Murder by Anthony Horowitz

Comfortably-off widow Diana Cowper walks into a funeral parlour and plans her own funeral, *“and she was going to need it. She was murdered about six hours later that same day.”*

Horowitz, well known author of murder mysteries, books for children, screen plays, updates on James Bond and Foyle’s War, here features as himself in his own novel – all the details of his history are real and his role here is as writer, chronicling a murder investigation.

Holmes and Watson Spring to mind as Horowitz partners the irascible but brilliant disgraced ex-detective Daniel Hawthorne. And further literary and artistic references abound: Diana Cowper’s son is famous actor Damian Cowper and his RADA experiences and fellow students feature; and Shakespeare quotes are central to the plot.

Hawthorne is an enigmatic ruthless character *“with that strange energy of his, that mix of malice and single-mindedness that made him so hard to read.”* Try as he might, Horowitz cannot pin him down and comes close to abandoning the book project, exasperated by his “colleague.”

Before the book is done there is a further murder. Both seem irrational and inexplicable. There are red herrings everywhere: might the murderer have been one of the parents of the two boys Diana ran over 10 years previously; or maybe the judge who handed down a lenient sentence to her; or a cover up of a gay relationship? – the plot twists and turns and takes us down many blind alleys.

But there is also sensitivity: *“Diana Cowper had enough equipment to cook a Michelin-starred meal for ten but probably went to bed with a boiled egg and two pieces of toast.”*

And his penchant for the English seaside is charming: *“I’ve always had a fondness for seaside towns, particularly out of season when the streets are empty and the sky is grey and drizzling. The whole language of the British seaside has stayed with me. I love the sand dunes, the slot machines, the piers, the seagulls, the peppermint rock with the name printed, impossibly, all the way through. I have a hankering for the cafés and the tea shops, old ladies pouring muddy tea out of pots, slabs of millionaire shortbread, shops that sell fishing nets, windbreaks and novelty hats. I suppose it’s the age I am. These days, everyone leaps on a plane when they want a cheap holiday. But that’s also part of the charm of all those little towns along the coast, the fact that they’ve been left behind.”*

Horowitz has crafted a slick story here and managed the quirky inclusion of himself with great skill. Definitely worth a read.

Garden Notes

Well, the crevice garden I talked about last month has been completed and I am very pleased with the result. I discovered a great company called *Sempervivums by Post* and purchased a selection of 10 different plants chosen by owner Becky, who kept me informed throughout the selection and delivery process. The plants are superb, and I am thrilled with them. They were delivered bareroot and were good-sized plants that I could easily divide. It was a fun project to do, and I am now contemplating creating a second one in another oval bathtub, which we bought originally to bathe the dogs.



We have finally eaten the last of the home-grown tomatoes. I particularly enjoyed growing them this year as I had been sent a free packet of tomato seeds with a seed order from *Plant World Seeds*. These were a random mix of varieties, so it was interesting to discover what they were. There must have been around 8 varieties: red ones, pink ones, funny long yellow ones, teardrop-shaped green and red striped, and small green and yellow striped. They weren't named, so if I want to grow any of them next year, I need to go through the catalogue trying to match the descriptions to the ones we particularly enjoyed eating. My own favourite was a small tomato with green and yellow stripes; initially I didn't realise that they were ripe. They turned out to be the sweetest, most flavoursome tomatoes I have ever eaten. I am wondering if these were



Green Zebra, although they were quite small – perhaps Mini Green Zebra. I wasn't at all keen on the yellow ones which may have been Banana Legs – far too fleshy for me, although my husband enjoyed them.

The hen run has looked very colourful this summer decorated with half-baskets and old chimneys pots filled with white, pink and salmon busy lizzies. They are my husband's pride and joy; I am always amazed by how much growth a tiny plug plant can put on in just one season. The chimney pots contain only two plants and each basket just three. Extraordinary! Of course, liberal
